- Awarded 328 Scholarships for \$915,000
- Awarded \$350,000 in Nonprofit Appreciation Grants to help local nonprofits recover from the pandemic
- Awarded \$2.6M in grants to schools and nonprofits
- Provided professional development trainings to our nonprofit community
- Created Fund Matching Program for new and current donors that raised \$650,000 in 3 months




Asset Growth Through The Years



Fund Matching Program

The Matching Program was created to benefit new and existing Scholarship Funds, Designated Funds, Agency Endowment Funds and Donor Advised Funds opened and/or held at the Grays Harbor Community Foundation. GHCF matched 20% of all gifts we received from mid October through the end of December last year.

Thanks to our amazing donors, our end of year Matching Program was a huge success. We were able to generate \$650,000 to new and existing funds in three months. We created 10 new funds from October through December that are all centered around investing in our community and students.

Donor Spotlight

The Gleeson Family Scholarship: Honoring a Family's Commitment to Community Service

Dr. Louise Baxter remembers her great grandparents, The Gleesons, as strong community leaders who valued volunteerism and community.

The Gleesons immigrated from Ireland in the late 1800's and settled out the Wynoochee. They raised four children, Michael "Andy", Margaret, Rose and Mary Gleeson all of whom resided in Montesano as nonagenarians and centenarians.

Andy was a WW1 Army "Doughboy", Rose, a nurse, Margaret, a Red Cross volunteer who made bandages during the war and served as a US Army Airforce observer, staffing lookout towers along the coast as first line against enemy aircraft and Mary, who during WW2 was a local "Rosie the Riveter" volunteer at the Boeing plant in Aberdeen that made gun turrets for the B-17.

Dr. Baxter, a former Montesano graduate herself, created this scholarship opportunity with the hope of creating an opportunity for a Montesano graduate who embodies the exact values her family upheld in our community for so long.

It is an honor for the Foundation to tell the stories of our past as we build for our future. Thank you, Dr. Baxter for entrusting us with honoring the wonderful legacy of your loved ones through enriching the lives of local students through The Gleeson Family Scholarship.

Julie Daniels Art Memorial Scholarship: Celebrating a Lifetime Learner and a Lover of the Arts

Julie Daniels was born in 1927 and raised in Aberdeen. She had a lifelong passion for art and began studying it at an early age. There are still sketches and pastels from her early teens that her family has held on to. She took lessons at Grays Harbor College in 1945 and continued to attend classes, workshops and had memberships in numerous galleries, art leagues and shows including the annual Art Gala at Grays Harbor College Library into her 90's.

Mike Daniels, son of Julie, spoke of his mom in a way that one couldn't help but admire her too as he recounted memories of her life and the impact she had on so many. *"In the 60's she worked with a group of community leaders who built a fence in downtown Montesano between where the Bank of The Pacific and the flower shop are currently. She had high school students paint murals and showcase their art for the entire community to see. She was so excited to see the students' talents showcased in such a public way."*

Julie will now continue to encourage others, even after her passing, with a scholarship fund at the Grays Harbor Community Foundation for local students pursuing an Art Degree. Her belief that 'anybody can do it' will now continue to inspire generations of local artists that have the same passion and love of art that Julie had throughout her life.





Oakville School District

GHCF awarded a grant to Oakville School District to enhance their welding and woodshop equipment for their CTE programs.

School districts in Grays Harbor are eligible to apply for grants throughout the year. In 2021, the Foundation provided grants that range from playground equipment to early childhood education assistance as well as technology upgrades and after school funding to all districts in Grays Harbor.



Grays Harbor Youth Works

Grays Harbor Youth Works recently received a grant from the Foundation for local students to gain career exposure in natural resources with Rayonier Timber Company. Executive Director, Cheryl Brown told us of the excursions:

"At each excursion, diverse and inclusive career paths provided students with hands on opportunity to learn what those jobs entailed. The students have been exposed to the following: Planting Tree Seedlings, Timber Cruising, Engineering and Regulation/Unit Layout and Road Design.

Students saw how fish water streams were reconstructed around the forest road, regulations, permits, what inspections required, etc.

Various careers were discussed for each job duty needed to accomplish those tasks. From on-the-job training, trade school, certifications, and 2-to-4-year college education."



Sharon Grange

For several years, the Sharon Grange in Porter Washington has been a mainstay for generations of families. Unfortunately, over the years, the building began to deteriorate to the point where it was in need of some significant repairs. A group of dedicated volunteers, led by Cindy Miles Heller, began to look for ways to restore the building and bring back members as well as recruit new ones.

With the support of the Grays Harbor Community Foundation and several local individuals and groups, the Sharon Grange is once again, bringing their community together through volunteerism and fun community oriented activities. In 2021, the Foundation awarded Sharon Grange a \$25,000 grant to do kitchen and window repairs.

Honoring a Hometown Hero: Major General Eldon Bargewell Memorial Statue



One of our roles at the Foundation is being a community connector. When community members approached us about creating a fund to erect a statue to honor local hometown hero, Eldon Bargewell, we were honored.

Eldon Bargewell was born in Hoquiam and graduated from Hoquiam High School in 1965. Bargewell enlisted in the military in 1967 and served in Vietnam, where he earned the Distinguished Service Cross for extraordinary heroism.

Bargewell received his officer's commission in 1973 and went on to serve as unit commander for Delta Force, where he participated in the invasion of Panama and later in Iraq during Operation Desert Storm. He went on to lead U.S. Special Operations Command, serving as Director of Strategic Operations at Multinational Force Iraq and Commanding General of Special Operations Command Europe.

His decorations include: The Distinguished Service Cross- our nation's second highest award for valor; six Bronze Stars 3 with combat "V" for valor under fire; four Purple Hearts; the Army Commendation Medal with combat "V" and a Presidential Unit Citation.

At the time of his retirement Eldon was the most decorated active-duty soldier. Eldon passed away in 2019 in a lawnmower accident.

The community and friends across the country have raised over \$200,000 to memorialize Major General Bargewell.


One Last Note: Community Rallies Together to Surprise Retiring Hoquiam Band Teacher with Fund in His Honor

The Roger White Hoquiam Band Fund was created by former students to help future Hoquiam band members with costs such as shoes, registration fees, instrument costs and so much more. The fund saw hundreds of friends, family and former students contribute as a way to honor a man that made such an influence on their lives during his time at Hoquiam High School.

Skyler Taylor, Robert B. Hood Memorial Scholarship

Skyler Taylor is a 2021 Aberdeen High School graduate. She is a student athlete who plans to attend Montana State University- Billings in the fall to study Exercise Science and Communications. She has also signed on to participate in their cross country and track and field program.

Skyler has been a leader on and off the field, with 9 varsity letters and a resume full of volunteerism, accolades and hard work and dedication.

Skyler said, “My educational goals are a result of my upbringing, and how important it is to give back to my community. The overall goal I have is to push through college and finish all four years. Finishing college, and having a diploma will afford me job opportunities. I plan to major in Exercise Science, and minor in Communications. I chose Exercise Science as my major because I feel exercise is essential to living a healthy and productive life. I have had so many people in my community that have impacted my drive and goals in life. I hope to have the same impact on others in my community. I plan to return to the beautiful Grays Harbor and work with athletes because athletics is something I have always loved.”

Robert Hood was also passionate about health and wellness and would be proud to have Skyler receive this award in his name.



Shelby Dilley, Dr. Scott A. Weatherwax Memorial University of Puget Sound Scholarship

The Dr. Scott A. Weatherwax Memorial University of Puget Sound Scholarship was established in 2014 for students pursuing studies at the University of Puget Sound (UPS) with a preference for those studying science. The scholarship is an annual award of \$20,000 per year and is renewable for an additional three years.

Our 2021 recipient is 2021 Montesano High School graduate, Shelby Dilley. She will be attending UPS in the fall to study Physical Therapy. The current Montesano High School Class President and 4.0 student, Shelby holds several academic accolades and awards throughout her high school career. In her essay she stated: “As I graduate high school this school year, I will move on to attend the University of Puget Sound. Through the university, I will get a degree in physical therapy. High school has prepared me for college and career in many ways. A solid education, years of career exploration, and work experience have all been important to me. However, I took more away from high school’s leadership opportunities, developing a good work ethic, and self-exploration. In the same way that high school is more than classroom education, I believe that physical therapy is more than healing wounds. Physical therapists help patients in both body and mind.”

Scott always believed that it was the responsibility of a community to cultivate the leaders of the future. He understood that a well-educated individual needs exposure to the arts and sports, and that leadership can start young. He believed that hard work should be rewarded. We believe Shelby would make him proud!
