2022 RECAP

GRAYS HARBOR IS SPECIAL BECAUSE OF THE PEOPLE THAT ARE DEDICATED TO ITS SUCCESS ON A DAILY BASIS, OUR DONORS WHO GIVE TO OUR COMMUNITY BECAUSE SO MUCH OF WHO THEY ARE WAS SHAPED BY THIS COMMUNITY. THOSE OF US THAT GREW UP HERE, MADE OUR HOMES HERE. RAISED OUR CHILDREN HERE AND CONTINUE TO GIVE BACK TO OUR COMMUNITY THROUGH OUR WORK, VOLUNTEERISM AND DEDICATION TOWARDS THE CONTINUED BETTERMENT OF GRAYS HARBOR.

IN PARTNERSHIP WITH OUR DONORS IN 2022, THE GRAYS HARBOR COMMUNITY FOUNDATION AWARDED OVER \$2.8M INTO GRAYS HARBOR THROUGH OUR SCHOLARSHIP AND GRANTS PROGRAMS. WE ESTABLISHED 13 NEW FUNDS TO BENEFIT GRAYS HARBOR, PARTNERED WITH SEVERAL COMMUNITY-BASED PROJECTS INCLUDING THE ELDON BARGEWELL MEMORIAL STATUE, WESTPORT SKATEPARK AND PUMPTRACK AND OLYMPIC STADIUM RESTORATION PROJECT. WE CREATED NUMEROUS ESTATE PLANS WITH DONORS WHO ARE PLANNING TO LEAVE A LEGACY TO GRAYS HARBOR AFTER THEIR PASSING.

WE SUPPORTED EVERY SCHOOL DISTRICT IN GRAYS HARBOR THROUGH PROVIDING FIELD TRIPS, IMPLEMENTING NEW PRESCHOOL PROGRAMS, PROVIDING GRANTS FOR THINGS LIKE NEW PLAYGROUNDS, TECHNOLOGY AND STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES. OVER 330 STUDENTS WERE AWARDED OVER \$1M IN SCHOLARSHIPS TO PURSUE STUDIES AT OVER 60 COLLEGES AND VOCATIONAL PROGRAMS THROUGHOUT THE UNITED STATES.


OUR NONPROFIT PARTNERS WERE GRANTED OVER \$1.5M FOR PROJECTS AND PROGRAMS TO SERVE GRAYS HARBOR RESIDENTS. SO FAR THIS YEAR, \$3.5M HAS BEEN DONATED TO THE FOUNDATION TO INVEST BACK INTO OUR COMMUNITY.



EARLY LEARNING

THE GRAYS HARBOR COMMUNITY FOUNDATION IS COMMITTED TO GROWING EARLY LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES IN GRAYS HARBOR, SO WHEN THE YMCA OF GRAYS HARBOR CONTACTED US ABOUT EXPANDING SLOTS FOR PRESCHOOL AND DAYCARE ON THE HARBOR WE WERE HAPPY TO PARTNER TOGETHER TO MAKE IT A REALITY.

THE LEARNING CENTER, WHICH USED TO BE CROWN DRUG BEFORE THE YMCA PURCHASED THE BUILDING IN 2020, RECEIVED A TOTAL OF MORE THAN \$2.05 MILLION IN SECURED FUNDING TO RENOVATE AND PROVIDE SUPPLIES WITH THE HELP OF MULTIPLE GRANTS AND PRIVATE DONORS. THE FOUNDATION AWARDED OVER \$200,000 IN FUNDING.

JESSICA HOOVER, SENIOR PROGRAM OFFICER FOR GRAYS HARBOR COMMUNITY FOUNDATION, SAID SUCCESSFUL PILOT PROGRAMS FOR NEW OFF-SITE PRESCHOOLS IN PACIFIC BEACH SCHOOL DISTRICT AND OAKVILLE SCHOOL DISTRICT LED TO DISCUSSIONS TO HAVE THE LEARNING CENTER FOR KIDS IN THE INNER HARBOR REGION.

“THE COMMUNITY FOUNDATION IS REALLY COMMITTED TO EARLY LEARNING AND ESSENTIALLY, WE WANT TO CREATE MORE OPPORTUNITIES FOR EVERY KID IN GRAYS HARBOR TO HAVE ACCESS TO PRESCHOOL AND EARLY LEARNING,” HOOVER SAID. “THE YMCA HAS SUCH A GOOD FOUNDATION FOR BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE, SO IT WAS A NATURAL FIT.”

THE FACILITY IS LICENSED FOR CHILD CARE FROM 7 A.M. TO 6 P.M. MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY — MEANING FAMILIES LOOKING FOR BEFORE-SCHOOL CARE, PRESCHOOL DURING THE DAY, AND AFTER-SCHOOL CARE WILL HAVE THE YMCA AS AN OPTION.

**LEAVING A LASTING LEGACY: PATRICIA CLEMONS,
A LIFELONG MONTESANO RESIDENT LEAVES \$1.2M
ESTATE GIFT TO GRAYS HARBOR COMMUNITY
FOUNDATION**



A TRUE COMMUNITY CHAMPION AND SOMEONE WHO UNDERSTOOD THE VALUE OF NOT ONLY GIVING YOUR MONEY, BUT ALSO YOUR TIME, PATRICIA CLEMONS WILL FOREVER BE REMEMBERED IN OUR COMMUNITY THROUGH HER GENEROUS LEGACY GIFT TO SUPPORT SEVERAL LOCAL NONPROFITS AND MONTESANO GRADUATES THROUGH THE FOUNDATION'S SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM.

PATRICIA WAS A 1944 GRADUATE OF MONTESANO HIGH SCHOOL. SHE ATTENDED GRAYS HARBOR COLLEGE AND THEN CENTRAL WASHINGTON UNIVERSITY WHERE SHE GRADUATED WITH HER BA IN EDUCATION IN 1949. AT THE U OF HAWAII IN 1957 SHE EARNED A MA IN EDUCATION, THEN IN 1974 AN MA IN LIBRARY STUDIES. SHE SPENT HER 30-YEAR EDUCATION CAREER WITH THE MONTESANO SCHOOL DISTRICT, 20 YEARS AS A SEVENTH-GRADE TEACHER AND TEN YEARS AS AN ELEMENTARY LIBRARIAN.

AFTER HER RETIREMENT IN 1979 SHE STARTED HER SECOND CAREER IN HISTORICAL PRESERVATION, FOLLOWING IN HER FATHER'S FOOTSTEPS. DUE TO HER LEADERSHIP PERSEVERANCE, DEDICATION, AND HISTORIC CONTRIBUTIONS SHE BECAME THE SYMBOL OF VOLUNTEERISM IN KEEPING MONTESANO AND EAST COUNTY HISTORY ALIVE. SHE WAS INSTRUMENTAL IN THE BIRTH OF CHEHALIS VALLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY MUSEUM (CVHSM), WHICH WAS RENAMED IN HER HONOR, "THE PATRICIA A. CLEMONS CHEHALIS VALLEY HISTORICAL MUSEUMS" IN APRIL 2020.

WITH HER FAMILY HISTORY AND DEEP KNOWLEDGE AND CARE FOR THE MONTESANO AND EAST COUNTY COMMUNITY, SHE WAS A DEDICATED VOLUNTEER AND COMMUNITY LEADER WHO ALWAYS SOUGHT TO GIVE HER KNOWLEDGE AND RESOURCES FOR THE BETTERMENT OF THE COMMUNITY.

IN 2008 SHE WAS NAMED MONTESANO'S CITIZEN OF THE YEAR AND WAS CHOSEN AS GRAND MARSHALL FOR THE FESTIVAL OF LIGHTS PARADE. IN 2011, FOR THE FIRST TIME IN MONTESANO HISTORY, SHE WAS AWARDED THE "KEY TO THE CITY". ONE OF HER PERSONAL GREATEST HONORS WAS BEING RECOGNIZED AS A MEMBER OF THE MONTESANO HIGH SCHOOL HALL OF FAME IN 2013. SHE WAS ALSO NAMED THE 2021 POLSON MUSEUM PIONEER OF THE YEAR, THE SAME HONOR RECEIVED BY HER FATHER IN 1980.

PATRICIA WAS THE LAST SURVIVING GRANDCHILD OF C.H. CLEMONS SR., CLEMONS TREE FARM NAMESAKE, WAS EXTREMELY PROUD OF HER HERITAGE AND KEPT HIS MEMORY ALIVE FOR THE FAMILY AND THE COMMUNITY. IN 1941 SHE WAS PRESENT AT THE INITIAL DEDICATION OF CLEMONS TREE FARM, AMERICA'S FIRST, AND NEVER MISSED ONE IN THE YEARS TO FOLLOW, SPEAKING AT THE 75TH ANNIVERSARY IN 2016.

THE C.H. CLEMONS MEMORIAL FUND WILL BENEFIT THE HEALTH, EDUCATION, AND WELFARE OF CHILDREN IN THE MONTESANO SCHOOL DISTRICT. ADDITIONAL BENEFICIARIES ARE FRIENDS OF THE W.H. ABEL MEMORIAL LIBRARY, CONNECTIONS (FORMERLY THE CHILDREN'S ADVOCACY CENTER OF GH), MONTESANO AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMMING AND THE GRAYS HARBOR AUDUBON SOCIETY FOR CHARTERED PURPOSES.

THANK YOU TO PATRICIA FOR HER MANY YEARS OF DEDICATED SERVICE TO OUR COMMUNITY. IT IS OUR HONOR TO CONTINUE TO KEEP YOUR LEGACY ALIVE THROUGH THE WORK OF THE FOUNDATION.

REMEMBERING SUE DIXON: AN INSPIRATION TO ALL SHE MET AND A LIFELONG GRIZZLY



ANY OF US THAT GREW UP ON THE HARBOR, KNOW THAT GRIZZLY PRIDE IS A REAL THING. PEOPLE THAT GREW UP IN HOQUIAM AND EXPERIENCED THE BATTLE OF MYRTLE STREET KNOW THAT BEING A GRIZZLY IS FOR LIFE. SUE DIXON, HOQUIAM HIGH SCHOOL CLASS OF 1977, WAS A DIEHARD GRIZZLY THAT TOUCHED THE LIVES OF MANY PEOPLE IN OUR COMMUNITY, ESPECIALLY THE STUDENTS AT WASHINGTON ELEMENTARY AND HOQUIAM HIGH SCHOOL DURING HER TIME AS HEAD CUSTODIAN. THE FOUNDATION IS HONORED TO PARTNER WITH HER FAMILY TO CREATE THE SUE DIXON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND TO BENEFIT A FEMALE ATHLETE FROM HOQUIAM HIGH SCHOOL.

SUE WAS A 'NORTH ENDER' KID GROWING UP. SHE AND HER 'NORTH END' FRIENDS SPENT A LOT OF TIME RIDING BIKES FOR HOURS AT A TIME. SHE WAS VERY INVOLVED ALL THROUGH HIGH SCHOOL AS WELL AS ONE OF THE FIRST FEMALE ATHLETES TO PARTICIPATE IN COMPETITIVE SPORTS FOR HOQUIAM HIGH SCHOOL. SHE LATER WAS AN ORIGINAL COACH WHEN THE DISTRICT STARTED WOMEN'S FASTPITCH.

GRADUATING IN 1977, SUE WAS A MEMBER OF MANY CLUBS, INCLUDING THE HIGH SCHOOL SPIRIT CLUB. SUSAN CONTINUED HER EDUCATION AT GRAYS HARBOR COLLEGE, CENTRAL WASHINGTON UNIVERSITY, AND RECEIVED HER TEACHING DEGREE AT ST. MARTIN'S UNIVERSITY. AFTER WORKING SEVERAL YEARS FOR THOUSAND TRAILS, SUE FOUND HER HOME WORKING FOR THE HOQUIAM SCHOOL DISTRICT AS A HEAD CUSTODIAN. HAVING A KNACK FOR HELPING KIDS, SHE IS REMEMBERED FONDLY BY STUDENTS FROM WASHINGTON ELEMENTARY AND HOQUIAM HIGH SCHOOL. SUE ALSO HELPED COACH AND REFEREE GIRLS' VOLLEYBALL AND SOFTBALL.

SUE'S PARTNER, DIANE GOLOB SAID OF HER: " AS AN ADULT, SHE LOVED EACH DAY WHETHER SHE WAS WORKING OR PLAYING. SHE ALWAYS DID EVERYTHING WITH A SMILE AND TO THE BEST OF HER ABILITY. SHE WORKED HARD AND PLAYED HARD. SHE COULD TAKE ANY SITUATION AND MAKE IT BETTER. SHE HAD A POSITIVE IMPACT ON EVERY PERSON SHE WORKED WITH, WHETHER DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY. AS A UNION LEADER SHE ALWAYS LOOKED FOR AN OUTCOME THAT WAS A WIN-WIN FOR BOTH THE UNION AND THE DISTRICT. SHE WAS ALSO A POSITIVE INFLUENCE ON STUDENTS THAT ATTENDED WASHINGTON ELEMENTARY AND LATER THE HIGH SCHOOL, THE TWO BUILDINGS WHERE SHE WORKED AS HEAD CUSTODIAN. SHE WAS PROUD TO BE A HOQUIAM GRIZZLY AND WAS A TRUE FRIEND AND CARED ABOUT EVERYONE SHE MET, AND EVERYONE SHE MET LOVED BEING PART OF SUE'S LIFE. SHE WAS AN INSPIRATION TO ALL SHE MET.







LAKE QUINAULT SCHOOL DISTRICT

RECENTLY, WE AWARDED LAKE QUINAULT SCHOOL DISTRICT OVER \$30,000 FOR AN OVERHAUL OF THEIR LUNCH ROOM. SUPERINTENDENT, KEITH SAMPLAWSKI REPORTED BACK WITH THIS UPDATE ON THE PROJECT:

"ONCE AGAIN I WOULD LIKE TO THANK YOU FOR YOUR GENEROUS DONATION TOWARDS OUR NEW KITCHEN TABLES. THE TABLES ARRIVED YESTERDAY AND THE OLD POCKETS WERE REMOVED AND THE NEW ONES INSTALLED WITHIN A FEW HOURS. TODAY OUR STUDENTS WILL BE USING THEM AT LUNCH FOR THE FIRST TIME. IT IS HARD TO EXPLAIN THE INCREDIBLE DIFFERENCE IN BOTH THE QUALITY AND EASE OF USE WHEN YOU COMPARE THESE TABLES TO OUR OLD ONES."

THE STUDENTS AT LAKE QUINAULT DO AN INCREDIBLE JOB OF TAKING CARE OF SCHOOL PROPERTY AND I KNOW THAT THESE TABLES WILL LOOK NEW FOR THE NEXT 20 YEARS."



ELTON BENNETT ART EXHIBIT

LOCAL ARTIST ELTON BENNETT. BENNETT WAS A 20TH-CENTURY AMERICAN ARTIST LIVING AND WORKING IN THE NORTHWEST. BORN IN 1910 IN COSMOPOLIS, WASHINGTON, BENNETT GREW UP AND WORKED ON THE WASHINGTON COAST, ATTENDED ART SCHOOL AT THE AGE OF 36 AND BY 1956 BECAME A FULL-TIME ARTIST MAKING SERIGRAPHS OR SILK SCREEN PRINTS. HE CONTINUED WORKING UNTIL HIS TRAGIC DEATH IN 1974:

ON OPENING DAY JUST OVER 500 VISITORS TOURED THE MEANDERING EXHIBIT. MOST YOUNGER VISITORS WERE UNAWARE OF THE ARTIST OR HIS ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN AMERICANS ART. MOST OLDER VISITORS WERE EXCITED AND TOLD OF THE ELTON BENNETT THAT THEY OR SOMEONE IN THEIR FAMILY PROUDLY OWNED. THE EXHIBIT WAS OPEN FOR TWO WEEKENDS AND HAD 27 ADDITIONAL VISITORS INCLUDING A GENTLEMAN WRITING A BOOK ABOUT MR. BENNETT AND PACIFIC NORTHWEST ART."

WESTPORT COMMUNITY SKATEPARK + PUMP TRACK: BRINGING FUN AND COMMUNITY TOGETHER

YOUTH ARE AT THE HEART OF OUR COMMUNITIES, SO WHEN DARCIA DAVIS, THE PERSON THAT SPEARHEADED THE WESTPORT COMMUNITY SKATEPARK + PUMP TRACK PROJECT SAW YOUTH STRUGGLING DURING THE PANDEMIC IN THE SOUTH BEACH AREA, SHE KNEW SOMETHING NEEDED TO BE DONE.

WORKING BEHIND THE SCENES FOR A COUPLE OF YEARS NOW, DARCIA HAS BEEN A BIG ADVOCATE TO BRING A SKATEPARK AND PUMP TRACK TO WESTPORT AND THE BUZZ IS STARTING TO PICK UP AFTER THEIR FIRST BIG FUNDRAISING AND AWARENESS EVENT AT PIRATE DAZE IN JUNE. BETWEEN DONATIONS AND EXISTING MONEY FROM THE CITY'S SALE OF THE METAL SKATE RAMPS THAT USED TO BE UP AT THE CITY PARK, CLOSE TO \$35K HAD BEEN RAISED BEFORE BRINGING THE PROJECT TO THE FOUNDATION. WITH AN AWESOME GROUP OF LOCAL VOLUNTEERS DRIVING THIS PROJECT FORWARD, THEY CONTINUE TO RAISE MONEY TO MAKE THIS DREAM BECOME A REALITY.

WITH THE TOTAL SCOPE OF THE PROJECT AT \$750,000, THEY SUBMITTED A GRANT TO THE RECREATION AND CONSERVATION OFFICE FOR \$500,000 THEY HOPE TO BE AWARDED IN JULY OF 2023. IN ORDER TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE RCO AWARD, THEY NEED TO RAISE A 20% MATCH OF THE TOTAL PROJECT COST.

DARCIA COMMENTED: "WHILE WE MAY NOT HAVE ALL THE YOUTH OPPORTUNITIES OF AN URBAN AREA, THE SOUTH BEACH IS A VERY SPECIAL PLACE BECAUSE OUR COMMUNITY SPIRIT IS STRONG. THIS PROJECT HAS BEEN MET WITH OVERWHELMING SUPPORT BY THE CITY OF WESTPORT, LOCAL BUSINESSES, AND RESIDENTS - LOCAL AND FROM AROUND THE HARBOR. THE PROPOSED FACILITY WILL BE A HUB IN THE HEART OF OUR COMMUNITY, PROVIDING A MUCH NEEDED PLACE FOR OUR YOUTH, FAMILIES, AND VISITORS TO RECREATE OUTDOORS WHILE BUILDING SKILLS, CAMARADERIE AND LIFELONG RELATIONSHIPS. THIS WILL CREATE A SENSE OF PRIDE WITHIN OUR COMMUNITY, ESPECIALLY AMONG OUR YOUTH WHO ARE OUR FUTURE. THEY WILL KNOW THAT THEY TOO ARE WORTH HAVING A WORLD-CLASS SKATEPARK AND PUMP TRACK THIS CLOSE TO HOME."

THE FACILITY SITE IS AT DRUZIANICH PARK NEXT TO HARMS LITTLE LEAGUE FIELD AND THE LIBRARY. DARCIA HAS CREATED A STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM AND HAS ALREADY RECRUITED A GROUP OF TEENS THAT WILL SERVE AS AMBASSADORS OF THE PARK WITH THE GOAL OF KEEPING IT A POSITIVE AND CLEAN ENVIRONMENT THAT IS SAFE FOR ALL TO USE (NO DRUG OR ALCOHOL, LITTERING, OR GRAFFITI). YOUTH WILL ALSO BE ABLE TO FULFILL COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS REQUIRED FOR HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION, WHILE FEELING A SENSE OF PRIDE AND OWNERSHIP IN THEIR COMMUNITY.





MOST OF US IN GRAYS HARBOR ARE FAMILIAR WITH WESTPORT WINERY AND THEIR FANTASTIC FOOD AND WINE SELECTION, BUT THEIR NEWEST ADDITION TO THE WINERY IS THE INTERNATIONAL MERMAID MUSEUM THAT IS DEDICATED TO TEACHING OCEAN ECOLOGY FROM SEASHORE TO SEA FLOOR IMMERSSED IN MERMAID MYTHOLOGY UNIFYING OCEANIC CULTURES.

KIM ROBERTS, MUSEUM FOUNDER, WHO IS ALSO CO-OWNER OF WESTPORT WINERY WITH HER HUSBAND BLAINE COMMENTED ON THE CREATION OF THE SCHOLARSHIP FUND: "FROM THE BEGINNING, THE INTERNATIONAL MERMAID MUSEUM PLANNED TO FUND A TRADE SCHOLARSHIP FOR STUDENTS WHO WANT TO LIVE AND WORK IN THE HARBOR. THE MUSEUM'S MISSION IS TO TEACH OCEAN ECOLOGY FROM SEASHORE TO SEA FLOOR, IMMERSSED IN MERMAID MYTHOLOGY, UNITING WORLD OCEANIC CULTURES. WE RECOGNIZE THAT A TRADITIONAL COLLEGE PATH IS NOT THE BEST MATCH FOR ALL GRADUATES.

HOWEVER, WE BELIEVE THAT PEOPLE WITH GOOD SKILLS AND TRAINING CAN WELL PROVIDE FOR THEMSELVES AND THEIR FAMILIES. WITH THIS IN MIND, OUR SCHOLARSHIP IS FOR STUDENTS WHO WISH TO ATTEND GRAYS HARBOR COLLEGE TO EARN A CERTIFICATE IN A SKILLED TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM VERSUS A LIBERAL ARTS DEGREE. WE HAVE A PREFERENCE FOR STUDENTS WHO ARE STRUGGLING WITH HOUSING INSECURITY BUT THAT IS NOT A REQUIREMENT."

"HAPPY NEW YEAR TO THE FINE FOLKS WHO HAVE HELPED ME THIS YEAR. I WANTED TO SHARE A PROGRESS REPORT WITH YOU.

THE THREE MAJOR GOALS OF THE APPRENTICESHOP ARE TO TEACH BOAT BUILDING, SEAMANSHIP, AND TO BE PURPOSEFUL IN BUILDING UP PEOPLE. I WAS A VERY, VERY NOVICE WOODWORKER WHEN I APPLIED. PREVIOUSLY, MY ONLY REAL EXPERIENCE WAS A WOOD SHOP CLASS MY FRESHMAN YEAR OF HIGH SCHOOL AND WE DID MAKE BOATS. BUT THERE WERE NO OTHER OPPORTUNITIES TO CONTINUE DEVELOPING THAT SKILL UNTIL THIS FALL.

MY COMFORT LEVEL WITH THE TOOLS HAS INCREASED SO MUCH. I NOW KNOW HOW TO CARE FOR AND SHARPEN MY CHISELS AND PLANES. I'M MUCH MORE KNOWLEDGEABLE AND CONFIDENT IN MY SKILLS FOR KNOWING WHICH TOOLS ARE GOOD FOR WHICH ASPECTS OF THE JOB. I'M NOT AFRAID TO TOUCH THE BANDSAW. I CAN WORK WITH THE LARGER POWER TOOLS SAFELY AND EFFECTIVELY. I'VE LEARNED ENOUGH THAT I COULD REBUILD THE SKIFF PROJECT PRETTY MUCH ON MY OWN AND BE PLEASED WITH THE RESULT.

I APPRECIATE SO MUCH THE CHANCE TO LEARN IN THIS ENVIRONMENT. IT'S STUNNINGLY BEAUTIFUL. THE COMMUNITY AT LARGE IS AMAZING. AND THE WORK IS CHALLENGING AND FULFILLING. I WILL WRITE ANOTHER UPDATE IN A FEW MONTHS SO YOU CAN SEE THE TANGIBLE RESULTS OF YOUR INVESTMENT IN MY EDUCATION."
