Oregon's Recycling System is Getting an Upgrade

Oregon's Plastic Pollution and Recycling Modernization Act (RMA) officially goes into effect July 1.



What You Can Expect:

- A unified, state-wide collection list of what goes into the recycling cart, reducing confusion.
- Additional materials allowed in your recycling cart.
- Expanded recycling opportunities for all Oregonians.
- Assurance that recyclable materials are sent to responsible end-markets and find a new life.

Commingle Recycling Materials & Preparation

Until new changes are implemented, please refer to your recycling guide and only include those acceptable materials. See collection schedule on the back page.

Acceptable materials: mixed paper, flattened cardboard and metal cans. Plastic bottles, jugs and tubs (6 ounce or larger), empty & dry.

Place recyclables loose in your recycling carts or at drop off depots. Never place recyclables in plastic bags. Plastic bags can be recycled separately at participating grocery stores.

Recycling is important because it conserves energy and natural resources like water, trees, and minerals. By reusing materials, we lessen the need to extract new resources. It could also save money on your bill by separating out recyclables.
