Deschutes Public Library promotes sustainability through reuse, sharing, repair, and waste reduction programs.

Use your library card to unlock dozens of free digital resources from movies to language-learning tools, online sewing classes and so much more.

Commingle Recycling Materials & Preparation

Simple practices like rinsing containers, removing food waste and sorting materials properly help ensure recyclables can be processed effectively. See collection schedule on back page.

Acceptable materials: mixed paper, magazines, newspaper, flattened cardboard, aluminum and steel cans. Plastic bottles, jugs and tubs must be at least 2 inches by 2 inches in size. Plastic screw-on caps can stay on plastic bottles and jugs.

Never bag recyclables. Place recyclables loose in the cart. Plastic bags tangle equipment and contaminate other materials. Plastic bags and film can be recycled separately at most grocery stores or County Transfer Stations.

Recycling conserves energy and natural resources. By reusing materials, we lessen the need to extract new resources. Contact us for a recycling guide or download one at CascadeDisposal.com.

Making Healthy Foods Accessible

High Desert Food & Farm Alliance (HDFFA) is invested in building a just and equitable food system where fresh, local food is accessible to everyone. In Deschutes County, 12.1% of residents experience food insecurity.

HDFFA's Grow & Give program recovers surplus produce from local farms, farmers markets, community gardens and local growers and distributes them to food access sites. By rescuing fresh fruits & vegetables, the program ensures more people have access to healthy food, provides an income stream for local farmers, and supports the viability of the regional food system.

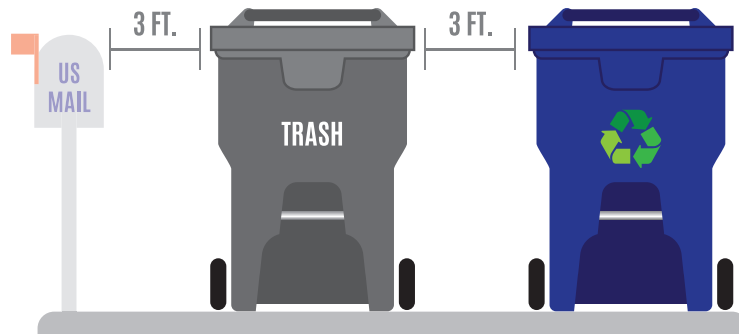
