#### GROUNDWATER QUANTITY RULES AND REGULATIONS

Tyler reviewed the draft comments received from the Department of Water, Energy and Environment. A formal letter outlining their comments is expected soon.

Discussion was held on setting the date, time and place for the public hearing for the proposed Groundwater Rules and Regulations update. A consensus was reached to hold the public hearing on October 30, 2025, at 7:00 p.m. at the 4-H Building on the Gage county fairgrounds. The date will be set at the next board meeting after formal comments are received.

Tyler informed the Board of replacement Well Permit LBB-1172 received for Virginia Filipi in Section 6-T6N-R4E. The permit meets all requirements of a replacement well.

# BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT

Dean discussed progress on the building project. A change order has been presented to switch the rake and corners on both buildings to blue. The building committee has recommended approval of the change order. The change order was received for \$10,535.00.

MOTION #4 was made by Dean Roehr, and seconded by Rodney Skleba, to approve the change order for exterior trim color in the amount of \$10,535.00 as recommended by the building committee. Motion carried.

#### SWAN 31 MITITGATION PROJECT UPDATE

Scott is working with the State and affected landowner to find a solution to keep the dam at a significant hazard classification.

# NRD URBAN CONSERVATION PROGRAM

Scott reported on the status of projects which were carried over from FY 2025. Two villages submitted documentation which requested payment for items that were not approved. Payment has been made based upon the approved items.

## NRD PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES REPORT

Scott stated that staff have been made aware of a log jam on the Big Blue River above Dogwood Road bridge. Gage County Emergency Management has been notified and have worked with the County to place signage warning of the danger.

Scott reported that staff is still seeking funding for final design and construction of the Little Indian WFPO project. Staff plans to meet with Senator Fischer's office to discuss the possibility of a Congressionally Directed Spending allocation for the project.

Scott noted that there will likely be 319 funding for sediment removal and shoreline stabilization at Clatonia public use area. The NRD has budgeted \$500,000 for the project with 60% of that to be covered by 319 funding.

The Trailblazer/Tallgrass pipeline is crossing 13 critical infrastructure easements. Staff will continue to work with the company to make sure crossings are handled appropriately.

The audit was conducted August 6-7. Scott noted that no new findings were presented in the preliminary report.

Scott and Tyler attended the Managers' meeting in Niobrara this week. The Governors' Water Quality and Quantity Task Force and Producer Connect were discussed.

Scott stated that he is continuing to work with Saline County Planning and Zoning to acknowledge breach areas as part of the building permit process.

Director Sand left at 9:45 A.M.

# CONSIDERATION OF MONITORING WELL BIDS

Tyler reviewed proposals for the development of three wells, noting that the proposals were higher than expected. Tyler suggested constructing one monitoring well in Sub Area 9. Bids were received of \$29,165 and \$31,610 for the well in Sub Area 9. Steve Kelley and Bruce Weise noted that they have existing unused wells in sub area 7 which could be added to the District's monitoring well network.

<u>MOTION #6</u> was made by Bruce Weise, seconded by Larry Barta, to work with the low bidder to drill one of the wells utilizing state funding for construction and telemetry. Motion carried.
