Scott stated the public hearing is scheduled for October 30, 2025, at 7:00 pm at the Gage County Fairgrounds. He further stated that comments may be submitted in writing by those individuals of the public that are unable to make the public hearing.

Scott noted that the notice of public hearing will be published in the Beatrice Daily Sun, Wilber Republican, Fairbury Journal News and Pawnee Republican.

NITROGEN REDUCTION COST SHARE PROGRAMS

Scott presented a summary of the proposed FY26 Nitrogen Reduction Cost Share Programs. He recommended removing the 160 acre cap on applications to ensure all funding is utilized. If applications exceed funding, a ranking process has been established to determine approval.

LB/LBB NRD NINE COUNTY MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN

Scott reported that the LBBNRD is the current applicant/sponsor for the application. JEO is assisting with the Hazard Mitigation Plan Update and a new Scope of Services is required. Discission was had on the purpose of the plan and Scott stated a Hazard Mitigation Plan must be in place in order to be eligible for pre- and post- federal disaster funding.

NRD PROJECTS & ACTIVITIES REPORT

Scott discussed the federal government shutdown. Due to the shutdown, hiring of the part-time NRCS clerk position and shared NRCS position are on hold. It is also time to renew the Memorandum of Understanding with NRCS. The MOU is being reviewed by Scott and NRD staff but cannot proceed until the government reopens.

Scott informed the Board that Larry Moore is retiring as the Nebraska Citizen Advisor to the Blue River Compact Committee. He requested that anyone interested in serving or nominating someone to serve contact him.

Scott reported that a potential drowning occurred at Big Indian on September 26, 2025. Thankfully, Jason and Rod Hartig were fishing the lake when the 911 call came in and were alerted by the Wymore Fire Department Chief. The Hartigs were able to reach the drowning man, and another man who had gone in to attempt help, before tragedy struck. Jason and Rod Hartig were presented Meritorious Acts Awards from the Gage County Sheriff for their efforts.

Scott discussed the potential Tallgrass CO2 pipeline that will go through several NRD structures. He attended the County Supervisors meeting in order to meet the representatives of Tallgrass. As a result, a meeting has been scheduled between Tallgrass and NRD staff to discuss potential impacts and easements.

Scott Theis reported that Spooktacular will be held October 18, 2025, at Willard Meyer. There was also a recent fish kill at Willard Meyer.

Scott Theis stated that the SnapTite project for Plum 2E is on hold due to recent rains filling the dam. He also reported that rock has finally been received for the recreation areas.

Brandy stated that groundwater use reports have been sent out. Reports have started coming back, and calls are being received with questions.

Brandy reported on the Southeast Area Land Judging contest which was hosted by the LBB NRD on Wednesday. Over 300 students and instructors from 18 schools participated. The top 5 teams will be going on to State contest.

Scott told the Board that the budget was submitted to the State. He also stated the audit report could be given by written summary rather than Dana Cole presenting to the Board at a meeting.

Tyler mentioned that there was a leak on the WRW line due to boring in the area.

SALE OF CUT HAY FOR MAINTENANCE OF GREEN TOP WMA

Scott Theis reported that 140 bales were received by the NRD from the hay cut for maintenance of Green Top. After researching current pricing based on the quality of the hay, he recommends selling the bales at \$40/bale.
