Under 18 Youth Advisory Group Nominations Information Sheet

Teach Us Consent is seeking young people aged 13-17 from across Australia to join our Youth Advisory Group (YAG).

The YAG provides young people with an opportunity to influence the development of Teach Us Consent's education resources, campaigns and youth-facing content.

Members will share their ideas, experiences and perspectives to help ensure our work reflects the diverse realities of young people across Australia.

Members will provide feedback and insight on topics including:

- consent and healthy relationships
- online culture and communication
- youth experiences and social dynamics
- educational resources and messaging
- how young people engage with content online.

Who should apply?

Teach Us Consent is looking to engage young people from across Australia who:

- are aged between 13 and 17 years
- live in Australia
- have the ability and time to attend regular online meetings and review materials
- are interested in contributing to conversations about consent, healthy relationships, online culture and youth experiences
- are keen to share their ideas to help shape education resources and campaigns for young people.

Applications are particularly welcomed from First Nations young people, young people from diverse cultural backgrounds, neurodivergent young people, young people with disability, LGBTIQ+ young people, and young people from rural and remote locations.

As members are under 18 years of age, participation is subject to parent or guardian consent.

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Role requirements

YAG members will attend regular online meetings between July 2026 and July 2027 and provide feedback on resources, campaign concepts and other project materials.

Members are expected to participate respectfully, maintain the confidentiality of group discussions, and contribute to creating an inclusive and supportive environment for everyone. Further information about the role can be found in the draft Terms of Reference.

Benefits, support and remuneration

YAG participation offers members a voice and influence on issues that are important to them and their peers. Members will build their skills and knowledge around areas including communications, leadership, research, and knowledge translation.

All members will undertake vicarious trauma training, group supervision and have access to individual supervision with a qualified mental health professional.

Additionally, members will be financially compensated for their time and expertise. Remuneration will be \$60 per hour and will cover meeting participation and pre-meeting reading and work (capped amount).
