Parents, it is imperative that students arrive to school on time and daily. Students are tardy after 8:30 am. 

Curriculum Corner



Classroom Happenings:

We are pushing through Quarter 3 and making strides in our academics!

Kindergarten- Our students are being exposed to poetry in reading. We are introducing them to identifying the rhyming words in a poem. This is a standard which is tested on our STAR test.

1st Grade- Students are engaging in hands on activities on how objects can move in various ways.

2nd Grade- Second grade is focusing on poetry as and are able to read and identify antonyms, similes, & free verse in poetry.

3rd Grade- With our recent cool weather, the third graders are getting a real life experience on how animals & plants change/ adapt to seasonal weather changes.

4th Grade- Students are focusing on figurative language in poetry as well as finding the theme in a story.

5th Grade- Fifth grade students can identify elements of a circuit that transforms electrical energy into heat, light, sound, and motion.
