Through smiles, hugs, and kisses

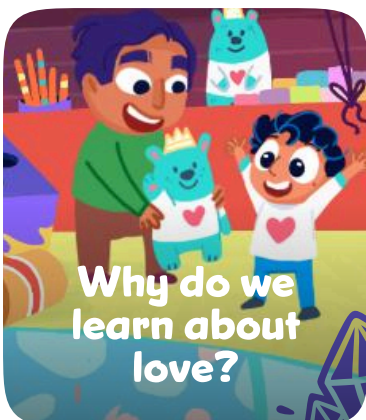
By sharing toys or favorite snacks
