Living Worthy of the Gospel

Philippians 1:27–2:4

Main Idea

Because we have been accepted in Christ, we are called to live in a manner worthy of the gospel.

Teaching Synopsis

In Philippians 1:27–2:4, Paul calls believers to live in a way that reflects the gospel of Jesus Christ. A gospel-worthy life does not earn God’s grace. It is the result of having received God’s grace.

Because Jesus has lived, died, and risen for us, we are called to stand firm, strive together, suffer faithfully, and walk humbly as citizens of heaven whose highest allegiance belongs to Christ.
