While these assemblies formally recognised students who attained the College's highest academic averages, they also provided an opportunity to celebrate the value of striving for personal excellence. We encourage all students to reflect on their progress, recognise their achievements and continue setting meaningful goals for the remainder of the year.

E-Bike and E-Scooter Ban

Thank you to our parents and carers for supporting the College's ban on e-bikes and e-scooters. We appreciate the understanding and cooperation of families as this important safety measure is implemented at the NDC campus, in line with the ban that has been in place at SPC for some time.

The decision to introduce the ban was made in response to significant safety concerns, both on College premises and in the surrounding area. Of particular concern has been the regular use of e-scooters at speed on footpaths around the College. Riding e-scooters on footpaths is prohibited under Victorian road law and presents a serious risk to pedestrians, students, families and other members of the public.

The College has received regular complaints from members of the wider community regarding their use near the College. Concerns have also been raised by members of our own school community about unsafe riding practices and the potential for serious injury.

Following previous communication with students and families, the ban is now fully in effect. E-bikes and e-scooters must not be brought onto College premises. Any banned item brought onto the site may be confiscated or secured with a College lock. Students and families will then be required to follow College processes to organise collection.

The safety of our students and community remains our highest priority. We ask parents and carers to continue discussing this expectation with their children and to support them in making safe, lawful and responsible transport choices. Thank you for working in partnership with the College to protect the wellbeing of everyone who uses our campus and the surrounding public spaces.

Preparation for the 2027 Timetable

Now that students have submitted their subject selections, the Timetabling Team will begin the detailed process of developing our 2027 learning programs.

The creation of the College timetable is a significant and complex undertaking. It begins with a careful analysis of student subject choices, followed by determining the number of classes required for each subject and year level. This information is compiled into our provisions list, which guides staffing, class structures and the allocation of learning spaces and other resources.

Once this work has been completed, construction of the timetable begins with Year 12 and progressively moves down through each year level. Throughout this process, the new Timetabling Team will work to maximise the number of students able to access their preferred subjects while balancing staffing, class sizes, specialist facilities and the operational needs of the College.

This work will be completed earlier than it was in 2025, and will incorporate revised timetabling processes. These changes are designed to support earlier planning, and provide students, families and staff with greater certainty as they prepare for the new school year.

Learning and Teaching

As we move further into Term 3, there are a number of important academic milestones approaching for students and families across Emmanuel College.

Subject Selections and Planning for 2027

Subject selections for 2027 have now been completed. Thank you to students and families for the time and thought that has gone into this important process. A reminder that parent approvals are due on the 10th of August. If you haven't received the email to do this, please contact subjectselection@ecmelb.catholic.edu.au. Where further discussion or clarification is required, members of the Learning and Teaching Team will follow up directly with students and families over the coming weeks.

The completion of subject selections allows us to move into the next stage of planning for 2027, including the construction of the College timetable and preparation of booklists. This is a significant process as we work to accommodate student choices and develop a timetable that provides the best possible learning opportunities for our students. A reminder that all class running is dependent on student numbers, timetable constraints and staffing availability. We endeavour to do our best to accommodate students' choices and will work with families when this is not possible. We thank you for your support during this process.

Parent Teacher Interviews - 20 and 21 August 2026.

Our next Parent Teacher Interviews will take place on Thursday 20 August and Friday 21 August 2026. Interviews will be conducted online, providing families with an opportunity to connect with teachers and discuss student progress, learning and areas for continued growth.

Bookings will open through Compass shortly, and families will receive further information when the booking system becomes available.

These conversations are an important opportunity to reflect on progress and ensure that students, families and teachers are working together as we move through the remainder of the semester.

Year 12 - Preparing for the Final Stage

For our Year 12 students, the end of their formal academic year is rapidly approaching. The coming weeks mark an important transition from completing course content and assessment tasks to preparing for final assessments and examinations.

Trial Examinations are compulsory, and will be held during the first week of the upcoming school holidays for all students completing scored Units 3 and 4 subjects. These examinations provide students with an important opportunity to experience exam conditions, identify areas requiring further attention and practise applying their knowledge under time constraints.

Trial examinations will be marked and feedback provided to students to help guide their preparation for their final VCAA examinations.

Revision will become increasingly important during this period. Effective revision involves much more than simply rereading notes. Different subjects require different approaches, and students are strongly encouraged to speak with their teachers about the revision strategies that will be most effective for each of their subjects.

Teachers can help students to identify priority areas, recommend appropriate practice questions and examinations, and provide advice about how to structure revision over the weeks ahead. Starting this process early and developing a consistent revision routine will help students approach their final assessments with greater confidence and preparedness.

We encourage all of our senior students to make the most of the support and expertise available from their teachers as they enter this important final stage of the year.

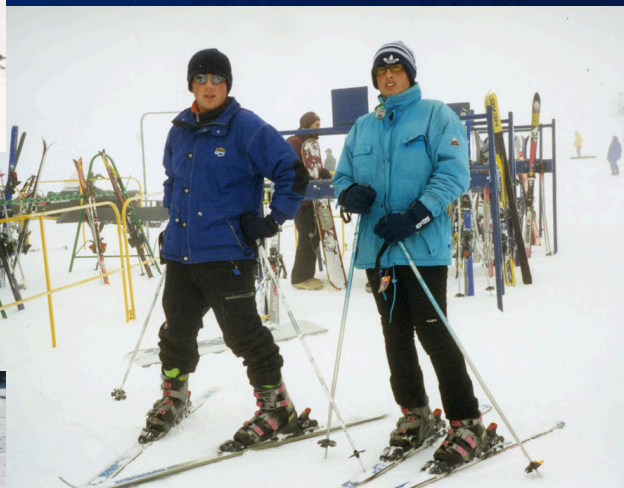
