The idea for *New Orleans Suite* was born on Bourbon Street one year during the French Quarter Festival. I had just moved back to town after an eight-year absence. The live music mixed with sunlight and the stench of the thousands of "last nights" conjured images of Saturday nights and Sunday mornings in this town, and how I have loved them both. These five performers began working on this piece in December, 2004; Courtney joined us in March. We trained together, improvised, and brought to the piece our perceptions of the city and its numerous histories and cultures, as well as our personal impressions of its Saturdays and Sundays. Our designers then came in to watch us play, and gradually *New Orleans Suite* was formed. In keeping with the tradition of our fair city, we have incorporated several improvisational moments into the piece. We hope you enjoy.

**Clifton Webb** holds a BFA and an MFA in sculpture, and teaches art in the New Orleans Public Schools. His works have enjoyed thirty years of exhibitions both local and national, and he has done extensive volunteering with local arts and education organizations. Currently, Clifton's works are on view at the New Orleans Museum of Art and Dooky Chase restaurant.

Rusty Tennant is an MFA Candidate in directing at UNO. Recent productions include *Patterson's Get Flanagan*; *I Love You: mind, body and soul: The Romeo and Juliet Project*; and *The Laramie Project (Storer Boone Award, 2004)*. He has acted Off Broadway (The American Globe, Judith Shakespeare Co. and Primary Stages). New Orleans credits include: *Sordid Lives*; *House of Plunder*; and *Chekhov's Wild Ride*. Also a closet playwright, Rusty has penned five full-length plays to date. Lighting desgins include *Get Flanagan*; *The Shape of Things*; *I Love You...*; and *Andy & Claire*. In September Rusty will venture to Stratford upon Avon to obtain a Masters in Shakespeare at the RSC's Shakespeare Institute.

**Sean LaRocca** has served in various technical capacities on productions for ArtSpot Productions, Tsunami Dance Company, Deborah Edwards, New Orleans Ballet Association, and Dah Teatar.

**Roscoe Reddix Jr.** (*Brown*) is currently teaching theater at his alma mater, Eleanor McMain High School. He is a 1992 graduate of Howard University's Theater Arts Department, with a BFA in Directing. He toured for two seasons with the African American Dance Ensemble. In New Orleans, he has worked with several performance companies, including Kumbuka African Dance and Drum Collective, N'Kafu Traditional African Dance Company, and Renverser Repertory Company.

Kathy Randels (*Black*) grew up in New Orleans and Lakeview Baptist Church. She is the artistic director of ArtSpot Productions and a co-founder of Moving Humans Performance Group. Her solo tribute to Tennessee Williams—*To Flee*, *Flee This Sad Hotel*—received a Big Easy Award this year, and she won an OBIE award for her work in *Nita & Zita*. She founded and co-directs the Drama Club at the Louisiana Correctional Institute for Women. Her original works have toured throughout the world and include *Rumours of War* and *Rage Within/Without*.

**Maritza Mercado-Narcisse** (*Blue*) was born by the Jersey shore, raised on Venice Beach, and is being fermented and seasoned in the waters of New Orleans. This is her second ArtSpot/Moving Humans collaboration. She is currently mentoring and teaching with KID smART and the New Orleans Ballet Association. Maritza would like to give a shout out to her Mami, Raquel Mercado-Narcisse, her father, Terry Gerrard Narcisse, and to all daughters of the water.

A native New Orleanian, **Yvahn Martin** (*Red*) began her professional training under the tutelage of Syrell Daniels and has studied or performed with various local ensembles, including Creative Movers, the Nandance Project, Adoration, and Zabumba. A graduate of the Tulane's Dept. of Theatre and Dance ('03), Yvahn produced and directed her first evening-length dance work "The Future Is Now" in Los Angeles in 2004. Yvahn is ecstatic at the opportunity to share the stage with such distinguished colleagues and former professors.

**J Hammons** (*Multicolors*) is a co-founder of Moving Humans Performance Group. He was a company member of MOMIX, has worked with Bill T. Jones and David Dorfman, and trained with Anne Bogart's SITI theatre company. J directed ArtSpot Productions' Big Easy Award-winning *To Flee, Flee This Sad Hotel*, and was a co-creator of *Chekhov's Wild Ride* and *The Maid of Orléans*. He is an Adjunct Professor of Dance at Tulane and holds MFAs in Dance and Theatre.

Courtney Bryan is a recent graduate of Oberlin Conservatory, as well as a graduate of the New Orleans Center for the Creative Arts (the old NOCCA). She is leader of her own jazz ensemble and a member of Marcus Belgrave's Quartet and SUGAR (female jazz group based out of Detroit). Courtney's compositions range from solo works, to small ensembles, to Jazz Orchestra, to Symphonic Orchestra. Some of her mentors include Dean Curtis, Clyde Kerr Jr., Daniel Weilbaecher, Roger Dickerson, Jeffrey Mumford, and Wendell Logan. In the fall, Courtney will attend Rutgers University to earn a Masters' Degree in Jazz Studies.
