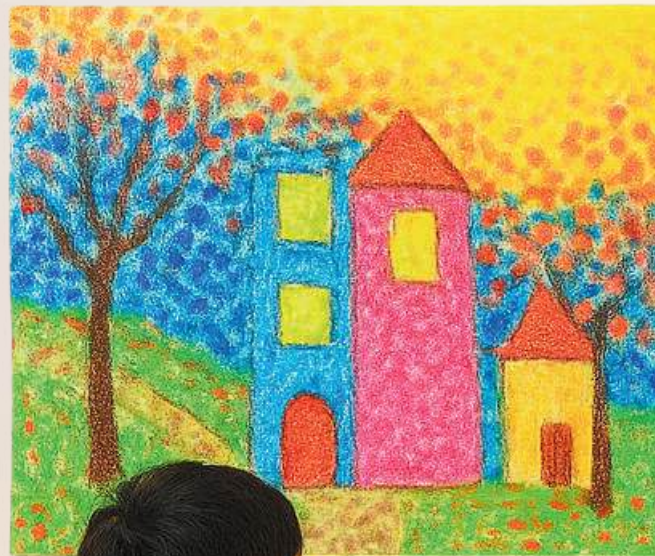

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FROM THE DESK OF THE MANAGING TRUSTEE

The year 2024–25 has been a period of phenomenal growth, meaningful partnerships, and the launch of impactful new programs for Ekam. It has been marked by successful collaborations and strategic, effective associations that have enabled us to reach more children and young adults across India—supporting them in their health and education journeys.

Ekam Aarogyam, our flagship medical support program for critical surgeries and interventions, reached over 1,243 children this year. The program offers timely and substantial financial assistance to families in crisis, enabling better health outcomes. We are proud to report a 95% success rate in helping children return to school post-treatment—a testament to the program’s efficacy and the unwavering support of our donors.

On the education front, Ekam Unnati & Pragati, our robust academic support and scholarship program, has reached a new milestone. This year, we will see our first batch of scholars graduating and entering the workforce.

In FY 2024–25, we supported 435 children in middle and secondary schooling and 675 young adults in higher education. Among the latter, 479 were nursing students, 73 engineers, and 65 from finance and other streams.

Despite a challenging placement environment, we have achieved a 79% placement rate among our final-year graduates. Recognising the hurdles in the job market, we have renewed our mentorship program to enhance employment outcomes. Under the Ekam Saarthi program, we are introducing a comprehensive mentorship and career readiness initiative, equipping graduates with tools for self-growth, confidence, and successful placements.

Two particularly significant partnerships marked this year’s expansion. First, under Ekam Saksham, our mental health initiative, we are proud to launch a mobile mental health unit in collaboration with the Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai. This unit will serve over 40 schools and 3,500 students, providing vital emotional and psychological counselling services to children in middle and higher secondary schools.

Second, through our institutional capacity-building vertical Ekam Nirmaan, we’ve partnered to support the development of the Chaitanyam Eye Institute in rural Kolhapur, Maharashtra. This facility, set to begin operations in FY 2025–26, will provide over 3,500 free cataract surgeries annually. In addition, Ekam Nirmaan also extended equipment support to the Paediatric CVTS Department at Sassoon General Hospital, Pune, that will benefit over 300 children annually.

These milestones reflect not only our growth but also our deepening impact. They are a testament to the dedication of our team, who adapt tirelessly to evolving Program needs with integrity and excellence.

To our donors, patrons, and collaborators: thank you. Your continued belief in our mission empowers us to reach further and serve better.

We remain deeply grateful for your trust and partnership, which allow Ekam to grow and transform the lives of children and young adults from underserved communities across India.

ORGANISATION OVERVIEW

The Need

Poverty, the right to good health, and the right to education are interconnected issues that significantly affect individual well-being, economic growth, and social development. Poverty not only limits access to essential healthcare and quality education but also perpetuates cycles of impoverishment and inequality for those trapped in a system of inadequate resources and intergenerational challenges of overcoming it. Addressing poverty, the right to good health, and the right to quality education is crucial for nation-building. Tackling one without the other will only diminish the overall impact on individual well-being and national development.

Theory of Change

WHY, WHERE, WHO, WHAT, HOW, and WHEN

Because investing in better health and quality education for all alleviates poverty, empowers lives, and enhances economic opportunities for everyone (WHY), we work across India (WHERE) to help children and young adults (WHO) improve their health and well-being while also providing better opportunities in life through quality education (WHAT), achieved via direct financial assistance supplemented by mentoring, counselling facilities, and capacity building (HOW), to transform 1 million lives by 2030 (WHEN).

Vision & Mission

Our vision is to improve the health and well-being of a child by providing aid to meet their healthcare and educational needs. We work as enablers in meeting the health and education-related expenses for children in need. Working in partnerships with medical and educational fraternities, our mission is to provide timely and adequate support to make health and education accessible and affordable to children. We also work towards preventive healthcare and the emotional well-being of children through awareness programs in schools and communities.

The Goal

At Ekam Foundation Mumbai, we identify the development needs of children and young adults in under-resourced settings, including health, education, and career opportunities, enabling individual resilience by provisioning a timely and adequate support structure for individual needs, thereby empowering the new generation to be equipped holistically with the developmental intra and interpersonal needs of health, education, and agency and skills, to navigate environmental challenges and secure socially sustainable outcomes which in turn contribute to a positive society. The new generation is the change-makers of tomorrow. We LEVERAGE this change by fostering resilient ecosystems for children and young adults, ENABLING them to meet the ever-evolving challenges of maintaining their health, EXCELLING academically, and ENHANCING their employability with the skills and confidence needed to redefine their futures.



OUR JOURNEY

2012

Ekam Foundation Mumbai was established as a nonprofit organization/NGO



2013

The **first 100 children** were supported under the medical-intervention program, now named Ekam Aarogyam.



2015

We **launched a nurse training program** in partnership with the Indian Academy of Paediatrics (IAP). In the first cohort, **100 nurses received training**.



2016

Aligned with **Swachh Bharat**, our **Health Awareness Program** held IEC (Information Education and Communication) sessions in 1000+ BMC schools annually. Post-COVID, it evolved into a monthly, pan-India online health and education initiative.



2017

Ekam Aarogyam began its **first medical outreach in Kolkata** with leading hospitals. It soon expanded across eastern India, partnering with trust and charitable hospitals in **Assam, Meghalaya, and Manipur**.



2018

Partnership with the student council of **IIM Vishakhapatnam** for outreach expansion work in southern India.



2019

Ekam Aarogyam was **expanded to cover cancer care** more broadly. Onco-surgery, BMT treatment, Therapy Drugs, Blood Disorders



2020

COVID-relief worth **₹1.35 Cr** was mobilized in a week for emergency care in Mumbai hospitals. An education fund evolved into **Ekam Pragati for school students and Ekam Unnati, one-time scholarships** for meritorious girls.



2021

Ekam Nirmaan, our Institutional Capacity Building program, **supports hospital and school infrastructure**, supplementing the health and education verticals by enabling capacity augmentation and long-term systemic improvements.



2022

From a hospital ante-room aiding 50 children, to a 10Cr organization **impacting 5000 lives annually**, Ekam marks 10 inspiring years.



2023

Expanded its impact with a rural health camp in Kolhapur reaching 6000 people, **launched Ekam Saarthi for mentoring and career guidance**, supported 20 remote army schools, cured 2700 clubfoot cases, and introduced a nationwide online health and education series enriching students beyond school curricula.



2024

IBM USA employees mentored students in science and IT careers. Under **Ekam Nirmaan**, we co-launched an **eye care initiative** in Kolhapur with partners, featuring a cataract surgery hospital and mobile eye check-up vans, serving 2.5 lakh people under the **Netra Jyoti Abhiyan**.



2025

Ekam Saksham launched **mental health support for children across BMC schools, utilizing mobile vans equipped with counselors**. In 2025, a residential workshop for nursing students focused on holistic well-being. That year also marked the first batch of management students selected under Ekam Unnati's higher education scholarship program.

IMPACT AT A GLANCE

To date, we have reached out to **10,000+ children** directly for their healthcare needs, in partnerships with over **100+ hospitals**, in more than **18 states in India**. Annually, we target to help **1200 children** for their medical needs under all categories of ailments.

Our education support footprints are visible in **23 states**, covering **258 educational institutions**, helping close to **2165 students** in just **4 years** since the launch of this program.

We have assisted **50+ educational institutions** in building their ICT labs, smart classrooms, and science labs in the last three years. Additionally, we have distributed desktops, laptops, projectors, printers, & digital smartboards too, wherever the need was.

Our mentoring and career guidance support program has expanded to become an independent program covering **35-40 one-day online sessions pan-India**, and conducting exclusive in-person workshops for students in Maharashtra, with cohorts of **100-150 students**.

We have just launched our new mental health program, **Ekam Saksham**, that will offer counselling and support to **3500 school children from 40 schools** selected for the pilot run in the Worli-Mahim area of Mumbai.



Since the pandemic, we have assisted **3-5 healthcare institutions** annually with their equipment and hard infrastructure/capacity building.

We have **donated an ambulance** to a remote village in Haryana to address the health check-ups for the villagers and workers.

We are working in partnership with the Chaitanyam Institute for Human Excellence in Healthcare, in constructing and establishing an eye-care hospital for cataract surgery in Kolhapur, Maharashtra, which will cater to nearly **4500 free annual surgeries** for the villagers from the upcoming year.

There is already a mobile eye check-up van covering various district schools in Kolhapur; **64 eye camps** have been conducted, screening over **8000 students**.

Our indirect impact would cover **5000+ children, students, families** and communities every year in an all-comprehensive development model of transformation and growth.

OUR WAY FORWARD



In these years since Ekam came into being, we have grown manifold, strengthening our identity, ability, and capacity to effectively provide better services to the people we work for. Every year we ask ourselves, **WHAT MORE** we can do and **HOW** we can do it better.

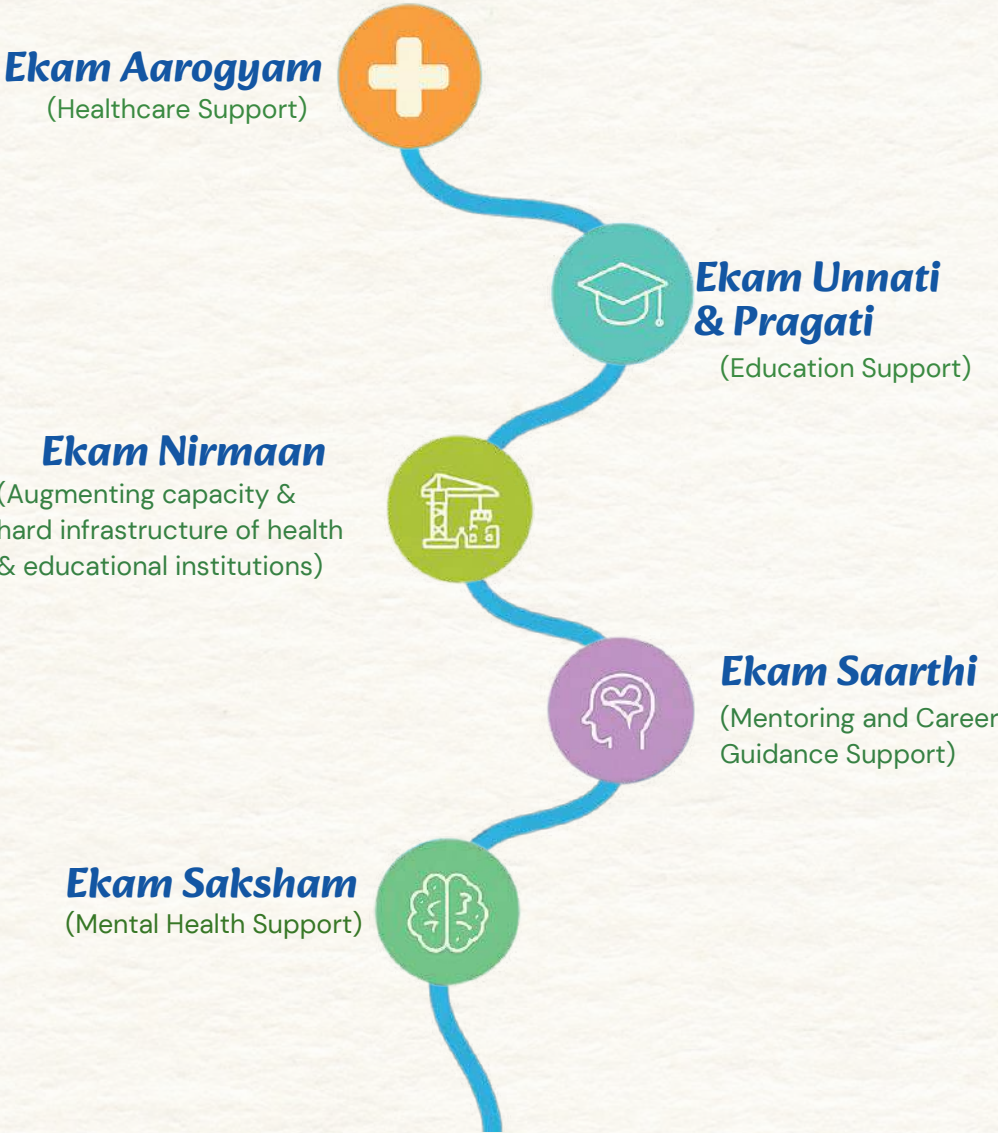
Three aspects stand out in our journey:

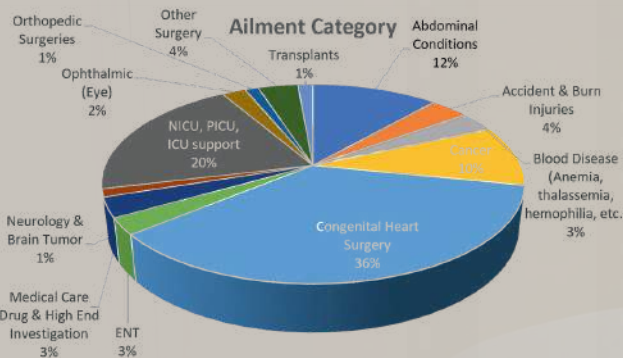
WHAT

The reduction in catastrophic health expenditure, alongside decreased cause-specific mortality and morbidity, results in improved patient outcomes and a higher quality of life for both patients and their families.

Case Story 1

Pihu (Name Changed), is a 3-year-old girl from Nehru Nagar, Pimpri in Pune City. She lives with her parents and younger brother. Her father sells vegetables and earns ₹10,000 per month, while her mother is a homemaker. Since birth, Pihu had trouble breathing. Concerned, her parents took her to a local clinic where a 2D Echo test was done. The doctors found a heart problem and advised surgery. Due to limited facilities, her parents took her to a well-known charitable hospital in Pune. After further tests, doctors diagnosed her with **Atrial Septal Defect** — a hole in the heart — and said she needed **congenital heart surgery**, which was quite costly. The family was already struggling financially, as a lot had been spent on earlier hospital visits. Seeing their situation, a social worker from the hospital contacted Ekam Foundation Mumbai for help. Ekam came forward and provided financial support for her surgery. On **June 10, 2025**, Pihu's heart surgery was successfully done by **Dr. Ashish**, and she recovered well. Today, Pihu is doing much better. Her parents are overjoyed and deeply thankful. **"A heartfelt thank you to Ekam Foundation Mumbai for saving our daughter,"** they say with gratitude.

Case Story 2

Miss Ambika M (Name changed) is a 10-year-old girl from Bellary. She lives in a family of six. Her father is a priest who earns ₹10,000 per month, and her mother is a homemaker. Ambika has two siblings and is currently studying in 5th grade. She is a bright student and loves dancing. One day, she started experiencing severe pain in her leg. Her family consulted local doctors, but the pain didn't go away. They took her to a multi-specialty hospital where MRI and USG scans were done, and the reports were abnormal. With the help of a doctor, the family was referred to Cancer Hospital and Research Centre in Bengaluru. She was admitted to the pediatric department, and further tests were done. After reviewing all her reports, doctors diagnosed her with **Osteosarcoma** — a type of bone cancer. The family was heartbroken and worried about the treatment cost. They requested financial help from the hospital. The team at the hospital applied for support from the Ekam Foundation. Her application was approved, and she received funds for her treatment. Ambika is now undergoing her **6th cycle of chemotherapy** and preparing for surgery. Her treatment is going well, thanks to the support from the Ekam Foundation. **"We are very much grateful to Ekam,"** say her parents with folded hands.

Case Story 3

Mr & Mrs Yadav (Name changed), A middle-aged couple from Lower Parel, Mumbai, were filled with joy when they welcomed their **twin baby girls** on **December 29, 2024**. However, their joy soon turned into worry. The babies were born **prematurely**, each weighing only **1400 grams**, and were struggling to breathe due to **low birth weight**. The mother had faced a difficult pregnancy, with early bleeding and labour pains. This led to an **emergency C-section**. The newborns needed urgent **NICU care and medical support**, but the treatment cost was extremely high for each child. The family was in deep distress. The father was jobless, and the mother worked as a chambermaid, earning very little. They couldn't afford the treatment their babies needed. Thankfully, a social worker at the private hospital in Mumbai, where the babies were shifted (due to a lack of NICU at the local hospital), reached out to Ekam Foundation Mumbai. Understanding the urgency, Ekam Foundation stepped in and provided financial aid for both babies. With additional help from other trusts, the rest of the cost was managed. Today, both babies are recovering well. The family is full of gratitude and says: **"Ekam Foundation gave our daughters a second chance at life. We will always be thankful."**

Vaishnavi lost both her parents a few years ago and, since then, has been staying in Bhiwandi with her two younger siblings, her aunt, and an ailing grandfather. She lives with her aunt, who is a home-based tailor who barely manages to bring some ₹8,000 a month home. With this small income, managing the expenses for the family proves quite challenging. But that doesn't trouble Vaishnavi much because she is more focused on the study aspects than possibly all these other issues. She has a 15-year-old sister in 10th class in Vivekananda English Medium School and a brother in 8th class in Skoller English School, for whom she looks after diligently. She is a strong-willed individual who hungers and thirsts for a brighter future while striving with all her strength for love for her family. It is not just the wish of becoming a software engineer, but also a desire to give back to society, which compels her. Her ultimate goal is to be able to help and provide opportunities for people in need, just as she would like to have for herself and her family.

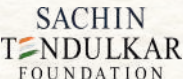
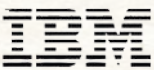
