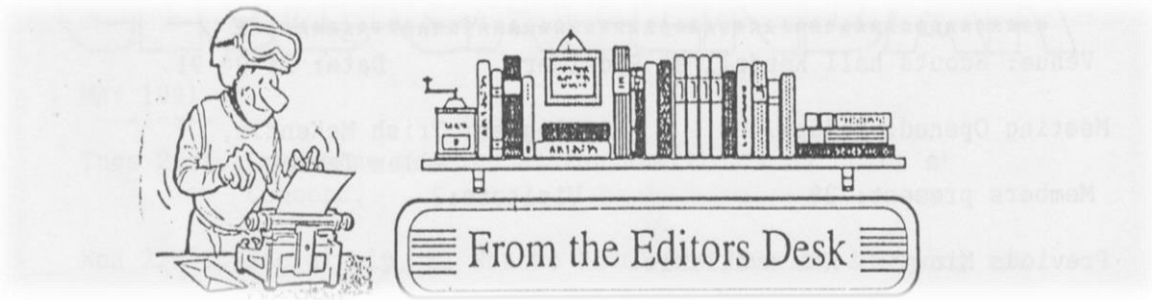

As far as the RMS is concerned, if the owner of the vehicle is not financial with his club, then the bike is no longer attached to a club and is unregistered, irrespective of when the bike's registration runs out. Remember if you read this message and you have not paid, your bikes will be "unregistered"!

Captains Report:

Kerry's last report – Tuesday and Wednesday are doing well, Sunday not as well. Brushgrove ride this Sunday, hopefully the weather will be good and hopefully more bikes will be able to make it past Glenreagh.

General Business:

1. Coffs Harbour Festival of Motor Sport – 12 November 2022

Members attended the meeting for the festival of motor sport held at the Coffs Hotel. There are three proposed areas for our Club Bikes to be displayed, two downstairs, one upstairs. It is the consensus that three different areas are a bit disjointed and hard to manage. The meeting agreed that we should participate. The area upstairs should be able to take around 60 bikes. The Harley group want some area as well. Entry is \$5.00 and nomination forms will be sent out.

Kevin Barber has mentioned that the logistics of the current proposal is not quite in the club's best interests. The concourse should be a totally separate event. The proposal was that our club run that whole portion of the bike display.

There needs to be another meeting with the Rotary Club and our Club to discuss further. We can't be responsible for other Club entries or even just random bike owners entering on the day.

In general, the members feel that the upstairs inside area is our best option, however, we have all bikes on display in the same area. Bikes would need to be in place on Friday afternoon, and not removed until Sunday. There will be security at the premises 24hrs so the bikes will be secure. Members are however responsible for ensuring their bikes are insured if they feel this is a risk, as the Club is not responsible for any theft.



Shannons have indicated they would be providing trophies.

The entry fee is an amount of \$5.00 per person (more than one bike can be entered) and our club has agreed to subsidize member entries. The show is not limited to vintage bikes, there are motor vehicles as well.

Geoff Newton motioned we take a space upstairs, we nominate 60 or 20 bikes for the spaces required.

Geoff Newton nominated we attend, seconded by Lara Bechez.

Geoff Newton moved the club subsidize the cost of entry, seconded by Eddie Oremek

There needs to be more discussion in conjunction with Rotary regarding the logistics of the event.

2. Glenreagh Timber Festival

We received an email from Geoff Maunder from the Coffs Harbour Vintage Car Club. They have asked we join them at the Timber Festival to display our bikes and would like us to indicate numbers who will be attending. We need to provide a copy of our Certificate of Currency to the Timber Festival, this will be attended to by Trisha Herraman. If members can please indicate if we are attending, as we need to provide estimate of numbers. This is in the ride calendar.

3. Chris Pearson Governance

Chris addressed the new executive committee and voiced his concerns regarding the Club Governance as something which needs to be clarified.

Under the Constitution the Executive Committee does not have the authority to make decisions and advise the Club.

If a suggestion is put forward by a Club Member, the processes needs to be followed as to the enforcement as per the Constitution.

The Executive Committee should meet to discuss the proposal and come back to the next Club meeting with a recommendation – not make decisions without the Club members voting on it.

Shane asked this be held over for further discussion.

This will be on the agenda for the meeting to be held in August.

Membership – Chris mentioned the recommendation that the executive made a decision to enforce a rule that Club members must attend four club functions a year, ie, either a ride, a meeting, the Club Rally or the Club membership BBQ – should this rule be removed?

Wayne mentioned that the executive should have the power to make the decisions, as members are not volunteering in the positions, if the committee make decisions then they should be supported by the Club as a whole.

Recommendations were made that the committee to discuss matters which are tabled at a meeting and then bring the decision to the next meeting to be approved by the General Meeting members - The motion was not carried.

Clarification on the constitution will be reported to the next meeting.

4. Membership Cards

Trisha Herraman has information for consideration that the Club purchase a Direct To Card Printer. This will replace the handwritten membership cards we are currently using with a hard plastic card similar to those used by RSL Clubs. There are two options available, a single sided version or a double sided version.

It was mentioned that if we were to purchase the double sided version, we may be able to attract a sponsor for some of the cost by putting their advertising on the back of the Membership Card.

Trisha will explore options for this and report back to the next meeting. Members unanimously voted in favour to purchase the Card Printer. After the initial purchase, the annual costs are minimal. Costings to be confirmed.

5. Registrations

Lance Marsh mentioned that examiners **MUST** be checking that members are current when issuing registrations. Members must also be made aware that:

Memberships paid as of the 1st July are valid for 12 months

If you do not renew your membership and your registration expires **AFTER** the membership date – you **CANNOT** ride your bike unless you are a financial member even if the registration has not expired

Can bike examiners please contact Trisha to arrange a mutual time to meet and review the Register of Registrations and the current membership data base.

6. Concourse de Elegance

Mick Carpenter put to the meeting that the Concourse de Elegance not be held at the Festival of Motor Sport as it is a Club function. Mick has suggested we use the new area at the Botanical Gardens and will make enquiries and report back to the next meeting.

7. Robert Major

Membership payment was received by Rob Major with a note requesting he be considered as a Life Member. The Committee will conduct the necessary checks and report back to

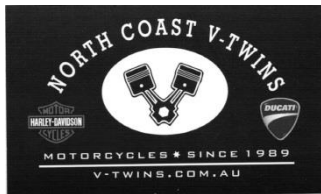


the next meeting with a recommendation. Rob, please feel free to attend the next meeting in August.

1. Concourse de Elegance:

2. Coffs Harbour Festival of Motor Sport – 12 November 2022

Shane spoke about the Festival of Motor Sport – on the previous week, we have been asked if we can nominate 6 bikes to be on display, special or unique bikes, to be displayed for the weekend, Friday, Saturday and take home Sunday. The weekend of the bike show is the 12 November. Again, we have space upstairs for 20 bikes, but also an allocation downstairs for more bikes which will be able to be taken home at the end of the day.

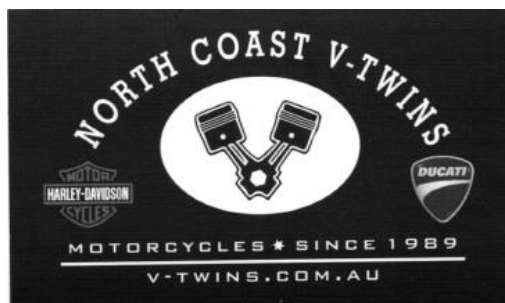
The stops have all reported that they had successful days with our attendance.

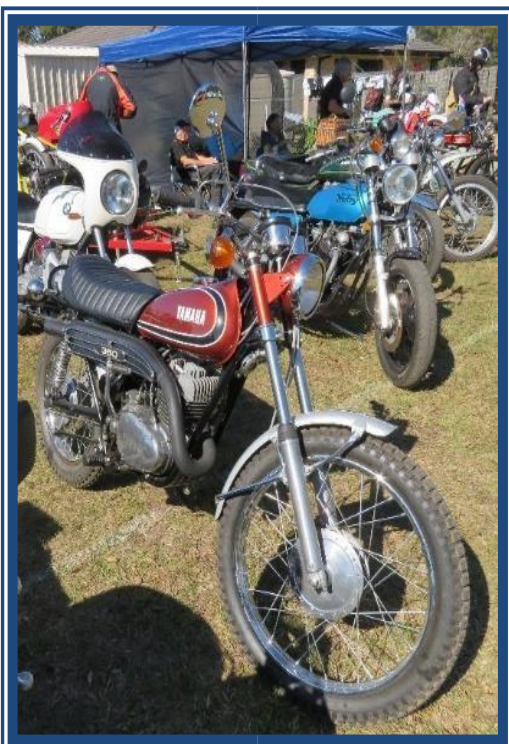

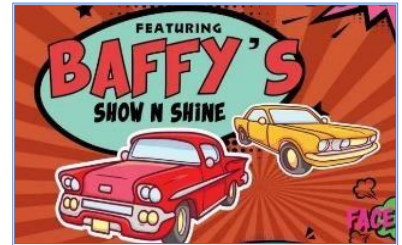

breakfast before heading to

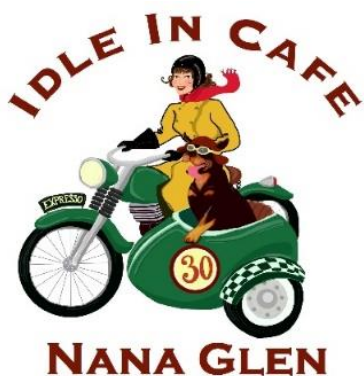

LOGBOOK

You must always carry your Logbook and Membership Card.

Your logbook does not need to be filled out when you are going on a club calendar ride. But you need to follow that route listed on the ride calendar leaving from your home address and returning to your home address and make sure your bike has been registered for the day by one of our Captains.

When to fill in your Logbook. You must record return journeys that are not part of club-organised events and each day of maintenance and personal use in the logbook.

There are two steps. The bike needs to be registered and the Registered operator must be a financial member of an authorised motoring club.

CLUB RALLY

Our Club Rally is held Annually in late May.

MEMBERS SECTION

Members are required to attend at least three events during a membership year and can be by way of attending a Club meeting, ride days, the rally, Club Christmas party or Membership BBQ day.

Members are required to abide by the Club's Constitution, refer to the Club website.

The Club will hold an annual BBQ at a venue for members to attend from 9.00am to 3.00pm on the third Sunday in June. This is a casual get together to have a chat, pay your membership for the following year prior to the due date of 1 July.

A drop from the Council of Heritage Motor Clubs to keep you going

- The CHMC continues to work with TfNSW at the **Historic and Classic Car Industry Working Group** (HCCIWG) to improve the framework for determining originality, period options, accessories and safety items for HVS registration.
- This task is still in progress and the list that remains on the TfNSW website is in **draft form only**.
- Approved Organisations for the Classic Vehicle Scheme (CVS) were recently invited to submit their procedures for processing applications and renewals for review by TfNSW and NSW Police.
- This was aimed at ensuring these remained “fit for purpose”, especially as these are mostly processed remotely; it being impractical to physically sight all vehicles.
- **The procedures and documents used by CHMC since 2017 were commended by TfNSW and Police.**
- However, CHMC committee has now revised the previous CVS procedures to:
 - separate **Initial Applications** from **Renewals**, and
 - include a checklist of what is required in order that its Eligibility Committee may make determinations within the context of its policy.
- The CVS Agreement for **Initial Registrations**, or when changes have been made to a **previously CVS registered** vehicle, will require **at least** 5 photographs or a video “walk around” to **clearly** show the vehicle and its modifications.
- The CVS Agreement for **Renewal of unchanged vehicles** will not require photographs, but will require declarations by both the Registered Operator and the Club that the vehicle still conforms to the previously supplied photographs.
- Copies of the revised CVS Agreement forms have been forwarded to Clubs with CVS vehicles, and are available from the CHMC website.
- CHMC considers that these revisions will reinforce the important role our affiliated Clubs have in administering CVS registrations.
- Peter Wright (*CHMC Registration Liaison*) and Jenny Fawbert (*CHMC Webmaster*) are prepared to arrange short ZOOM meetings for club Registration Officers that deal with CVS to share these changes with them. An invitation will be sent to clubs with a choice of days and times.
- CHMC intends to run further **Governance Workshops** this year. These will be a revised version of those offered last year. When arrangements are finalised the CHMC Secretary will contact clubs with an invitation.
