The Hand of God the Father is blessing creation from all eternity.

This gesture in a triangle, also sybolizes the unity of The Most Holy Trinty.

The Second Person of The Most Holy Trinity, Jesus in the Holy Eucharist is the source and center of life for the disciple.

Jesus protects His disciples with His precious blood and the chalice is the chalice of His blood.

The Holy Spirit is the Third Person of The Most Holy Trinity represented by a dove.

The rays of grace and holiness flow from Jesus in the Holy Eucharist and extend out to all.

The teal color surrounding the Holy Eucharist comes from the color of the tilma from Our Lady of Guadalupe. The Mother of Jesus is the mother of all disciples.

The ring represents the eternal God and surrounds the Holy Eucharist which is our focal point.
