Work experience	10.7 hours per week (Full time) and 5.35 hours per week (Part time) (Total 160 hours). As part of this programme requirement:			
	Students will be required to complete work experience hours in an Early Childhood Education (ECE) Centre by the end of week 15 (Full time) or week 30 (Part time).			
	 The programme tutor will help the students find work experience in an ECE centre through their industry contacts. 			
	 Students will be coached and mentored in interview skills and CV writing to start work experience by end of week 4 			
	 Students will be required to sign the work experience learner agreement prior to starting work experience with host organisations. 			
	 Students will be required to maintain a work experience log and submit it to programme tutor by end of week 15 (Full time) or week 30 (Part time). 			
	Police vetting for learners must be completed prior to placing them in ECE centres.
