Trailwork, Tools, Forest Service Summary



MWBA has made exciting progress in 2024. Thanks to the dedication of our volunteers and supporters, we have continued to steward the multi-use trails in the Angeles NationI Forest (ANF), making them more sustainable and accessible. Here's a year in review of our work together.

New Volunteer CSA with USFS

In August 2024, MWBA signed a new cost sharing agreement with the USFS. This agreement sets the organization up for 5 years of continued financial stability, and gives us funding to hire professional trailbuilders and brushing contractors when projects are out of scope for volunteers. The agreement also sets aside funds for new directional and trailhead signage, and approves E-bike use for trailwork purposes. This new agreement is testament to our strong relationship with the USFS, and the hard work of the board and our volunteers over the years stewarding trails in the ANF.

New Tools

- 13 new handled tools from Backslope tools
 - Allows us to expand our trail cache program
- Stihl Kombi Trimmer Pole Saw

Trail Stewardship in Mileage

- 61% maintenance (brushing, slide clearing, drain cleaning)
- 24% improvement (installing new drains, armoring erosion)
- 15% fire restoration (restoring impassible trail)



This year, our volunteers have steadily made progress on our Valley Forge restoration project. This trail was heavily impacted by the Bobcat Fire of 2020 and has been impassible by bike or on foot since then. We hope to reopen the trail in Spring 2025 with your help. Our next phase will begin in December with a weekend campout, where we will start working the trail from the bottom of West Fork.
