

CEO Ohio - Voter Registration Guide



In Ohio, You're Eligible to Vote if:

- You are *not* in state prison or federal prison for a felony conviction.
- You can vote at the completion of your prison term, though you have to re-register.
- You can vote if you are still on probation or parole, or if you have been convicted of a misdemeanor.
- You can vote if you were arrested on a felony charge, but not convicted or are still awaiting trial.
- You can check if you're eligible to vote online <u>here</u>
- You're a United States citizen and a resident of Ohio and the county, city, or village for at least 30 days before Election Day
- You're at least 18 years old on Election Day
- You are not found mentally incompetent to vote by a court
- Due to voter rolls being purged, sometimes individuals who are eligible and registered to vote are removed. You can check whether you're still registered to vote here

Where and How to Register to Vote

You can register to vote online <u>here</u>.

- The voter registration deadline is October 11, 2022
- To register online you will need your Ohio driver's license or Ohio identification card number, the last four digits of your social security number, your address, and your date of birth.

You can request an absentee ballot with this form.

- The deadline to request an absentee ballot is three days before election day.
- To request an absentee ballot, you will need one of the following:
 - Your Ohio driver's license number (begins with two letters followed by six numbers);
 - The last four digits of your Social Security number; or
 - A copy of a current and valid photo identification, a military identification, or a current (within the last 12 months) utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document (other than a notice of voter registration mailed by a



board of elections) that shows the voter's name and current address.

Where and When to Vote

- The 2022 Midterm election will take place on Tuesday, November 8th.
- You can vote in person or by mail before Election Day. You can find the nearest place to vote at https://www.vote.org/polling-place-locator/
- If you return your absentee ballot by mail, it must be postmarked no later than the
 day before Election Day and received by your county board of elections no later
 than 10 days after the election. The earlier you send your ballot, the better.

Additional Information

- If you have already registered to vote in Ohio but have since moved, be sure to update your registration with your new address.
- Under Ohio State law, you are eligible for "reasonable time off" to vote. This time off is only paid for salaried employees. Alternatively, you can vote by mail.
- If you vote in-person, you must show identification. See here for more information.
