## KICK-OFF: “SECURESCREEN PART 2”

The second part of Secure Screen, **Formation et Sensibilisation de Luxembourg’s** long-term training course has started! The project strives to empower young people and educators to navigate the digital world safely and responsibly. Participants of the training course dove deeper into the world of media literacy and cybersecurity by engaging in various discussions on social media, privacy and security.

The project “Secure Screen” is organized by the Formation et Sensibilisation de Luxembourg and financed by the Erasmus+ Program of the European Commission - Luxembourgish National Agency.

## THIRD SECTOR FAIR IN DINAN, FRANCE




Exchange of good practices, sharing of ideas, projects, and proposals were the key themes of the activity hosted in Dinan from May 15th to 18th, on the occasion of the Third Sector Fair coordinated by the French association Interculture. Along with other organizations from the third sector, association **Studenti per la Città** presented their work and outputs in the fair.

After a first day dedicated to sharing and exchanging good practices among sector experts, the programme continued on the second day with a series of roundtable discussions involving both public and private stakeholders on an equal footing. This was followed by thematic working groups bringing together experts and representatives from various categories, aimed at identifying priorities for young people and subsequently planning joint, travelling initiatives.

## EVENT “TRAVEL, DISCOVER & GROW – OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUNG EXPLORERS”

Earlier this week, the International Alliance for Cultural Relations joined **ICRP Budapest** and other partners in co-organising the event “Travel, Discover & Grow – Opportunities for Young Explorers” in Budapest, an inspiring initiative aimed at promoting youth mobility and international cooperation.

The event provided a platform for young adults to learn about EU-funded opportunities in cultural exchange, entrepreneurship, and non-formal education. Key topics included the DiscoverEU program, Erasmus for Young Entrepreneurs, and insights into previous Erasmus+ projects on rural development, outdoor learning, and intercultural dialogue. Interactive sessions and workshops offered practical guidance on how to engage in youth exchanges and international training activities.



## INCLUSIVE CAREER DEVELOPMENT AND BUSINESS MENTORING TRAINING FOR YOUTH WORKERS

From June 1–6, 2025 **Youth Line** organized a training course for youth workers from Portugal, Sweden, Greece, Romania, and Czechia where they met in Figueira da Foz, Portugal, focusing on career guidance and entrepreneurship. The project gathered motivated youth workers committed to supporting young people, particularly those from disadvantaged backgrounds.

Throughout the week, participants strengthened their mentoring skills, explored inclusive youth work practices, and learned practical methods to guide young people in developing career paths and entrepreneurial ideas. The programme combined workshops, group activities, and exchanges of good practices, creating a space for learning and collaboration.



## YOUTH EXCHANGE “EST-ART” IN ESTONIA

A 7-day international youth exchange “EST-ART” took place in Tallinn, Estonia which introduced young people a form of involvement and active participation through art in the public space. The participants from Latvia, Italy, Slovenia, Slovakia, Serbia, Spain, Greece and Estonia explored the history and modern meaning of street art.

The participants carried Pärnu mnt. Murals designed during the project for the legal graffiti wall of the overpass, shared more about their cultures and made long-lasting friendships. At the end of the project the participants held an open exhibition of their work during the project open for the local community.

## METaverse LEARNING HUB CONSORTIUM MEETING IN GREECE



On the 4th of June the Metaverse Learning Hub consortium gathered in Thessaloniki, Greece for a productive project meeting hosted by **The European Institute Foundation's** partners at Stimuli.

Together, they discussed the progress of their activities, shared ideas for supporting youth workers, and planned the next steps for empowering young people - especially those with fewer opportunities.

The project is focused on developing innovative tools and evidence - based resources that help youth build both digital and human skills for the future.



## PROJECT "ECOPLACEMAKING ACADEMY: ART AND NATURE SYNCHRONIZED"



On the 30<sup>th</sup> of June, together with the volunteers from the Association "**Young Improvers for Youth Development**" and other partners organized a day event in the nature for young people. Peer learning was a main point, as young people taught each other skills in nature, such as how to pitch a tent in the mountains.

As a mixed artistic touch and to promote local environments, they created a new photo point with a breathtaking panorama, and even learned how to shoot with a bow!



## FIRST WORKSHOPS OF BUSOLA MEDIA FOR YOUNG PEOPLE PROJECT

On the 20th of May, **Association I.D.E.I.** launched the first workshops within The Busola Media for Young People project, and one of the topics that sparked the liveliest discussions was information bubbles.

Participants explored, debated, and asked real questions about how information circulates and influences opinions in the digital age. With the students of the Technical High School “Ștefan cel Mare and Sfânt” in Vorona, they began a series of interactive sessions that combine media education, critical thinking, and active participation, encouraging young people to become more informed and responsible digital citizens.



## CAPACITY OF YOUNG ATHLETES AND COACHES PROJECT LOCAL VISIT IN PORONIN

As part of the Capacity Development of Young Athletes and Coaches project under Erasmus+, NGO Fraternitas had the honor of a local visit with the Mayor of Poronin, Anita Žegleń, alongside the team from Artvin Gençlik ve Spor İl Müdürlüğü.
