





CLEANING INSTRUCTIONS POLYPROPYLENE WEAVE


Cleaning a polypropylene rug is generally straightforward due to the material's durability and resistance to stains. Here's how you can clean a polypropylene rug.

VACUUM REGULARLY


- Start by vacuuming the rug to remove dirt and debris. Be sure to vacuum both sides.
- Use a brush attachment if available, especially on a high pile rug, to prevent damage to the fibers.




- For spills or stains, blot the area immediately with a clean, dry cloth to absorb as much liquid as possible.
- Apply a solution of mild detergent and water to the stain. Use a cloth or sponge to gently blot the stain. Avoid scrubbing, as this can damage the fibers.
- Rinse the area with a cloth dampened with water to remove any detergent residue.



- Polypropylene rugs can often be cleaned with a carpet cleaner or a mixture of mild detergent and water.
- Use a sponge or soft brush to apply the cleaning solution, gently working it into the rug.
- Avoid using too much water, as excessive moisture can cause issues with the backing of the rug.




- After cleaning, rinse the rug with a cloth or sponge dampened with clean water.
- Make sure to remove all soap residue, as leftover detergent can attract dirt.
- These rugs can be laid in an open area and rinsed with a hosepipe.



- Remove excess water by pressing with clean, dry towels.
- Lay the rug flat to dry, avoiding direct sunlight which can fade the colours.
- If possible, elevate the rug for air circulation, which helps in faster drying, but avoid hanging as this can compromise the weave and shape of the rug



MAINTENANCE TIPS





If the rug is used outdoors, ensure it's completely dry before placing it back to prevent mold and mildew.
