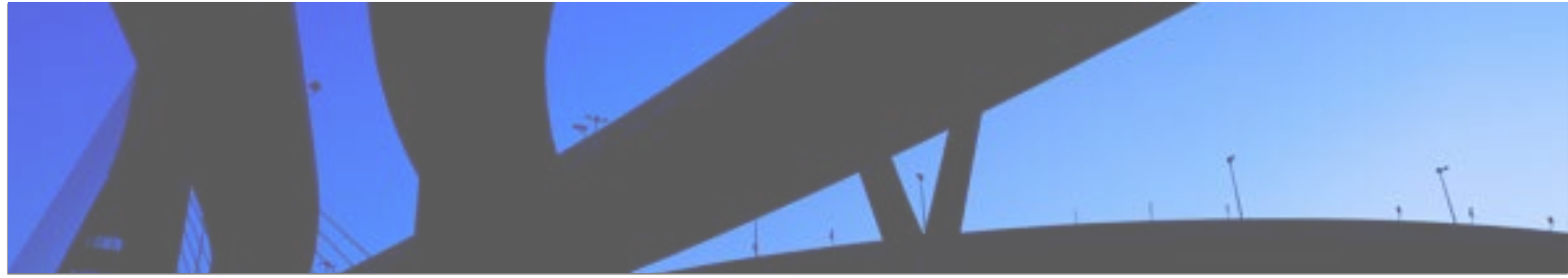

Safety

GreenArrow's safety performance is off to an excellent start in 2026! Both January and February closed with **ZERO Recordable Injuries** and only one first aid injury on record. This minor injury was a same-level fall that occurred while an employee was making adjustments to the back of a truck. Our 2026 performance represents a significant improvement over January 2025, when GreenArrow experienced two Lost Time Injuries, including one classified as serious. That month accounted for half of the company's Lost Time Injuries in 2025 and recorded the highest injury frequency and severity of the year. We have significantly improved our safety performance, moving from multiple injuries to zero recordable injuries for January 2026. Besides this improvement we sustained this best of class performance through the entire month of February. Thank you for everyone's dedication and focus in making this outstanding improvement happen!



Motor vehicle safety has also improved. In 2025, GreenArrow averaged three preventable Motor Vehicle Incidents per month. During the first two months of 2026, we have experienced two preventable Motor Vehicle Incidents, representing a **66% monthly improvement compared to 2025**. Staying focused on distracted-free driving and maintaining a safe following distance is helping us move this trend in the right direction. Let's keep it up!

The improvements in safety performance aren't the result of luck. It reflects the way our teams approach safety every day, identifying hazards, correcting them, and looking out for one another while the work gets done. These efforts make a real difference and help ensure that every GreenArrow teammate safely returns home to their families.

A big thank you to all GreenArrow teammates for the role you play in making this happen!

As we move through the rest of 2026, we'll keep building on this momentum through thoughtful pre-task planning, illuminating hazards where we see them, and continuing to work safely together across the GreenArrow family of companies.

Most importantly, let's continue looking out for one another. If you see something that could make the job safer, or have an idea that could help prevent an incident, please share it with your manager. Your observations and ideas are one of the most important ways we continue improving safety across GreenArrow.

Projects

Build Westville – CUP Loop Project at Westville Correctional Facility

The town of Westville, Indiana is home to one of the state’s longstanding correctional facilities. With approval from the State of Indiana to construct a new, state-funded facility, Midwestern Electric was awarded multiple bid packages supporting this significant development. Among them, the CUP Loop Project stands as the largest commercial project undertaken by Midwestern Electric to date. The CUP Loop Project serves as the primary infrastructure backbone for the entire facility. The scale of this effort is substantial, involving more than 27 miles of 6-inch HDPE conduit installed within concrete-encased duct banks, along with the placement of over 80 precast manholes. This work requires extensive coordination, precision, and sustained execution. Special recognition goes to Ken Hanisko, whose months of detailed coordination and installation drawings were critical to the successful planning and progression of the project. We also acknowledge Billy Mitchell, Site General Foreman, for his exceptional leadership and oversight. Managing a project of this size demands consistency, focus, and expertise, and Billy’s performance has been nothing short of outstanding. We further recognize the dedicated field crews whose daily efforts, craftsmanship, and perseverance continue to drive this project forward. The demands of installing and handling miles of conduit over many months reflect a level of commitment and work ethic that deserves sincere appreciation.

INDOT T-44347-B – Dynamic Message Sign (DMS) Boards

East Chicago & Indianapolis Collaboration

Our crews recently wrapped up a major joint effort with the Indianapolis office involving the replacement of Dynamic Message Signs (DMS) across the state for INDOT. These are the electronic boards you see along highways that display traffic alerts, incidents, travel info, and public safety messages.

For our region, the scope included swapping out 17 boards stretching from Calumet Avenue to the Michigan border along 80/94, multiple locations on I-65, and Route 30. This was a large, highly coordinated effort that required both day and night operations working in sync.

Day crews handled staging, setup, testing, and programming of the new boards to make sure everything was fully functional before deployment. The boards were then secured and prepped for nighttime installation. Night crews coordinated closely with INDOT, traffic control teams, and state agencies to safely remove existing signs, install new units, restore permanent power, and reconnect fiber infrastructure.

Once a sign was taken offline, timing became critical. There was no room for delays, and the crews delivered. Deadlines were met, installations ran smoothly, and the boards were brought back online without issue. Overall execution, coordination, and professionalism on this project were outstanding.

Hinson helps keep drivers safer with Wrong Way Detection System

This system uses a combination of infrared cameras and highdefinition cameras to detect vehicles traveling in the wrong direction. When a wrongway vehicle is identified, the system transmits an alert via the fiberoptic network to the Traffic Management Center (TMC), providing rapid awareness for response coordination with the Florida Highway Patrol.

In addition, fieldinstalled warning signs activate highintensity LED alerts to immediately warn approaching drivers and help prevent potential incidents.

Projects like this play a critical role in improving roadway safety. Successful implementation requires precision, coordination, and careful installation to ensure the system performs reliably under realworld conditions.

Safety Spotlight: Cool, Calm, and Committed to Safety

Team,

I want to take a moment to personally recognize the exceptional professionalism and composure displayed during the recent vehicle accident at our stop-sign work zone. While our crew was actively working with four trucks positioned at each intersection with strobes activated and cones properly set per our traffic control plan, a vehicle ran the stop sign and was T-boned by another driver. The impact caused the vehicle to strike one of our trucks, coming within approximately 3–4 feet of our crew members.



Because the work zone safety plan was properly implemented, what could have easily resulted in severe injury or a fatality did not. The placement of our truck acted as a critical barrier that prevented the vehicle from reaching our crew. The established traffic control measures were correct, visible, and effective. When I arrived on site, I was extremely impressed to see that the crew had already established control of the intersection, was directing traffic at all four corners, and was fully compliant with PPE requirements — hard hats, safety glasses, gloves, and Class 3 high-visibility vests. The response was immediate, calm, and professional. This situation is a real-world example of why we plan, why we train, and why we never cut corners on safety. Your actions protected lives — including your own.
