Code geass parents guide

Code Geass also includes a few spin-offs such as Hanyaku no Lelouch - Nunnally in Wonderland, which parodies Alice in Wonderland with Nunnally as the main character. It follows her journey into a fantasy world where she encounters familiar faces. Akito the Exiled OVA is another series that takes place between the two anime seasons and focuses on young soldier Akito Hyouga. There are also three compilation movies: Lelouch of the Rebellion - Initiation, which summarizes season 1 till episode 17; Lelouch of the Rebellion II - Transgression, covering episodes 18-25 of the first season; and Glorification, concluding with the rest of season two. However, these can be skipped for fans who prefer a new viewing experience. Lelouch of the Re:Surrection is an entirely fresh plot that takes place a year after Lelouch vi Britannia's Zero Requiem. It serves as an alternative ending to Code Geass and offers a refreshing change from previous compilation installments.
