The Bomberman Bakugaiden Series is a substantial toy series with fourteen releases, featuring its own independent character designs and setting separate from the continuity of the core Bomberman games. The series continues as a spin-off with Super Bomberman branding on many products but showcases distinct character designs and accessories like armor that can be combined into a large griffon figure or larger vehicles with additional marble shooters. The Bakugaiden Series also introduced combination, where two groups of three products each could be bought individually but then combined together into a larger toy with more features. This style of combination would continue to see regular use in B-Daman toy series thereafter. Additionally, near the end of the line, a boxed set was released for one of the groups, containing all three combining toys. The product list includes various Bomberman figures, such as Wicked Mail Cerato Bomber, Windam Mail Hurricane Bomber, and Griffon Mail Tiger Bomber, each with its own unique accessories and features. The series also saw the release of Super Bomber Armor figures with different combinations and variations, including Power Wing & Double Trigger. The Bakugaiden Series was created by Hudson Soft and Takara in 1998 and is based on the iconic character from the video game series. However, the characters in this anime aren't true Bomberman who use bombs as weapons but 'B-Daman' who fire explosive projectiles from their marble instead. ===== The world of Bomber (Kurobon) is one where each character brings their unique personality to the table. As the series progresses, they work together as a team, fighting against evil and having fun along the way. The B-Daman, like all heroes in this universe, possess an incredible ability - firing light rays from their marble for either destructive or healing purposes. However, this power can only be unlocked through practice and training. Those who excel in martial arts are particularly skilled at harnessing this energy, making their light ray even more potent. To combat the forces of evil, they pilot advanced mecha fighters known as B-Da Armors, which were designed by the genius Professor Dr. Gray Bomber (Dr. Graybon). These mechs amplify their abilities, allowing them to take on enemies much larger than themselves. The story begins with a legendary tale of how the heroic B-Daman defeated an evil force called the Dark B-Da in their quest for domination. However, it's only a matter of time before this threat returns. One thousand years later, the Dark B-Da have returned to conquer the Blue Solar System and destroy B-Da City. A new generation of heroes emerges, led by Shirobon (White Bomber), a young B-Daman with a strong sense of justice who dreams of flying. He befriends Aobon and Dr. Graybon, and together they join the battle against the Dark B-Da. Throughout the series, Shirobon and his friends protect B-Da City from destruction, fighting off the Dark B-Da's powerful beings in their Dark Armors. The mysterious Kurobon plays a crucial role in their victory. Main characters include White Bomber, Blue Bomber, Red Bomber, Yellow Bomber, and Gray Bomber. The villains, such as Black Bomber, pose a significant threat to the heroes. Minor characters like B-Daron, the pets of the B-Daman, hold a special significance in the story, releasing their power to destroy the Dark B-Da. The series consists of episodes that follow the adventures of these heroes and their battles against evil. The latest episodes have been broadcast again in Japan to celebrate the 25th anniversary of the original broadcast.Manga. Majority of the main characters also showed up in the earlier series, Bomberman B-Daman Bakugaiden. Concept[] Bomberman B-Daman Bakugaiden Victory (BB-Daman Bakugaiden V for short) is centered around the famous character, Bomberman, from the video game series with the same name. However, the characters in this anime aren't actual Bombermen who use bombs as weapons, but 'B-Daman' who launch explosive projectiles from the marble, or B-Da's, inside their stomachs, drawing inspiration from the B-Daman game. 'Bi-dama' (ビ―玉) translates to "marble" in Japanese, essentially making each character a 'marbleman'. Thus, in English, 'BB-Daman Bakugaiden' can be roughly translated to "Bomberman Marbleman Explosive Side Story". Plot[] The series mainly follows six protagonists: White Bomber (Shirobon), Blue Bomber (Aobon), Red Bomber (Akabon), Yellow Bomber (Kirobon), Green Bomber (Midoribon), and Black Bomber (Kurobon) who have taken on the role of B-Da Cops, patrolling their home and protecting it against threats to peace. Each character brings a distinct personality and element to the story, and they learn to fight as a team throughout the series to defend their world against evil. Like their counterparts in the previous series, they can fire light rays from their marbles and pilot mecha fighters called B-Da Armors to combat the forces of evil, allowing them to face larger enemies. The mechas can be piloted like vehicles or merged with the B-Daman's own forms through a transformation process that turns them into the head of the B-Da Armor itself, significantly boosting their combat abilities. For context, the project's future was questioned when his uploads of IV's subbed episodes (and subsequently channel) were removed around the end of 2023. For a moment, it was even doubted by many if those uploads were archived or not, and thankfully they were. For some quick context, the B-Daman series of marble-shooting toys actually started here. Around 1992 or '93, toy producer Takara and Hudson Soft collaborated to create these toys, initially as loose tie-ins to games like Super Bomberman, which had just been released at the time. Starting in October 1996, the toyline would become one of the series' first spinoffs with the introduction of a manga published in Cocoro Comic. From there, usually alongside any subsequent releases, more stories would be produced (often alongside some continuity reboot). The first series, somewhat confusingly titled 'Bomberman B-Daman Bakugaiden II', actually featuredLooking forward to sein everyone at the meeting tomorrow and discussin our strategies. ===== Fun fact, actually: that's why the first two episodes are so different from the rest of the first anime. For anyone who appreciates his work, said channel contains reuploads of many of his old videos as well as a few newer ones, which more or less makes my reuploads over on the YouTube channel a little redundant, but hey. Two uploads are better than one in the chance one of them gets taken down suddenly.While I won't provide any links on here (though, literally, they shouldn't be hard to find if you take the time to look around enough), it is great to see another piece of Bomberman's storied history be accessible to a larger range of people, even if Konami won't acknowledge anything outside of Japan.Okay, Bombergirl coverage FOR REAL next time.
