Indiana Issues Turkey Licenses for 2025 Spring and Fall SeasonsSpring Turkey Hunting Dates & Regulations in Indiana - 2025 Spring turkey season in Indiana starts on April 23, 2025, and ends on May 11, 2025. There is no bag limit during this time, but hunters must check their turkeys within 48 hours of kill using the CheckIN Game system. Hunters must follow temporary transportation tagging requirements when moving harvested birds. The spring season is open statewide, allowing turkey hunting from one-half hour before sunrise to sunset. Additionally, there are specific regulations for youth hunters aged 17 or younger on the day of the hunt. These youth hunters can participate in a separate youth season, which usually takes place over two consecutive weekends in April. Spring Turkey Hunting Dates- Start Date: April 23, 2025- End Date: May 11, 2025Youth Season (April 19 and 20, 2025) For more information on spring turkey hunting dates & regulations in Indiana, visit the official website.Youth hunters in Indiana can harvest only one bearded or male wild turkey during both the spring and fall seasons. The youth turkey season is not designated for the fall, but they are allowed to hunt alongside regular hunters. The fall turkey season runs from October 1-26, 2025, with a bag limit of one bird per hunter.In select counties, the fall firearms season takes place from October 15-26, 2025, while archery hunting is allowed statewide during both seasons. Hunters must wear hunter orange when deer muzzleloader season overlaps.To hunt in either season, youth hunters need a valid license and Game Bird Habitat stamp privilege, except for those with lifetime comprehensive licenses. A separate turkey hunting license is required for the fall season.Youth Season Information for Harvesting Turkeys in Indiana--Turkeys can be hunted with a .410 caliber shotgun loaded with pellets of size No. 4, 5, 6, 7 or 7, or with Tungsten Super Shot.8,9 and 10.Bow and arrow hunters must follow specific hours, from one-half hour before sunrise to sunset.A temporary transportation tag on paper is required immediately after killing a turkey, stating the hunter's full name, address, sex of the turkey, license number (if applicable), and date taken. Hunters must register their harvested turkey within 48 hours using self-reporting online through CheckIN Game system or calling 800-419-1326.Fatal Turkey Hunting Accidents Rare, Mostly Involving Experienced HuntersEvery year, a few Hoosier turkey hunters are injured in shooting accidents during hunting season. However, most incidents involve experienced hunters who accidentally fire at their own companions or fail to properly identify the target.Most shootings occur at close range, typically between 11-50 yards. Two-thirds of all incidents take place on private land, where the majority of shooters involved were around 45 years old with extensive hunting experience.Turkey hunting safety is a top priority for hunters in Indiana. Reviewing and following established safety rules can help prevent accidents. The Division of Fish & Wildlife offers several safety guidelines to ensure responsible hunting practices.Safety Tips for Turkey Hunting Include:* Choosing a safe calling position* Using warning signals when approaching other hunters* Avoiding distractions like social media* Respecting private property and secure permission before huntingIndiana's spring wild turkey season typically runs from April 23 through May 11, with bag limits of one bearded or male turkey per hunter. Hunters are encouraged to review the safety rules and regulations before heading out on their hunt.To hunt turkey in some properties, follow these steps:Find your desired property and navigate to the "Hunting" section under Popular Activities.Review spring turkey season details, which typically open on the first Wednesday after April 20 and last for 18 days.Youth season usually occurs the weekend before spring season opens and is April 19-20, 2025.During youth season, hunters aged 17 or younger must be accompanied by an adult over 18 who has a valid hunting license.Fall turkey season in Indiana runs from Oct.1-26, 2025, to Dec.6, 2025-Jan.4, 2026, with bag and possession limit of one bird.Hunter orange is required during deer muzzleloader season overlap, Dec.6-21, 2025.A spring turkey hunting license and Game Bird Habitat stamp are necessary for spring season, while a separate fall license is required for the fall season.Comprehensive licenses allow some individuals to hunt in both seasons without additional fees.Check the required licenses with Indiana's licensing tool.Deer season in October kicks off the excitement. This is followed by the commencement of firearms deer season in November. The adventure doesn't stop there; small game opportunities like pheasant and bobwhite quail hunting continue. Upland birds like roosters can be hunted from November 1 to December 15, while migratory birds have specific regulations.Remember to follow deer regulations, which include obtaining a standard license for one deer, respecting nature by not using snares or bait, and reporting your harvest within two days. For waterfowl and migratory regulations, note the requirements for state and federal licenses, as well as the rules for boats and shotguns.General hunting restrictions apply to certain activities like live decoys, aircraft use, and shotgun plug requirements.The guidelines for hunting and trapping in Indiana cover a range of activities including furbearer, reptiles, amphibians, and wild turkey.
