Our building is located in southeast Lincoln, Nebraska, near 27th and Old Cheney. Whether worshiping in the sanctuary, the familyfriendly Hearth Room, or via livestream, everyone can find a space that fits their needs. A nursery is available for little ones up to age 3 during both the service and Sunday school, and our Safety & Security Team works guietly behind the scenes to ensure a welcoming and secure experience for all who attend. We're eager to meet new families, serve our city, and follow the Spirit's lead into new seasons of ministry. As we prepare to welcome our next Senior Pastor, our heart is to be a church that lives out our calling to be "Transformed by Grace, Poured Out for Others."






Which two qualities do you consider most important in a Senior Pastor?

The Past

Two Stories One Mission

A legacy of God's faithfulness, shaped by the merger of two congregations united by a common mission.

The Past

Our History

Zion Church (PCA) is the fruit of God's faithfulness over generations, shaped through the merging of two distinct yet missionally aligned congregations. In 1997, the former Zion Congregational Church (ZCC) and Covenant Presbyterian Church (CPC) came together with a shared desire to know Christ deeply and make Him known throughout Lincoln, Nebraska.

Zion Congregational Church began in 1900, founded by German-Russian immigrants who established a gospel presence in Lincoln's south and north bottoms neighborhoods. Services were conducted in German well into the 1950s, reflecting the community's cultural heritage and deep roots of faith.

Covenant Presbyterian Church was birthed in 1966 by a group in Firth, NE, seeking strong biblical teaching and Christ-centered fellowship. After a season of mobile worship and prayerful growth, CPC joined the Presbyterian Church in America (PCA) in 1979. Under the leadership of Pastor Marlin Wismer and Assistant Pastor Hugh Bartlett, CPC flourished and eventually moved into a larger facility at 40th and Sheridan in Lincoln.

As CPC was experiencing vibrant growth, ZCC was sensing the need for a new chapter. Through God's providence, these two churches were brought together – uniting people, stories, and mission into the body now known as Zion Church.



A Church Committed to Reaching the City

From the beginning, church planting and gospel expansion have been embedded in Zion's DNA. After the merger, Zion worshipped at the historic 9th and D location and planted a daughter church at 40th and Sheridan. That congregation, now known as Grace Chapel, is flourishing under the leadership of Pastor Ben Loos.

Zion Church

In 2008, Zion planted Redeemer PCA in the north bottoms – extending the reach of the gospel to a different part of the city. Today, the four churches – Zion, Grace Chapel, Redeemer, and Center Church – gather annually for a "Unity for the Community" worship service, celebrating their shared mission and exploring future church planting opportunities together. Center Church is the most recent plant in Lincoln.

At Zion, we believe that multiplying healthy churches is one of the most effective ways to impact people with the hope of Christ and to foster vibrant, relational communities across the city.

Crisis, Resilience, and Renewal

Zion's story – like many of our own – includes moments of hardship and the unmistakable comfort of God's presence. In 2007, a devastating fire destroyed the church's downtown facility. Yet, from that loss came renewed purpose. The Redeemer congregation was born, and Zion relocated to Lincoln's Southwood neighborhood, embracing a new mission field.

In a beautiful display of God's continued care, the church later undertook a building expansion – only to experience another fire shortly after its completion. Even then, God provided. The Zion community worshipped creatively, stayed connected, and emerged stronger, more unified, and more committed than ever to their gospel calling.

Looking Ahead with Gospel Hope

Zion's heartbeat is captured in our church motto: "Transformed by Grace, Poured Out for Others."

We believe the grace of God not only changes lives – it compels us to serve our city, plant more churches, and disciple people through every season of life and faith. We desire to remain faithful to the Great Commission and to reach the hurting and the hopeful alike with the truth of God's Word.

One special symbol of our enduring mission came in the form of a time capsule discovered after the fire at the 9th and D location. Placed there in 1927 by the leaders of ZCC, it held this beautiful message:

"Since the beginning, the congregation has found peace in Jesus Christ, their Redeemer... As fathers and brothers in Christ, we wish for our descendants that they will follow Christ's calling and the teachings of Jesus. His blood cleanses us from all sins. Till we meet in the eternal Zion."

That's the legacy we stand on – and the vision we're moving toward. We're praying for a Senior Pastor who will join us in shaping the next chapter of Lincoln.

Lincoln, Nebraska, offers a unique blend of Midwestern warmth, vibrant city life, and strong community values – making it an ideal place for a family to thrive.

In Lincoln, you'll find not just a congregation to lead, but a city that welcomes you with open arms and space to plant deep roots.

Lincoln is the capital city of Nebraska and the second-most populous city in the state after Omaha. Lincoln is home to the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, which gives it a strong college-town atmosphere, full of vibrant sports culture and innovative energy.

Lincoln is located in the southeastern part of the state, and as the capital city, serves as a political, educational, and cultural hub of the midwestern region.

Lincoln blends urban amenities with a small-town rhythm and offers a high quality of life, low cost of living (6.4% below the national average) and a strong sense of community. Its economy is diverse, driven by government, education, healthcare, manufacturing, and tech sectors. In 2024, Lincoln was ranked by Niche in the Top 24 Best Cities to Buy a House, and according to Livability, is considered #9 of the Top 100 Places To Live in the U.S. The city is known for its safe and family-oriented environment, and bike riders or runners will find 130 miles of trail routes and beautiful parks throughout all of its neighborhoods.

Lincoln is a refugee resettlement site and diverse community hub at the center of the United States, which promotes a welcoming atmosphere in the city and gives 340,000 people a place to call home. Long-time Lincolnites won't hesitate to make space for strangers on the street or time to talk to anyone about anything, even in the middle of a busy work day. These Lincoln natives are also the ones to invite you to family potlucks, cornhole tournaments, pickleball outings and football games – no matter who you are or where you come from.

The city also invites exploration at every age and is home of the Lincoln Children's Zoo, Lincoln Children's Museum and a number of public and private pools. With over 40 public elementary schools, 12 public middle schools, 8 public high schools and a variety of private hybrid options available, Lincoln has something to fulfill the needs of each and every family. The city is also marked by cozy, locally-owned coffee shops, such as The Mill or Crescent Moon, for study, the beautiful Sunken Gardens, and a lively performing arts community that attracts Broadway actors and talented international musicians to the Lied Center every year.

Overall, Lincoln is recognized for its "real" and friendly residents, safety, and steady growth, making it an attractive place to live, work, and visit in the Midwest.

Compensation

The total compensation package ranges from \$120,000 to \$150,000, commensurate with the candidate's education and experience. The package includes salary, housing allowance, benefits, and applicable taxes. The final structure of the compensation will be customizable based on the candidate's preferences within approved guidelines. In addition, the position includes paid time off, study leave, and access to a sabbatical policy, in alignment with church personnel policies.



Frequently Asked Questions

1. What are the unspoken expectations for the pastor's wife?

The role of the Senior Pastor's wife is not defined by specific expectations, but by the same invitation extended to every member of Zion Church – to be a faithful, engaged part of the body. We desire to see her love God's church and support her husband as the Senior Pastor, while feeling the freedom to participate in the life of the church as the Lord leads. We deeply value the unique gifts the Holy Spirit has given her and desire to see her flourish in whatever way God calls her to serve.

2. Is the Church meeting its budget?

Zion's giving in the first half of 2025 was \$385,000, with expenses totaling \$410,000. While that represents a shortfall year-to-date, it's not unusual – giving tends to fluctuate throughout the year, with some larger gifts coming in at different times, and December historically being a strong month. We also have healthy unrestricted reserves of \$260,000, and we're currently underspending the budget in a careful, intentional way. Overall, the church is in a solid financial position. While we want to be honest and transparent about where things stand, we also want to avoid overstating concern based on a partial-year snapshot.

3. Is there a Sabbatical policy?


Yes. The Senior Pastor receives a 3-month Sabbatical every 7 years.

4. In what ways is the leadership team attuned to the spiritual, relational, and organizational realities within the church?

The pastoral staff, elders, and deacons are aware that our church has both meaningful strengths and areas where growth is needed. We've listened carefully through congregational surveys, a recent town hall, and honest feedback from members, staff, and former staff. While not everything has been easy to hear, we are committed to facing the truth with humility, learning from it, and leading with integrity.

5. Why was an Interim Senior Pastor hired?

Rev. Dr. Tim Kirk was hired shortly after the former Senior Pastor left Zion Church to ensure the continuity of leadership, to guide the church through their transition period, to provide an objective voice, and to support the incremental changes needed to prepare Zion Church for a new Senior Pastor.
