Given article text here Kangana Ranaut talks about leaked viral video Chandigarh University video leak incident: Sonu Sood urges people to act responsibly saying, "These are testing times for us, not for the victims' Shahid Kapoor's 'Shandaar' leaked video Rumors of celebrity scandals and leaked intimate content circulated on social media. Riya Sen's alleged MMS with Ashmit Patel sparked discussion, while Preeti Jain faced controversy after a video surfaced involving her. Mona Singh denied an explicit video circulated online, taking legal action against the perpetrators. Private pictures of Hansika Motwani were leaked, causing significant controversy, which she later attributed to a phone hack. Trisha Krishnan and Anjali Arora also faced scandals involving MMS clips, while Akshara Haasan's intimate pictures were leaked, leading to a police case. Sanjana Singh denied a video claiming to feature her was fake, and Mallika Sherawat dismissed rumors of an MMS featuring her as impersonation. According to the alleged account, the student in question was speaking with one Mohit, who requested her to remove pictures and videos from her mobile device. The accused girl supposedly replied that she had to delete a photo of another student taking a bath after discovering it was being recorded. It has also come to light that Sunny Mehta and his friend Rankaj Verma allegedly threatened the woman student, stating they would make private videos of her go viral unless she filmed and shared videos of hostel inmates in the common washroom. The police have seized three mobile phones from Mehta and his friend for forensic examination, as well as the laptop of the girl student. Following reports that private and objectionable videos of several women hostel inmates were leaked online, massive protests broke out on the Chandigarh University campus. Students claimed nearly 60 girls' bathing videos were leaked, whereas the university stated only one video was circulated. A statement from Chandigarh University Pro-Chancellor RS Bawa stated that rumors of 60 objectionable MMS being found are false and baseless. An FIR has been registered against the accused under Section 354-C (voyeurism) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Information Technology (IT) Act, with further investigation ongoing. The recent cases of student suicides have sparked outrage on campus, with a group of girls leading a protest for justice. One girl secretly recorded videos of her classmates in the hostel bathroom and leaked them online, prompting the university administration to try and suppress the protest. The students claim that the administration is trying to silence them. The police have denied claims of suicide attempts and stated that they have not found any other videos except for those sent by the accused girl and her boyfriend. Three people have been arrested in connection with the case, including the accused girl and her boyfriend, as well as a second man who works at a bakery. The university's pro-chancellor has denied all rumors of objectionable videos being shot of other students, calling them "totally false and baseless." The incident highlights ongoing issues with privacy and has sparked widespread outrage on social media using the hashtag #JusticeForCUGirls. Mass protests broke out over the weekend at Chandigarh University in Punjab's Mohali after a video leak scandal emerged. A female student allegedly recorded objectionable videos of her fellow hostel mates, prompting outrage among students. The university administration initially denied any wrongdoing, but later assured students that a fair investigation would be conducted. Following the protests, which continued late into the night on Sunday, Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann ordered an probe into the matter. The police took swift action, arresting one student and two others in connection with the case. A woman student was detained for allegedly recording the objectionable videos, while a 23-year-old man from Shimla's Rohru was also arrested and handed over to the Punjab Police. The Himachal Police detained another individual in connection with the case. Students at the university claimed that the female accused had recorded videos of the girls bathing and then shared them with the male accused, who uploaded the footage online. The protests eventually subsided after the district and university administration assured students that a thorough investigation would be conducted. The incident has sparked widespread outrage, with Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann expressing his distress over the matter. He has ordered a high-level probe into the incident and promised to take stern action against those found guilty. Student Arrested in Chandigarh University Video Leak Case Denies Attempted Suicide A student arrested over a viral video leak at Chandigarh University has denied any involvement in attempted suicide or any other incident. The student's mobile phone was seized for forensic analysis, and an FIR has been filed under the IPC Section 354C (voyeurism) and the IT Act. The police have refuted claims of students attempting suicide after the incident, saying it is a rumor that has been spread. Only one girl fainted during the protests, who was hospitalised and is now stable. Punjab Additional Director General of Police Gurpreet Deo appealed to people not to sensationalise the issue, saying there is a possibility to forensically recover deleted videos from the accused's phone. The incident also led to many parents arriving on campus and taking their children home due to worries about student safety. Politicians across the spectrum have condemned the video leak and assured the students that the culprits will be given the harshest punishment. The AAP chief Arvind Kejriwal has promised strict action against those involved, while Shiv Sena MP Priyanka Chaturvedi and Congress leader Pawan Khera expressed solidarity with the students. A thorough and impartial investigation is required, coupled with a suitable punishment for those found guilty. This approach ensures that justice is served while also providing guidance to others who may be tempted to engage in similar behavior. Input from relevant authorities will be taken into account during the process.
