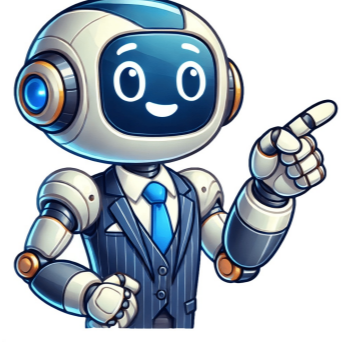

Ballon d'or 2024 2025

The 2024 Ballon d'Or was the 68th annual award ceremony presented by France Football to recognize the best footballers in the world for the 2023-24 season. The event took place on October 28, 2024, at Théâtre du Châtelet in Paris. Rodri won his first Ballon d'Or award, while Aitana Bonmati received her second award as part of Spain's record-breaking win with both men's and women's Ballons d'Or being awarded to players from the same country. For those who played for multiple teams during this period, only their most recent club is listed. Among the nominees for the prestigious Kopa Trophy, ten exceptional young talents were recognized. Ranking the nominees for the 2024 Kopa Trophy, Spain's Lamine Yamal emerged as the top scorer with a total of 113 points, while Arda Güler from Turkey secured second place with an impressive 26 points. Meanwhile, Manchester United's English midfielder Kobbie Mainoo earned third spot with 20 points. In other notable awards, the Yashin Trophy was bestowed upon ten exceptional goalkeepers for their outstanding performances in the 2023-24 season. The Gerd Müller Trophy also recognized the top scorers of the 2023-24 season, with Harry Kane from England and Kylian Mbappé from France sharing the top spot with an impressive 52 goals each. Furthermore, Jenni Hermoso won the Sócrates Award for her remarkable work in bringing awareness to sexual abuse, particularly after a distressing incident involving then-Spanish Federation President Luis Rubiales. She also received recognition as one of the top players in the women's game. Additionally, Real Madrid took home the Men's Club of the Year award with seven Ballon d'Or winners on their roster. The team boasted an impressive lineup featuring Jude Bellingham, Dani Carvajal, Antonio Rüdiger, Federico Valverde, Vinicius Jr., and Toni Kroos. In women's football, Barcelona claimed the top spot as the Women's Club of the Year with six Ballon d'Or winners. The team consisted of talented players like Aitana Bonmati, Salma Paralluelo, Caroline Graham Hansen, Patricia Guijarro, Lucy Bronze, and Alexia Putellas. Six coaches were also recognized for their exceptional work in the 2023-24 season through the Men's Johan Cruyff Trophy. Carlo Ancelotti from Italy emerged as the top coach with a total of 118 points, followed closely by Xabi Alonso from Spain and Luis de la Fuente from Spain. Lastly, six coaches were also nominated for the Women's Johan Cruyff Trophy. Emma Hayes from England took home the top spot with 72 points, followed by Jonatan Giráldez from Spain and Arthur Elias from Brazil in second and third place, respectively. Real Madrid boycotted the Ballon d'Or ceremony in protest over Vinicius Júnior not receiving the Men's Johan Cruyff Trophy, which they believed he deserved. Previous reports from reputable sources, such as Marca and ESPN FC, had indicated that Vinicius would be a strong contender for the award. The absence of Real Madrid's manager Carlo Ancelotti and other top players was confirmed by journalist Fabrizio Romano on Twitter. This decision came after the nominees for the Ballon d'Or were announced in September 2024, and Vinicius had not made it to the final list. This marks a new era in the award, as Lionel Messi and Cristiano Ronaldo are no longer part of the competition. Vinicius Jr faces long wait to win Ballon d'Or after another season with Real Madrid Vinicius Jr may have to wait a few more years before winning the first Brazilian to claim the prestigious trophy. The winger was caught off guard by not winning the award, despite being favourite on the day of the gala. His side's premature exit from the Champions League will likely cost him the throne again. Meanwhile, Robert Lewandowski is back in contention after a resurgence at Barcelona. The Polish frontman is chasing the Ballon d'Or title he was robbed of in 2020 and has plundered 40 goals and three assists this season. However, recent injuries may have hurt his chances and being knocked out by Inter Milan could also cost him. Harry Kane's appointment with Bayern Munich has given him a massive boost after disappointments with both club and country over the last year. The Tottenham Hotspur forward is widely regarded as one of England's greatest-ever forwards and will be looking to bring domestic trophies to the Allianz Arena. Despite this, Mbappe's recent form suggests he's well-equipped to become the main man at the Bernabeu. The only issue is that he may not win it all if Los Blancos exit Europe. Salah, meanwhile, continues to defy expectations despite his age and a new manager. His remarkable goal contributions in 49 games across all competitions make him a strong contender for the 2025 Ballon d'Or award. However, Liverpool's Champions League exit dampens his chances, as does a recent lapse in form. Lamine Yamal still has time to achieve the historic feat of winning the award at 16. The Ballon d'Or award has been dominated by legendary players since its inception in 1956. This year's contender is Lamine Yamal, who at just 15 years old helped his country win the European Championship and became the manager of Hansi Flick's favorite player in world football. As he approaches this milestone, many are wondering if he can maintain his form throughout the year. Yamal has already broken several records, but can he do it again? He has caught the eye of many while on the books at Borussia Dortmund, failed to pull up trees at Barcelona - but his switch from Spain to Paris Saint-Germain has paid dividends. The Ballon d'Or is an annual award given to the best soccer player in Europe. It was first presented in 1956 and has been awarded to players from all over the world since 2007. The winner of the Ballon d'Or is determined by a vote of football journalists, with the current holder being Rodri. The award has been won by many legendary players, including Lionel Messi, Cristiano Ronaldo, and Johan Cruyff, each winning it multiple times. The Ballon d'Or has undergone significant changes since its inception as a European award. Initially identified with it was the name due to its origin in Europe. Lionel Messi holds the record for most wins with eight, while five-time winner Ronaldo has received the most nominations. The award has become a global prize, allowing players from clubs around the world to participate. The Ballon d'Or award, which is owned by France Football, was postponed for 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic's impact on football. Many people think Robert Lewandowski deserved the award that year. In 2022, France Football changed the rules so now the awards are given for a football season rather than just one calendar year. The winner is chosen by an international jury of journalists from top countries, with a system that was previously open to all countries since 2007. Since 2024, UEFA co-organizes the award's gala, while France Football handles voting. The Ballon d'Or is decided based on three main criteria: individual performance, team success, and class and fair play. However, some critics call it a popularity contest and criticise its voting process. Lionel Messi won the most awards with eight wins, while Cristiano Ronaldo has been nominated eighteen times and won five. These additional awards aim to recognize and celebrate the achievements of soccer players in various categories. Pelé Named Football Player of the Century in 1999 France Football Awarded Super Ballon d'Or to Di Stéfano and Maradona The Ballon d'Or Dream Team was announced by France Football in December 2020, featuring football's greatest players of all time. The team consists of Lev Yashin as goalkeeper and a defence comprising Cafu, Franz Beckenbauer, Paolo Maldini, and Xavi. Lothar Matthäus and Diego Maradona are midfielders, while Pelé, Lionel Messi, Ronaldo, and Cristiano Ronaldo form the forward line. A second team features Gianluigi Buffon, Carlos Alberto, Franco Baresi, Roberto Carlos, Andrea Pirlo, Frank Rijkaard, Zinedine Zidane, Alfredo Di Stéfano, and Ronaldinho, among others. The third team includes Manuel Neuer, Philipp Lahm, Sergio Ramos, Paul Breitner, Johan Neeskens, Didi, Michel Platini, Andrés Iniesta, George Best, Marco van Basten, and Thierry Henry. The 1990s Ballon d'Or winners were announced in 2008 by BBC Sport, with some sources also providing information on the award from 2023. NBC Sports reported that Lionel Messi won his eighth Ballon d'Or in 2023, while ESPN ranked all the Ballon d'Or winners since the Champions League era began. Other news outlets, including The Athletic and Le Parisien, provided detailed coverage of Messi's historic achievement. The International Olympic Committee also released a list of all Ballon d'Or winners, while Victor Mather wrote about Messi's latest win for The New York Times. Felipe Cardenas explained why Inter Miami's Lionel Messi won the award and what it meant for Major League Soccer (MLS). Other articles discussed Cristiano Ronaldo's past wins and the top leagues that have produced the most Ballon d'Or winners. Finally, FIFA announced the creation of the FIFA Ballon d'Or in 2010 and reported on Messi's win as The Best FIFA Men's Player 2023. Lionel Messi has won numerous awards throughout his career, including the Best FIFA Men's Player award in 2019 and multiple Ballon d'Or awards prior to that. He was also recognized by FIFA as the leading player in the men's game five times before winning the award in 2022, bringing his total number of individual awards to eight. The origins of the Ballon d'Or award are tied to UEFA, which partners with Groupe Amaury to co-organize the ceremony. The award was initially introduced in 1995 and has since become one of the most prestigious honors in football. Over the years, there have been debates about the selection process for the Ballon d'Or, with some critics arguing that it is flawed and favors individual awards over team success. Robert Lewandowski was seen as a worthy winner in 2020, but ultimately did not receive the award. In recent years, Messi has continued to dominate the sport, winning numerous titles and breaking records. His eighth Ballon d'Or win in 2022 marked a milestone in his career, solidifying his status as one of the greatest footballers of all time. Ballon d'Or winner Ada Hegerberg has not played in the Women's World Cup. The Ballon d'Or is an annual award that recognizes the best footballer in France Football, a French sports magazine.
