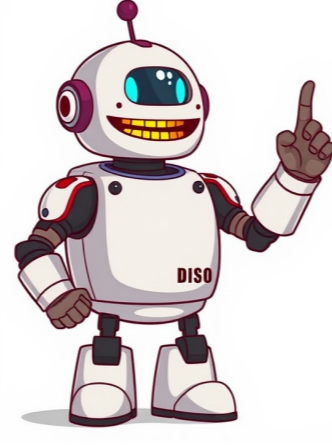

The distribution and marketing of fuel products, the company offers a variety of services and products at its service stations, including gasoline, convenience store items, car wash services, car care services, vehicle inspection services, oil change services, and property leasing and management.[5] ADNOC Distribution's fuel station network also includes ADNOC Oasis, a chain of over 300 convenience stores, providing a variety of food, beverage, and convenience items.[6][7] The company operates in the UAE, Saudi Arabia, and Egypt.[4][8] Abu Dhabi National Oil Company (ADNOC) is the parent company and the largest shareholder of ADNOC Distribution.[9] As of August 2024, ADNOC Distribution is the largest fuel and convenience retailer in the UAE.[10] ADNOC Distribution was established by a royal decree, becoming the UAE's first state-owned enterprise specializing in the marketing and distribution of fuel products within the UAE and abroad. In 1979, ADNOC Distribution expanded its operations by establishing a lubricant blending and packaging facility in Sas Al Nakhl, Abu Dhabi.[11] In 2013, ADNOC Distribution acquired 75 service stations from Emarat in the Northern Emirates of the UAE. The following year, the company took over 25 service stations in Sharjah, previously operated by Emirates National Oil Company (ENOC).[11] On 13 December 2017, ADNOC Distribution was listed on the Abu Dhabi Stock Exchange (ADX) under the symbol ADNOCDIST. The initial public offering (IPO) was priced at AED 2.50 per share, with the company selling 1.25 billion shares, representing 10% of its share capital.[12][13] In May 2021, ADNOC Distribution announced that it was included in the Morgan Stanley Capital International (MSCI) Emerging Markets Index.[14] In December 2018, ADNOC Distribution inaugurated its first service station in Saudi Arabia on the Riyadh-Dammam highway, approximately 40ADNOC Distribution has been expanding its presence across Saudi Arabia and Egypt, with a focus on acquiring service stations and integrating new technologies into its services. ===== In December 2020, the company secured an agreement to purchase additional service stations in Saudi Arabia for AED 36.7 million (US\$10 million), further solidifying its growth in the region.[15] This was soon followed by the opening of a second station in Hofuf, located within the Al Baha Governorate.[15] In 2023, ADNOC Distribution launched nine new service stations across the country, demonstrating its commitment to expanding its retail network.[18] The company also entered into an agreement with India's Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Limited (HPCL) to expand their respective lubricants and products businesses in the UAE and India.[19] In June 2023, ADNOC Distribution collaborated with the Abu Dhabi Police to launch the ADNOC Mobile Vehicle Inspection Centre in Abu Dhabi.[20] The same year, the company announced plans to start blending its ADNOC Voyager lubricants in Egypt, positioning the country as a regional export hub.[25] ADNOC Distribution operates in two primary segments: fuel and non-fuel retail, offering services that encompass fuel retail, aviation fueling, car services, lubricants, and convenience stores.[5] The company manages and leases retail space within its service stations, leasing it to tenants such as restaurants, banks, and automobile insurance providers.[26][27] As of 2024, ADNOC Distribution operates over 800 service stations across the UAE, Saudi Arabia, and Egypt, with a presence in major brands such as McDonald's, Starbucks, KFC, and Burger King.[28] The company has expanded its electric vehicle (EV) charging network to more than 100 points and opened a pioneering Mobility Hub with fast and superfast charging points.[31] ADNOC Distribution has integrated artificial intelligence (AI) and digital technology into its services, including Fill & Go, Click & Collect, car wash tunnels, and automated check-out counters. The company uses pre-registered information in the ADNOC Distribution app to allow users to refuel their cars without manually initiating the transaction at the pump.[32]ADNOC Distribution unveiled a novel approach utilizing intelligence and computer vision to automate refueling by leveraging pre-registered information from its ADNOC Distribution app for seamless transactions.[37] Furthermore, the company announced plans for an autonomous electric vehicle charging robotic arm set to launch in October 2024.[38] By focusing on twenty AI-powered projects aimed at enhancing operational efficiencies, ADNOC Distribution successfully reported a substantial EBITDA of US\$790 million and net profit of US\$501 million during the first nine months of 2024.[40] This significant increase in net profit was largely attributed to an estimated USD 187 million growth, excluding UAE corporate tax. The company's free cash flow stood at USD 488 million in H1 2024, with a projected dividend of USD 700 million for the year.[41][42] ADNOC Distribution achieved notable OPEX savings of USD 10 million through like-for-like reductions and committed to investing between USD 250-300 million in CAPEX to support growth strategies. [42] In March 2024, the company secured a five-year dividend policy allowing for an annual dividend payment of USD 700 million or at least 75% of net profit, as determined by the Annual General Meeting.[43] Following this, ADNOC Distribution successfully redeemed its USD dollar-denominated senior unsecured bonds in exchangeable bonds, marking a significant milestone in the company's debt restructuring efforts.[44] The appointment of Eng. Bader Saeed Al Lamki as CEO and Wayne Beifus as CFO has been instrumental in shaping the company's strategic direction. Notably, Wayne Beifus stepped down as CFO in December 2024, with Ali Siddiqi assuming Acting CFO duties. ADNOC Distribution welcomed Klas Mantel as its new Chief Operating Officer in September 2023, bringing extensive experience from over 25 years in the energy sector, including senior roles at Shell and McKinsey & Company.[47] The Board of Directors comprises prominent figures such as H.E. Dr. Sultan Ahmed Al Jaber and H.E. Ahmed Jassim AlZaabi. Major shareholders include notable institutions like Emirate of Abu Dhabi, Pictet Asset Management, and Goldman Sachs Asset Management BV. By further expanding its services, ADNOC Distribution introduced new mobility solutions, including an LPG delivery service featuring 30 additional trucks in Abu Dhabi. The company's mobile app enables customers to track orders and redeem rewards with every purchase.
