However, I've encountered some issues with quality control, particularly with the build quality and hardware performance. Setting up the device was relatively smooth, except for the lack of pre-installed Kodi, which I expected to be included given its popularity as an IPTV and media center app. I had to manually install the Simple IPTV plugin and hunt for channels, which was a bit frustrating. Although the plugin didn't seem to optimize the GPU properly, I found another IPTV app that worked just fine. Unfortunately, the device also suffered from overheating issues, with the CPU dropping out multiple times when maxed out. This might be due to the poor design of the box, which lacks heat sinks and has inadequate ventilation holes. Using a cheap USB fan helped alleviate this issue. In terms of performance, the quad-core CPU is clocked at 1488MHz, and while it's decent for its size, I wouldn't expect too much in terms of gaming capabilities. The device also came with a broken WIFI adapter and lacked Bluetooth support, which are essential features to consider. Despite these drawbacks, the T95 Max Android TV box still offers good value for money. However, I would not recommend it as a first choice due to its numerous flaws.
