- Jay Brown, Community Education Council District 21 and president (and Seth Low alum)
- Mr. Brown gave thanks to Seth Low for providing CEC D21 office space for years before moving out 2023
- Principal Herruso invited Mr. Brown to visit the school and how it's changed over the years since he attended
- -Mr. Peterson will give presentation later on vaping/drug use

Approval of October 17, 2023 Minutes:

- October 17 Meeting Minutes were dropped in the chat during the meeting and posted on PTA section of Seth Low website after.
- Minutes reviewed and approved by the general membership.

President's Report

- Old Business
 - 6th grade movie night was first in-school PTA event for students since March 2020
 - Surveys for students to choose movie for night were shared with students via paper
 - Majority of students chose "Spider-Man: Into the Spider-verse"
 - President shared flyer with permission slips and final attendance count 118 students plus 30-40 parents who accompanied their children (approx 45% of entire class)
 - Shared short photo/video slide presentation of event
 - Discussed future plans for 7th and 8th grade movie nights and possible parent-only events
 - Gave thanks to Ms Morales, Ms Thomas, school safety staff, school custodian, Beacon staff Mr. Ryan for donating pizza pies for all attendees
 - Invited volunteers to sign up via form dropped in chat for future events such as 7th and 8th grade movie nights
 - High school admissions links and open houses information dropped in the chat
 - Reminder about DOE-issued EBT cards with Summer Rising students of \$120 per student (link dropped in chat)
 - Reminder about school lunch forms (links dropped in the chat)

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- Upcoming calendar with important dates for school closing/holidays shared (link dropped in chat)
 - Mrs Herruso will share dates for professional development days PROSE school with 6 approved ½ days
- Upcoming calendar with important dates for tests shared (link dropped in chat)
- Reviewed parent leader chart for how to get more involved as a parent, including CEC D21 meeting coming up
- CEC D21 new location at Lafayette Educational Complex and shared newsletter (link in chat)
 - Mr. Brown shared that District office staff is at William E. Grady CTE High School
 - 4 Citywide Education Councils for areas of focus
- Shared information (link in chat) about upcoming Emergency Remote Instruction Plan invitation for public comment and how it would impact days like the flood when Seth Low Park was inundated with rain and students had to come in anyway.
 - Mr. Brown elaborated on meeting with Chancellor about recommendations for how to pivot to remote
 - Mrs. Herruso added that timing of the storm adds another layer for contingency planning re 2" of rain in an hour just as students were arriving at 7:50 (but not bad at 7:30 a.m.)
 - Seth Low first floor was under water,
 - Mr. Brown said schools lost use of cafeteria and refrigerators so no hot food provided during that rain emergency
 - Mr. Brown said CEC D21 is meeting with Chancellor again 11/30 virtually to continue conversation
 - President thanked Mr. Brown for being an advocate for Seth Low and all schools in the district

- Sizable donations from membership and teachers \$112

- Mr. Pirozzi reviewed fundraising activity reports for parents to understand profit, including \$23 profit from 6th grade movie night but ROI will be good because expenditures for movie nights (decorations and snacks/drinks) will be used for future movie nights so we should be able to collect more revenue (3 cases of water with 72 bottles in each and 4 boxes of Oreos with 30 snack packs in each)

- Ideally we want to be in a good financial position at the end of the year and not have to worry about budget restrictions

- Anti-bullying, anti-drug themes are being built into our school programming

May 24th

- Introduced Elijah Peterson, SAPIS (Substance Abuse and Prevention and Intervention Specialist) as guest speaker



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Guest Speaker: SAPIS counselor at Seth Low Elijah Peterson

- Has been in role 13 years and is SAPIS counselor at Seth Low and Caballero in Coney Island
- Too Good for Drugs, pair with Ms. Dockery in media class to role play with 7th graders
- Provides range of crisis intervention re drugs and mental health
- Discussion of students abusing edibles at school, being careful to watch body language to detect crisis
- FindTreatment.org posted in chat as resource to show nearby facilities for suicide, substance abuse, mental health
- Evidence-based curriculums such as Too Good for Drugs, Teen Intervene, Peer Leadership, focus is finding the positive in each case and letting students be heard
- Students want to be heard and when they're not and feel alone, they resort to drugs
- Goal is to direct their attention to something positive before they resort to drugs
- Drug abuse is now getting more common among middle school, increased 4% this year (high school #s decreased)
- Spread love and awareness
- "Good Brother" program based in Coney Island for children in need of a mentor do talks, give free haircuts, Thanksgiving drive, Christmas toy drive
- Principal Herruso stressed importance of having an open dialogue at school and at home to stay connected with educators, counselors and parents plus being aware that many drugs now look just like candy (edibles i.e. gummies) and candy-flavored vaping
- Ms Smith leads program, Ms Dockery and Mr. Peterson and Ms Shana collaborate on individual programs
- Ms Smith shared that we still don't know long-term damage of vaping so need to be extra vigilant
- President shared how 1 vaping container is equivalent of 2 packs of cigarettes
- "I'd Rather Buy" hashtag for students to think about what else they could buy instead of vaping pens/drugs

Committee Reports

- President suggested perhaps parent volunteers can also engage as advocates in the community to get new vaping
- Link to Google form for committee sign-ups for parent volunteers shared in chat
- Shared membership survey and thanked members for donations sent in via envelope

Article VI - Meetings Section 1. General Membership Meetings

The general membership meetings of the association shall be held on the ___4th3rd___, __Tuesday __ of each month from September through June, unless such day falls on a legal or religious holiday. The virtual meetings shall be held at _6:00pm virtually. The hybrid alternate menths meetings shall be held at either __9:00am __ or _6:00pm_. In such instances, the meeting shall be held on the following or previous __ Tuesday __ as determined by the executive beard. Written notice of each membership meeting shall be distributed in all applicable languages, where possible. A ten-calendar day notice shall be required prior to the scheduled meeting.

The meeting date may be moved to the previous or following week to coincide with a school function to maximize attendance with memberships prior approval. The date of distribution shall appear on all notices.

At the beginning of every school year, the executive board must survey the parent members to determine the day, time, location, and format (in-person, virtual, or hybrid) for the monthly general membership meeting.
