- Example ideas:
  - o Contemporary routine to "Rise Up" by Andra Day
  - o Hip-hop routine to a clean track like "Uptown Funk" (Bruno Mars)
  - o Jazz/Musical Theater routine to "America" (West Side Story)
- Keep it short, focused, and **end with a strong pose**.

# Acting (Monologues/Scenes)

- 1–2 minute **monologue** from a play or age-appropriate movie.
- Example pieces:
  - o "Charlie and the Chocolate Factory" Charlie's hopeful speech
  - o "The Wizard of Oz" Dorothy's "There's no place like home" speech
  - o Matilda (Roald Dahl adaptation) Matilda's defiant monologue
- Focus on clear voice, strong character choices, and expression.

# Poetry / Spoken Word

- Perform an original poem or a short excerpt (8–16 lines) of a published piece.
- Example pieces:
  - Maya Angelou "Still I Rise" (excerpt)
  - Shel Silverstein playful poems for younger groups
  - o Original spoken-word poem on identity, friendship, or resilience

### **Sports Demonstration**

- Short (1–2 minutes) display of skill.
- Example ideas:
  - Basketball trick dribbling routine

- o Soccer juggling sequence with controlled moves
- o Gymnastics/tumbling pass (safe and floor-friendly)
- Focus on control, flair, and creativity rather than length.

### **Instrumentals**

- 1–2 minute excerpt of a piece (classical, jazz, or contemporary).
- Example pieces:
  - o Piano: Beethoven's Für Elise (first section)
  - o Guitar: Blackbird (The Beatles) excerpt
  - o Violin: Theme from *The Lion King* or *Canon in D* (Pachelbel)
- Students should play a **clear, memorable section** instead of full songs.

# **Magic Tricks**

- Perform 1–2 polished tricks that are visual and clear.
- Example ideas:
  - o Card trick where a chosen card appears on top
  - o Coin vanish/reappearance routine
  - o Rope trick or linking rings (visual, easy to see from stage)
- Encourage **showmanship** and patter along with the trick.
