EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR & BOARD PRESIDENT NOTE

It was another transformational year at Green Action Centre. We welcomed ten new staff members and three new volunteers to the Board of Directors, and we saw success in continuing to implement our new strategic plan by securing multi year funding, expanding our programming, enhancing governance, and increasing leadership diversity.

Green Action Centre's physical office space grew to almost double its size to accommodate the increase in staff over the last few years. Compost Winnipeg also moved to a new location, serving the needs for more office space and an expanding fleet.

The impactful work we are delivering to our communities couldn't happen without a robust internal foundation. We have been working very intentionally on building four key areas. First, enhancing board and staff-led committees while receiving valuable pro-bono expertise on non-profit governance. Second, boosting our financial management with robust procedures and policies. Third, strengthening IT infrastructure and data management, and finally - perhaps most importantly - fortifying the connection between dedicated board members and engaged staff.

Two years ago our focus was on capacity building; this year was about consolidation. We adjusted our focus and work to the current reality in Manitoba. The devastating wildfire season in 2025 was a sad preamble to the launch of our new program, Let's Clear the Air, and a reminder of the importance of our mission to promote greener and better living by sharing practical solutions and advocating for change. We saw a community more eager than ever to volunteer, spurring us to bring back the popular Master Composter training program and expand our outreach capacity. This increased outreach capacity supports the growth of our volunteer network, helps to build collaborative relationships with community organizations and environmental partners, and helps broaden Green Action Centre's reach in education and engagement. This is just one example of how GAC strives to fill critical environmental gaps and expand our reach and impact.

Two great milestones in the same year. This year marks the tenth anniversary of Compost Winnipeg - our social enterprise that provides organic waste and food scrap collection services for homes, apartments, businesses, and offices. We are also celebrating a decade of offering the Bicycle Education and Skills Training program (BEST) - our middle-year student cycling curriculum teaching road safety, hand signals, lane positioning, and bike maintenance. Looking ahead, we are excited to bring back School Streets - an initiative by Green Communities Canada temporarily restricting vehicular traffic in front of schools during morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up times, creating safe, car-free zones for active travel and play.

Present, past and future. Green Action Centre stands on a great foundation that continues to grow year over year, ensuring Manitobans have access to practical, green solutions for sustainable living, tackling climate change, and reducing waste. We look forward to continuing our work and connecting with all of you who are committed to this shared vision of all Manitobans living green, living well!

HIGHLIGHTS

2025 - 2026

- The Waste Reduction team expanded the accessibility of its resources in 2025–26 by translating materials into Arabic, Cree, French, Ojibway, Persian, Tigrinya, Ukrainian, and Urdu, building on resources already available in French, German, Nepali, Punjabi, Swahili, and Tagalog. This work is ongoing, to help ensure diverse communities feel represented, supported, and included in waste reduction initiatives.
- In 2025-26, we worked with 26 First Nations communities across Manitoba. Some of the diversion we supported includes collecting almost 110 lbs of refrigerant, the equivalent of 101.4 tonnes of CO₂. We helped organize the pickup of 7,075 tires and approximately 14.5 tonnes of electronics to get properly recycled. We recycled 920 lead acid batteries and more than 40 tonnes of scrap metal was removed from First Nation communities.
- The Sustainable Transportation team launched "Let's Clear the Air", a three-part workshop series focused on air quality, how it impacts our health and the effects of human activities. Eight school groups participated, where students gained practical skills to make informed decisions during periods of poor air quality and to become active contributors to healthier communities. The program was well-received, and additional workshops are planned for Fall 2026.



POLICY HIGHLIGHTS

2025 - 2026

Waste Reduction staff contributed a policy chapter to the Alternative Municipal Budget (AMB), advocating for the inclusion of multi-family dwellings in Winnipeg's planned curbside organics collection program. The AMB is a proposed budget framework that reimagines how Winnipeg's funds could be allocated to better reflect the principles of social equity, environmental sustainability, and community well-being. The AMB is released every four years in the summer before Winnipeg's fall municipal election, providing a vehicle to champion these policies to electoral candidates.

Delegation at the City of Winnipeg on sustainable transportation items. Delegated in person and in writing around the unsustainable Route 90 expansion, the Wellington Crescent bike lane delays and the latest report for the Chief Peguis Trail expansion, which is also looking increasingly unsustainable.

- Wrote an opinion essay in the Winnipeg Free Press, and delegated to council, around the proposed Stop, Drop and Go motion, and advocated for better strategies to reduce congestion around schools during pick-up and drop-off.
- Wrote additional opinion essay to advocate for improved transit funding as well as rethinking highway expansions.
- Began work with like-minded organizations to advocate to the province for updates to the provincial road safety strategy, which will continue next year.

Peter Miller, who has represented Green Action Centre in interventions and meetings with Manitoba Hydro and Efficiency Manitoba since 2002.

- Represented Green Action Centre on Efficiency Manitoba's Energy Efficiency Advisory Group (EEAG) to comment on its programs and the development of its 2027 to 2030 plan.

- Attended the release of the Government of Manitoba's Path to Net Zero. Submitted two briefs to the Provincial Government and a Winnipeg Free Press op ed on the need for eco-fiscal alignment, legislated net-zero mandates for Manitoba Hydro and Efficiency Manitoba, a monitoring and research program to accompany the heat pump roll-out, and other long-term drivers to get us to net-zero by 2050.
- Attended consultation sessions and submitted two briefs for the development of Manitoba Hydro's 2025 Integrated Resource Plan (IRP). The briefs supported an emphasis on efficiency and heat pump programs, because of their climate and customer benefits in addition to meeting Manitoba Hydro's needs, and identified a need for strategic planning for pathways from gas to clean heat.

Climate Action Team Manitoba (CAT) - Coalition of environmental organizations in Manitoba working together to envision, investigate, and promote a road to climate resilience in our province. Highlights from CAT's policy activities this year include:

- Publication of three major policy reports covering (1) recommendations for the provincial climate plan and budget; (2) why direct air capture is not a solution for Manitoba; and (3) the potential of wind, solar, and energy storage.
- Mobilizing Manitobans through townhalls, letter writing, and community meetings to push for climate investments in the provincial budget, likely influencing the government's decision to support free transit for youth. Organizing a budget press conference with over 30 environmental, labour, and community organizations.
- Convening over 110 climate leaders for a two-day Climate Convergence conference to discuss emerging policy issues and align on strategy.
- Regular meetings with Environment and Climate Change Minister Mike Moyes and top civil servants in the Premier's office and key departments.

WASTE REDUCTION

- Since 2021, Green Action Centre's Newcomer Sustainability Skill Building Project has helped newcomers in Winnipeg build practical skills for low-waste living, navigating the city's waste systems, and using public transit and active transportation safely and confidently. Thanks to continued support from the federal Sustainable Development Goals Funding program, we've reached 239 newcomers in five languages - Arabic, French, Tigrinya, Ukrainian, and Urdu - making sustainability education more accessible, inclusive, and impactful.
- After a five-year hiatus, we successfully brought back our Master Composter Volunteer Training program. Participants gained hands-on composting knowledge through workshops and guest speakers and are now sharing their expertise through community volunteer and education activities.
- The Waste Reduction team engaged 196 students in Winnipeg schools through hands-on sustainability education. We expanded our reach to rural Manitoba, delivering interactive vermicomposting workshops to 80 K-12 students in Sprague. By bringing waste reduction learning beyond the city, we inspired youth to think critically about sustainability and waste reduction in their everyday lives.
- For the second year in a row, the Waste Reduction team partnered with Red River College's Sustainability Office to conduct a campus waste audit—this time at the Exchange District campus. Red River College has been making impressive strides in improving waste diversion, and we're proud to support that work. We rolled up our sleeves, dug into the trash (and data), and identified opportunities to keep even more material out of the landfill.

SUSTAINABLE TRANSPORTATION

- During Bike Everywhere Month, 2,379 students registered to track their kilometres. With support from the Winnipeg Goldeyes Baseball Club, the Loan-a-Lock program returned for the first time since 2019, providing 50 locks to 10 Winnipeg schools, helping remove a barrier to cycling to school and make cycling to school more accessible.
- We celebrated National Clean Air Day with our annual school event, bringing together 362 Winnipeg students. Through interactive activities led by nine partner organizations, students explored how choices like active transportation can reduce air pollution and support healthier communities. Held during Manitoba's wildfire season and a day of poor air quality, the event highlighted the immediate importance of clean air.
- Our Bicycle Education & Skills Training (BEST) program continues to grow. This year marked a major milestone with the Winnipeg School Division joining the program for the first time. BEST now operates across four school divisions, equipping more than 3,000 students annually with the skills, knowledge, and confidence to cycle safely and independently on Winnipeg's streets.
- We had over 1350 people participate in the Commuter Challenge and nearly 450 take on the Jack Frost Challenge. These challenges saw participants log a combined 232,033 kms and divert a whopping 44,326 kg of CO2!
- On February 25th, Green Action Centre hosted a series of talks with guest speaker Todd Litman. Todd Litman is the Executive Director of the Victoria Transportation Policy Institute. His presentations focused on building healthy, vibrant communities in Winnipeg and how a shift in our transportation system can support this goal. We hosted both an afternoon event, with industry professionals, and an evening event for the wider public.

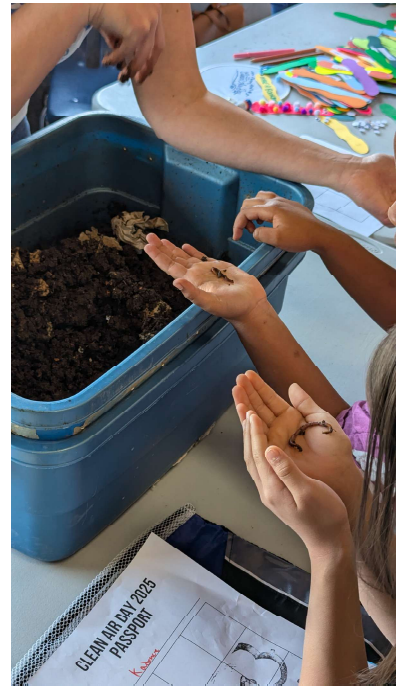

OUR SOCIAL ENTERPRISE

In 2025-26, Compost Winnipeg continued strategic expansion to provide organic waste collection to an increasing number of local businesses and organizations. Highlights include:

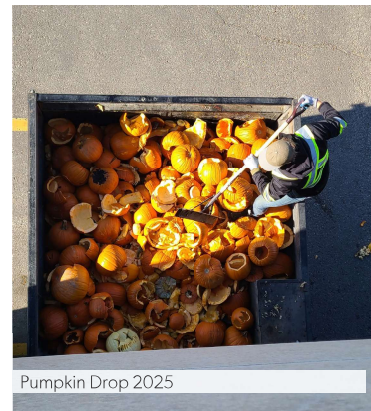
- In July 2025, we purchased our largest truck to date, a medium duty truck with rear compactor. This allows us to expand the community food waste drop off program and expand service to large customers such as grocery stores and food courts.
- In August 2025, we moved into a new shop, with offices, a large yard and room to grow.
- In August 2025, we worked with Folklorama to collect food waste from 9 pavilions, diverting over 2,900 kg of waste from the landfill, and providing education and training to volunteers and attendees.
- In March 2026, Compost Winnipeg surpassed 10,000 tonnes of organic waste collected since starting up in April 2016. This is equivalent to preventing over 20,000 tonnes of carbon dioxide emissions.

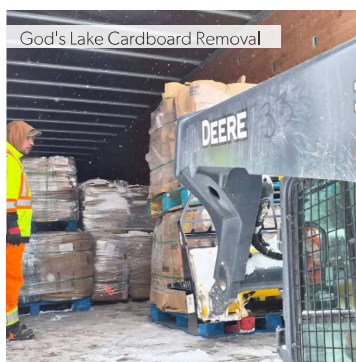
FIRST NATIONS WASTE MINIMIZATION (FNWM)

Our team supports First Nation communities in Manitoba to minimize and divert waste from their community, and enhance the health of the land, air, water, humans, and wildlife.

- The 2025-26 Winter Road Recycling Project represents the seventh year of backhauling materials from winter road communities. In total, 30 semi-trailer loads of material were removed from 9 participating communities, a record number of loads two years in a row.
- In 2025-26, we worked with 26 First Nations communities across Manitoba. Some of the diversion we supported includes:
 - Collected almost 110 lbs of refrigerant, the equivalent of 101.4 tonnes of CO₂.
 - Helped organize the pickup of 7,075 tires
 - Approximately 14.5 tonnes of electronics to get properly recycled
 - 920 lead acid batteries were recycled
 - More than 40 tonnes of scrap metal was removed from First Nation communities
- In October 2025, we hosted the 4th First Nations Waste Coordinator Meet Up. There were 15 participants from 14 First Nation communities in attendance. The agenda for the day included a backhaul presentation, a spill response lesson and activity, and a presentation on community highlights.

Climate Action Team Manitoba

Climate Action Team Manitoba (CAT) is a coalition of environmental organizations in Manitoba working together to envision, investigate, and promote a road to climate resilience in our province. Coalition members include Climate Change Connection, Wilderness Committee – Manitoba Office, Green Action Centre, Manitoba Energy Justice Coalition and Canadian Centre for Policy Alternatives – Manitoba Office.

Our vision is to build a collaborative and resilient zero-carbon society that operates within the constraints of nature. Our mission is to provide a framework for individuals, organizations, and communities to communicate and collaborate on a non-partisan, specific, and actionable path that will help Manitoba achieve resilience to climate impacts and move swiftly toward a fossil-fuel free future.

- **Widening our base:** This year, CAT grew our community of climate-concerned Manitobans and groups. We partnered with a wide range of organizations to give presentations, including schools, community organizations such as Fort Whyte and Trees Please, and town halls in urban and rural areas. We have grown a group of dozens of active volunteers. Our relationships continue to expand outside of Winnipeg, including several recent trips to Brandon, Pipestone, Swan Lake and beyond. We look forward to expanding outreach even further in the upcoming year.
- **Building coalitions and partnerships:** We have invested in growing relationships and capacity in the climate movement, hosting the 2025 Manitoba Climate Convergence with over 100 attendees, and convening strategic coalitions around Budget 2026 and public transit campaign. In partnership with the Amalgamated Transit Union 1505, our public transit campaign launch saw over 240 participants join us at the Manitoba Legislative Assembly grounds to advocate for better transit funding through a reinstatement of the 50-50 funding model.
- **Go-to experts on climate:** CAT continues to grow our reputation as experts on climate and energy in Manitoba, with 83 media mentions, 1800 newsletter subscribers, 42,000 website visits, and 3500 Instagram followers. We are increasingly invited by government Ministers for meetings and events. We published three major reports covering (1) recommendations for the provincial climate plan and budget; (2) why direct air capture is not a solution for Manitoba; and (3) the potential of wind, solar, and energy storage, as well as 22 blogs this year.
