Siem Reap will be your base for the first two weeks, and it's the perfect place to kick off your adventure. This vibrant city is brimming with opportunities for exploration, culture, and immersion in life-changing community projects.

Day 2 Siem Reap Settle in + Explore

Your day kicks off with a visit to one of Siem Reap's iconic floating villages. You'll glide across the serene waters, marvelling at the unique stilted homes and daily life of the local fishing communities.

In the afternoon, you'll head back to town for a guided wander through Siem Reap's bustling streets. You'll explore the vibrant energy of Pub Street, known for its eclectic mix of markets, cafes, and street performers, before taking a more tranquil stroll through the stunning Royal Gardens. The gardens are a peaceful oasis, perfect for soaking in the beauty of Siem Reap's greener side, with its grand trees and colourful blossoms.



Days 3-4 Siem Reap

Water for Cambodia – Transforming Lives

Siem Reap is renowned for its incredible community development projects, and through our local contacts, we're fortunate to gain unique access to many of these transformative initiatives.

The first one you'll experience is the "Water for Cambodia" project. Over the next two days, you'll play a hands-on role in addressing one of the region's biggest challenges—access to clean drinking water.

You'll help by learning about the innovative Bio Sand Filters, a simple solution that turns contaminated water into safe, drinkable water.


Working alongside the team, you'll help assemble these filters, ready to deliver and install the next day in local communities.

Witnessing families receive clean water for the first time will be an unforgettable moment, underscoring the importance of this project.









Day 5 Siem Reap

Cycling Adventures + Creative Connections

Your morning kicks off with a cycling tour through the Cambodian countryside. Pedalling past lush rice fields, traditional stilted houses, and charming rural villages you will soak in the peaceful rhythm of local life.

In the afternoon, you'll dive into a creative activity with a local t-shirt printing workshop, part of another social enterprise we are involved with. Guided by skilled artisans, you'll learn about traditional printing techniques while creating your own unique design. This workshop supports local livelihoods and showcases the innovative spirit of Siem Reap's community projects, giving you a chance to take home a tangible piece of your experience.





Day 6 Siem Reap

Cultural Exchange with FWOC (Fourneys Within Our Community)

Today you will spend the day with JWOC, a project championed by our local partners, dedicated to fostering meaningful connections between visitors and local students. This cultural exchange programme is all about sharing ideas, values, language, and history in a fun and interactive way.

Through engaging activities like storytelling, games, and collaborative projects, you'll connect on a personal level with students, learning about their lives and culture while sharing your own experiences. It's a unique opportunity to engage with Cambodia's younger generation in a way that's both impactful and rewarding.





Day 7 Siem Reap

Culinary Delights + Farm Adventures

Your morning starts with a hands-on cooking class in the countryside, where you'll learn to prepare a traditional Cambodian dish using fresh, local ingredients, guided by skilled chefs. It's a chance to immerse yourself in the flavours and techniques that define Cambodia's rich culinary heritage.

After lunch, you'll take a tractor ride through the farm, getting a close-up look at rural life, exploring the lush fields where much of the region's produce is grown. It's a fun and authentic way to connect with the agricultural traditions that sustain the local community.





Day 8 Siem Reap

Read Club Cambodia + Water Park Fun

On Sunday mornings, you'll take part in an inspiring project with ReadClub Cambodia, dedicated to nurturing a love for reading among local children.

Our main partner/guide, Sunak, plays a crucial role in this project, ensuring everything runs smoothly. During the morning session, you'll help students practice their reading and engage in lively discussions about their favourite books, providing an opportunity to encourage learning within the next generation.

In the afternoon, you can choose to unwind or amp up the excitement with a visit to the Wake Park Water Park (optional, small additional cost).

Whether you're wakeboarding across the water or simply soaking up the fun atmosphere, it's the perfect way to add some adventure to your day.







Days 9 - 11 Siem Reap

ABCs and Rice - Transforming Lives Together

Over the next three days, you'll dive into the incredible work of ABCs and Rice, a project dedicated to providing free education, nutritious meals, and healthcare support to struggling families. This is your chance to make a tangible difference while connecting with the vibrant community of children and families who rely on this initiative.



Day 12 Siem Reap

Day 13 Siem Reap

Return to Cultural Exchange with FWOC

Spend one more day reconnecting with JWOC (Journeys Within Our Community) for another meaningful cultural exchange session. Building on your earlier visit, you'll dive back into engaging activities with local students, sharing ideas, stories, and perspectives.

This return session allows you to deepen the connections you've made and further explore the values, language, and history that make Cambodia so unique. It's a chance to reflect on the bonds formed and the mutual learning that makes this adventure so special. By the end of the day, you'll leave inspired by the resilience and warmth of the community and the impact of the work you've been a part of.



Day 14 Siem Reap

Angkor Temples + Evening Circus

A showstopper of a day. You'll spend the day exploring the world-famous Angkor temples, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the most awe-inspiring archaeological wonders on the planet. Here you will have the day to wander through the ancient ruins of Angkor Wat, Ta Prohm with its iconic tree roots, and the serene Bayon Temple with its enigmatic stone faces. Your guide will bring the history and stories of these breathtaking sites to life.

In the evening, you'll experience the magic of the Phare Cambodian Circus, a captivating performance blending acrobatics, music, and storytelling. This inspiring show supports young Cambodian artists and is the perfect way to celebrate the creativity and resilience of the local culture.



Day 15 Siem Reap

$Read\ Club + Relax$

Spend your final morning back with the Read Club Cambodia, helping local children practice reading and share their love for books. In the afternoon, relax and enjoy Siem Reap one last time, before the adventure heads East the next day.



Days 16-17 Kratie, The Jungle Phase

Transfer + Irrawaddy Dolphins

Your adventure continues as you travel from Siem Reap to Kratie, transitioning into the jungle phase of your journey. Sit back, relax, and enjoy the changing scenery as you make your way through Cambodia's lush landscapes, setting the tone for the next exciting chapter.

Kratie is a charming Mekong port town and your gateway to meeting the rare freshwater Irrawaddy dolphins. Here you'll hop aboard a traditional fisherman's boat and glide up to the dolphin pool at Kampi, the best spot to see these endangered creatures in their natural habitat.

On your way back, you'll stop by Sambok Mountain for breathtaking views over the Mekong River before cycling around Kratie's vibrant villages, lush rice fields, and peaceful riverside trails, immersing yourself in the charm and beauty of this tranquil region.





Days 18-20 Sen Monorom

Coffee, Elephants + Jungle Adventures

Next up, you'll venture further into the heart of Cambodia to Sen Monorom. As you travel through the everchanging scenery—forests, plantations, grasslands, mountains, and jungle—you'll reach Mondulkiri, known as "where the mountains meet" and home to traditional Phnong villages. Once in Sen Monorom, you'll enjoy a delicious lunch at a local coffee and pepper plantation, and explore the buzzing local market filled with fresh produce and unique handicrafts.

Your jungle adventure then continues as you visit a Phnong minority village. You'll meet your Cambodian elephant and local guide (a Mahout) early in the morning and embark on a trek through the jungle. Crossing rivers, passing local farms, and ending up at the Trok River. Here, you'll help your Mahout wash and cool off the elephants, followed by a cultural evening in the village with a BBQ dinner.



The following day, you'll hike through the jungle, discovering waterfalls and caves, and swimming at Leng Oung waterfall while a traditional BBQ is prepared for you all.

After lunch, you'll continue your trek to the Leng Ken before heading back to Pou Tang Village, where you'll spend some time with your guide's family before returning to your hotel for the night.



Days 21-23 Phnom Penh

Transfer + City Vibes

After breakfast, you'll leave the peace of Sen Monorom and head to the bustling capital of Phnom Penh, arriving just in time for a sunset cruise along the Mekong River.

The next day starts with a cycling tour through Phnom Penh's vibrant streets, offering a close-up at local life. You'll then visit the stunning Royal Palace, a symbol of Cambodia's rich heritage, followed by a visit to the Tuol Sleng Museum, where you'll gain a deeper understanding of the country's challenging history.

Continuing South, you'll pause at the Killing Fields for a poignant visit, reflecting on Cambodia's past, before making your way to the charming riverside town of Kampot, ready for the final chapter of your journey.





Days 24-27 Kampot, Kep + Rabbit Island

Coastal Charm

Your final phase will be in Kampot, to soak up the laid-back charm of this riverside town, where life flows as gently as the river itself. Your base is perfectly situated to enjoy the tranquil scenery, with lush greenery, colonial-era architecture, and a vibrant local culture creating a picturesque backdrop.

Interwoven into these days will be a full-day tour of Kep, a charming coastal town, where you'll visit the bustling Crab Market, famous for its fresh seafood delicacies, before taking a short boat ride to Rabbit Island, for an afternoon lounging on its pristine beaches.

Back in Kampot, you'll have the chance to paddleboard along the river, gliding through the calm waters, passing forests, mangroves, and traditional fishing villages.

For a touch of excitement, you'll be able to spend a day at the waterpark, which everyone loves, rounding off the day with a BBQ boat trip, where you'll feast on delicious local food while floating along the serene waterways making it a truly memorable experience.











Days 28 Phnom Penh

Departure

On your final day you will be driven back to Phnom Penh airport for your departure. This journey will take you through the old and new town allowing you one final look at this vibrant city to reflect on the incredible journey you've experienced, filled with meaningful connections, unforgettable landscapes, and memories to last a lifetime. Cambodia Staying & Food



What to Pack?

Clothes

When packing, keep in mind that laundry services are widely available throughout Cambodia (except during the jungle phase) and cost approximately \$5 per kilo. This means you can pack light and refresh your clothes as needed.

Cambodia is a conservative country, and local communities tend to dress modestly. While you're free to wear casual clothes like strappy tops during your downtime, it's important to dress respectfully when visiting temples or holy sites such as Angkor Wat—covering your shoulders and knees is a must.

The climate in Cambodia is consistently hot and humid, so lightweight, breathable clothing is essential to keep you comfortable throughout your trip.

- A selection of lightweight trousers and shorts cheap to buy in the local markets
- A selection of light weight t- shirts/tops long and short sleeved
- 1 pair trainers
- 1 pair flip-flops
- 1 pair casual shoes
- Beach wear: sun hat, swimmers etc.



What to Pack?

- Day rucksack
- Camera
- Plug adapter

- Personal Medication: Bring extra supplies, know the generic names of your medication, and ensure you can manage allergies (e.g. carry an epipen if necessary).

Communication

We will provide you with the emergency numbers for both The Leap and our overseas team. Expect Wifi and phone reception to be patchy while in the jungle. If you have any issues or concerns at any point, please talk to your guides who will do all they can to resolve any issues or contact us.

Your Health

Each location will have first aid on site. For more serious emergencies: Volunteers need to pay for minor medical expenses on their credit card and then reclaim these expenses back through their travel insurance. This includes the cost of the host driving a volunteer to and from hospital. In an emergency, and where evacuation by air is necessary, the insurers will settle bills directly.

Your Team

Maximum of 12 and a minimum of 6 volunteers per departure. The programme cannot run with fewer than this. 5 to 6 weeks prior to departure, if the minimum group size hasn't been met, you will be offered an alternative placement or a postponement, depending on availability and preference. Anyone aged 18–22 can participate.

Behaviour

This is a team experience and looking out and being respectful to one another is vital to create a positive experience for all. However, if anyone puts themselves or others at risk, does not listen to safety advice and is being disrespectful to the team and staff then we have to revert to our discipline procedures. These involve: a verbal warning, followed by a written warning, followed by a dismissal from the program – with no refund. Please do not be that person who ruins it for everyone else.

Managing Expectations

We do our best to describe our program as accurately as we can so that you have realistic expectations. It's important that you read this document carefully, and listen to the pre-departure zoom, so you are fully prepared with what lies ahead. Please remain flexible, as tasks and projects may change, depending on the needs of the communities, projects on the ground and weather.

Your Safety

We prioritise safety in our gap year programs through detailed risk assessments, safety audits, and adherence to industry standards such as BS8848, Trading Standards, the Year Out Group, and the Gap Year Association. On arrival, teams receive thorough safety briefings and are provided with secure accommodation, risk-assessed vehicles, medical evacuation access, and reliable emergency communications.

Accreditations

We're a member of the Year Out Group and the first UK company accredited by the Gap Year Association. Our safety procedures follow the UK Foreign and Commonwealth Office's 'Know Before You Go' advice.
