Describe your contribution responsibly

Strong wording is accurate about your role, credits local expertise and avoids claiming impact you cannot evidence.

Use words like

- worked alongside
- contributed to
- supported
- supported

Avoid words like

- saved
- transformed
- rescued
- gave them...
