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
ABSTRACT

THE ORAL CAVITY CAN BE AN IMPORTANT INFLUENCE ON THE OCCURRENCE OF INFECTIONS ACQUIRED IN THE HOSPITAL ENVIRONMENT, ESPECIALLY IN THE INTENSIVE CARE UNIT, IN SITUATIONS AND CASES OF PATIENTS IN A MORE CRITICAL CONDITION, SINCE THE ORAL BIOFILM CAN HARBOR THOUSANDS OF PATHOGENIC BACTERIA AND CAN ACT AS A RESERVOIR OF INFECTIONS, MAINLY TOY RELATED TO THE RESPIRATORY SYSTEM, SUCH AS VAP; PNEUMONIA CAUSED BY MECHANICAL VENTILATION




PURPOSE
