

# Pediatric and General Dentist Attitudes Toward Transitioning Care for Adolescents with Special Health Care Needs

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### Introduction

14.1 million U.S. children with Special Health Care Needs (SHCNs)[1]

2:1 Odds of having unmet oral health needs[2]

- Health care transition "The purposeful, planned movement of adolescents and young adults with chronic physical and medical conditions from childcentered to adult-oriented health care systems."[3]
- Goals of transitions:
  - · Prevention and early intervention
  - Care appropriate to age / complexity
  - Independent decision-making
- "A complex and, often, disorganized process." [4]
- · Objective: Explore attitudes among pediatric and general dentists toward dental care transition for adolescents with special health care needs.


## Methods


- Anonymous, 22-item Qualtrics survey was adapted from previous research.[5,6]
- Distributed via email to faculty and residents practicing pediatric or general dentistry at University of Iowa College of Dentistry.
- Statistical Analysis
  - Descriptive statistics
  - · Qualitative analysis of free responses

## Results

Very

- Responses from 7 Pediatric dentists; 12 General dentists.
- Key finding: Transition process must be driven by patient-specific factors rather than due to "aging out" of the pediatric dental home.

## **Summary of Findings**

- Pediatric and general dentists broadly agreed on the importance of dental care transition for patientcentered care.

  - Train personnel
  - · Enhance reimbursement
  - Fund home & community-based services
  - · Facilitate care coordination
