Introduction to the Early Childhood Innovation Network (ECIN)

Launched in 2016, the Early Childhood Innovation
Network (ECIN) is a local collaborative of health and
education providers, community-based organizations,
researchers, parent leaders, and advocates in
Washington, DC. Founded by Children's National Hospital,
MedStar Georgetown University Hospital and community
leaders, ECIN has expanded to include partnerships with
Children's Law Center, Far Southeast Family
Strengthening Collaborative, The George Washington
University, Health Alliance Network, Parent Watch, Total
Family Care Coalition, and most recently Georgetown
University Thrive Center for Children, Families and
Communities. ECIN enhances the health and well-being
of children and their families through various initiatives,
including HealthySteps and Parent Cafés.

Exploring the Evolution of ECIN and Parent Cafés:A Brief Overview

Be Strong Families Parent Cafés are physically and emotionally safe spaces where parents and caregivers discuss the challenges and triumphs of raising a family. Participants engage in deep self-reflection and peer-to-peer learning, exploring their strengths, learning more about the Strengthening FamiliesTM Protective Factors, and creating strategies from their knowledge and experiences to help strengthen their families.

Upon certification, Parent Café hosts are qualified to utilize the following Protective Factor decks:

Benefits of Parent Cafés for Parents and Caregivers

Parent Cafés focus on strategies to strengthen families and prevent adverse childhood experiences. Participants in Parent Cafés learn about protective factors: resilience, relationships, knowledge, support, and communication.

The intended benefits of Parent Cafés include, but are not limited to:



Building Community: Parents can share their experiences and concerns without fear of judgment, discovering they are not alone in their struggles.



Strengthening Relationships: Parents have the opportunity to build connections with others who face similar challenges and experiences.



Developing Skills and Resources: Engaging in structured discussions allows parents to enhance their understanding of local resources that can support their families.



Identifying Strengths and Needs: Parents can recognize their strengths, needs, and challenges, fostering personal growth and resilience.



Learning from Others: Parents can gain valuable insights from peers and guest speakers who share their experiences.

The Power of Parent Cafés: What the Evaluation Shows

As part of its investment in Parent Cafés, ECIN has conducted several evaluation studies:

2019 /

In 2019, ECIN conducted a pilot study of the implementation of virtual Cafés at Children's National, collecting qualitative feedback from 24 participants in a series of four Cafés. These caregivers felt engaged during Parent Café sessions with intentions to both participate and increase their involvement in future Cafés.

2020-2021

In partnership with BSF, our evaluation team analyzed national data from participant surveys collected in 2020–21 and found that parents with more years of experience and whose children have special needs attend more Cafés.

2023

In 2023, we implemented a qualitative community-engaged Photovoice project to better understand how Parent Café participants incorporate the Protective Factors into their daily lives. Images from this project can be seen at https://www.ecin.org/parent-cafes.

ECIN Parent Café Trainings

ECIN offers three options for Parent Café trainings:

IN-PERSON PARENT CAFÉ HOST TRAINING (2 Days)

- Trainings are held in person for two consecutive days.
- Participants interested in hosting in-person Parent Cafés utilizing the Be Strong Families Model must be trained and complete all training guidelines in order to be certified as an in-person Parent Café Host.
- Once trained, individuals will be able to host and/or table host in-person Parent Cafés with the Protective Factors decks.

VIRTUAL PARENT CAFÉ HOST TRAINING (3 Days)

- Parent Café Online Host trainings are held virtually for three full consecutive days.
- Participants interested in hosting an online Parent Café utilizing the Be Strong Families Model must be trained and must complete all training guidelines in order to be certified as a Parent Café Online Host.
- Once trained, individuals will be able to host and/or table host online Parent Cafés with the Protective Factors decks.

BREAKOUT ROOM/TABLE HOST TRAINING (2 Hours)

 These in-person trainings allow individuals to support Parent Cafés by managing smaller group discussions as an in-person table host or a virtual breakout room host.

After The Training: ECIN Parent Café Community of Practice

Launched in April 2024, the ECIN Parent Café Community of Practice (CoP) is a group of people informally bound together by shared expertise and passion related to Parent Cafés. Developed through a collaboration with ECIN-trained Parent Café hosts, this community fosters continuous growth and learning among its members. The CoP convenes quarterly to explore specific topics of interest, such as recruitment, engagement, and sustainability in order to enhance members' knowledge and skills in hosting Parent Cafés effectively.

ECIN Parent Café Deck Movin on Up: Conversations to Promote Economic Mobility

ECIN is committed to enriching Parent Cafés in the District of Columbia by creating tailored decks that address the unique needs and interests of local families and communities. Our new Movin' on Up deck focuses specifically on economic mobility for communities in the Washington, DC metropolitan area.
