Isolated and raw, it is a land of striking contrasts: windswept steppes meet ancient forests, glacial rivers carve through vast valleys, and jagged coastlines give way to endless skies.

Here, the magic lies in its remoteness. The silence is only broken by the sound of the wind and the cry of seabirds, while guanacos, condors, and foxes roam freely across the landscape. The ever-changing light paints the land in shifting tones, from golden dawns to fiery sunsets that feel otherworldly. In Tierra del Fuego, visitors are invited to embrace a sense of true exploration—venturing through its untamed terrain, discovering its hidden estancias, and experiencing a world that feels both harsh and profoundly beautiful. Activities

Guests may choose 1–2 activities per day, depending on duration and weather.

- Guided horseback rides across the vast Fuegian steppe, alongside gauchos who keep the traditions of southern Patagonia alive.
- Fly fishing in pristine rivers and lakes such as Lago Blanco, Lago Fagnano or Lago Deseado, known for their solitude and wild trout.
- Scenic day trips to the southern tip of Tierra del Fuego, with the chance to spot glaciers, remote valleys, and diverse wildlife.
- Excursion to the King Penguin Reserve, where guests can observe one of the world's most unique penguin colonies.
- Birdwatching outings to discover flamingos, condors, steamer ducks, and a wide variety of coastal and steppe species.
- Immersive estancia life: learn about sheep farming traditions, from herding to shearing, and daily gaucho tasks.
- Guided hikes through lenga and ñire forests, or across windswept hills with panoramic views of the Beagle Channel and surrounding landscapes.
- Outdoor picnics in secluded spots, paired with local Patagonian flavors and the ever-present southern winds.
- Evening gatherings by the fireplace at The Owner's House, sharing stories of life at the end of the world under the southern starry skies.











Location & Climate

- Estancia Caleta Josefina, Tierra del Fuego, Chilean Patagonia
- Subpolar climate with long, cold winters and cool, windy summers. Best season: November to March. Be prepared for strong winds, rapidly changing weather, and dramatic skies that define the end of the world.
