2024 ANNUAL REPORT

2024 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Accomplishments:

- With the dedication of our administrative volunteers as well as our providers and specialists volunteering their services, our volunteer hours totaled: 17,244 valued at \$817,586.
- MASS Clinic provided fresh, nutritious food to over 1,481 food-insecure families from our in-house food pantry.
- MASS chronic-care management volunteer providers served over 900 patients in desperate need of diabetic and hypertensive care. Without intervention from our providers, many of these patients would have found themselves in the emergency room incurring hospital bills and possibly debilitating health care debt.
- MASS Clinic served over 2,000 community members from primary care visits to psychological evaluations and specialist care!
- MASS Clinic was open for over 1,314 hours in 2024. We are even open on Sundays to accommodate our patients who cannot come during the work week.

New partnerships/collaborations in 2024

- MASS Clinic has partnered with Healthlink JAX, providing medical homes for those who are uninsured in Duval County.
- MASS and IRUSA collaborated to give back to our community on seasonal occasions through food giveaways in Ramadan, Eid Al-Adha, and Thanksgiving.
- MASS Clinic has partnered with DOH to provide patients with Hepatitis A, B, and C screenings, along with on-site vaccinations.
- MASS Clinic is a proud recipient of a grant from the Women's Giving Alliance, dedicated to making a meaningful impact on the lives of women in Northeast Florida.

New Services offered in 2024

- MASS Clinic received approval for the Refugee & Placement Program, providing vital support to 163 refugee individuals. Through comprehensive assistance—including housing, food security, job placement, and case management—our program empowers refugees to transition successfully toward self-sufficiency and stability.
- MASS Clinic is proud to offer comprehensive gynecology services to our female patients, providing essential care and support for their reproductive health and well-being.
- MASS Clinic, in partnership with 211, has provided essential transportation services to ensure patients can access their medical appointments without barriers.

MASS Clinic is proud to provide unique services to the community such as:

• Food as Medicine Program (FAM)

In collaboration with the UNF Nutrition Department, a generous donation from our partners at The Community Foundation, and the Islamic Center of Northeast Florida, community members participate in weekly sessions led by a dietitian through an educational and interactive group session for 4 weeks. Patients also have the option to do one-on-one virtual counseling sessions with a dietitian.

• Prescription Assistance Program (PAP)

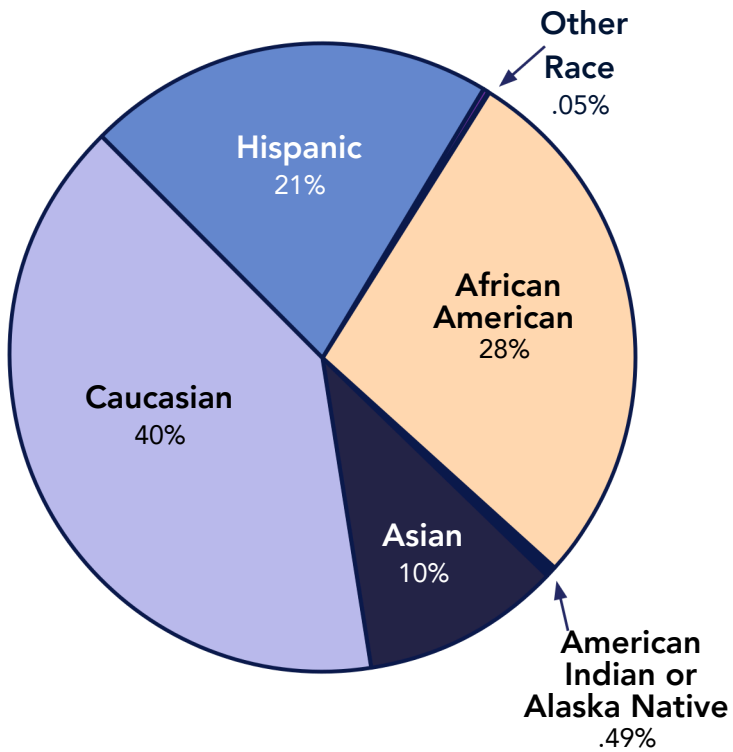

• Remote Patient Monitoring (RPM)

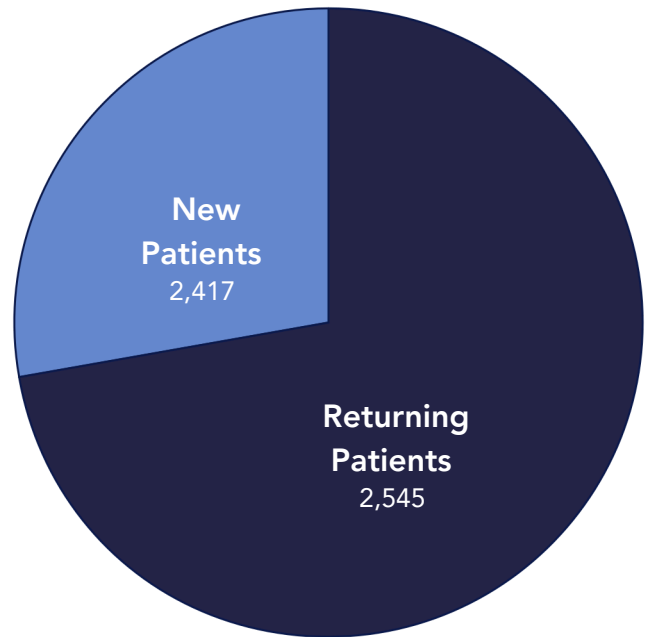
Patients with uncontrolled hypertension and diabetes have the opportunity to receive a blood pressure or blood glucose monitor for home use, enabling our team to monitor their readings remotely. This program allows the clinic to effectively track and manage high-risk patients both during and between visits. Participants in the program are also eligible for a cash incentive.

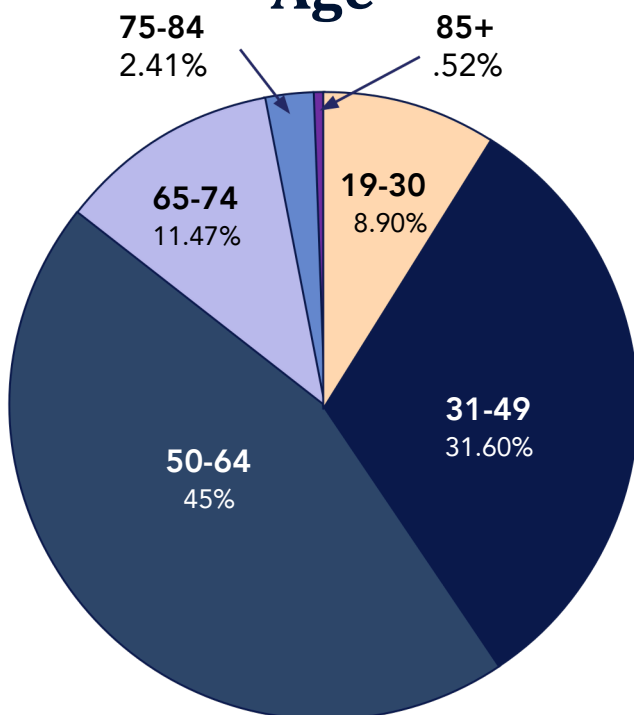
Race/Ethnicity



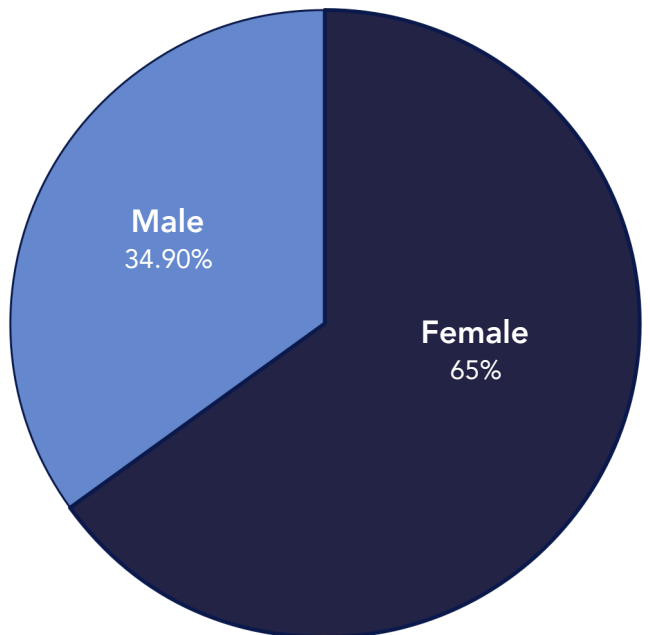
Patients Served



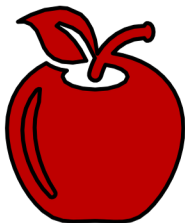
Age

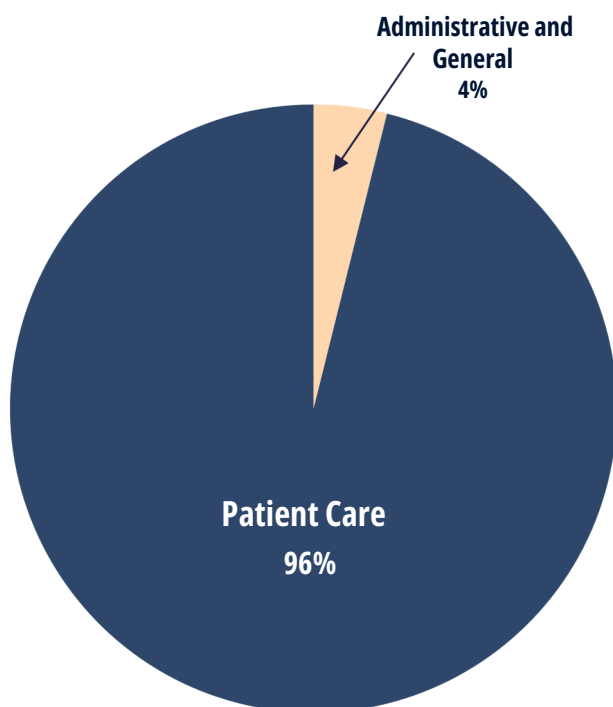
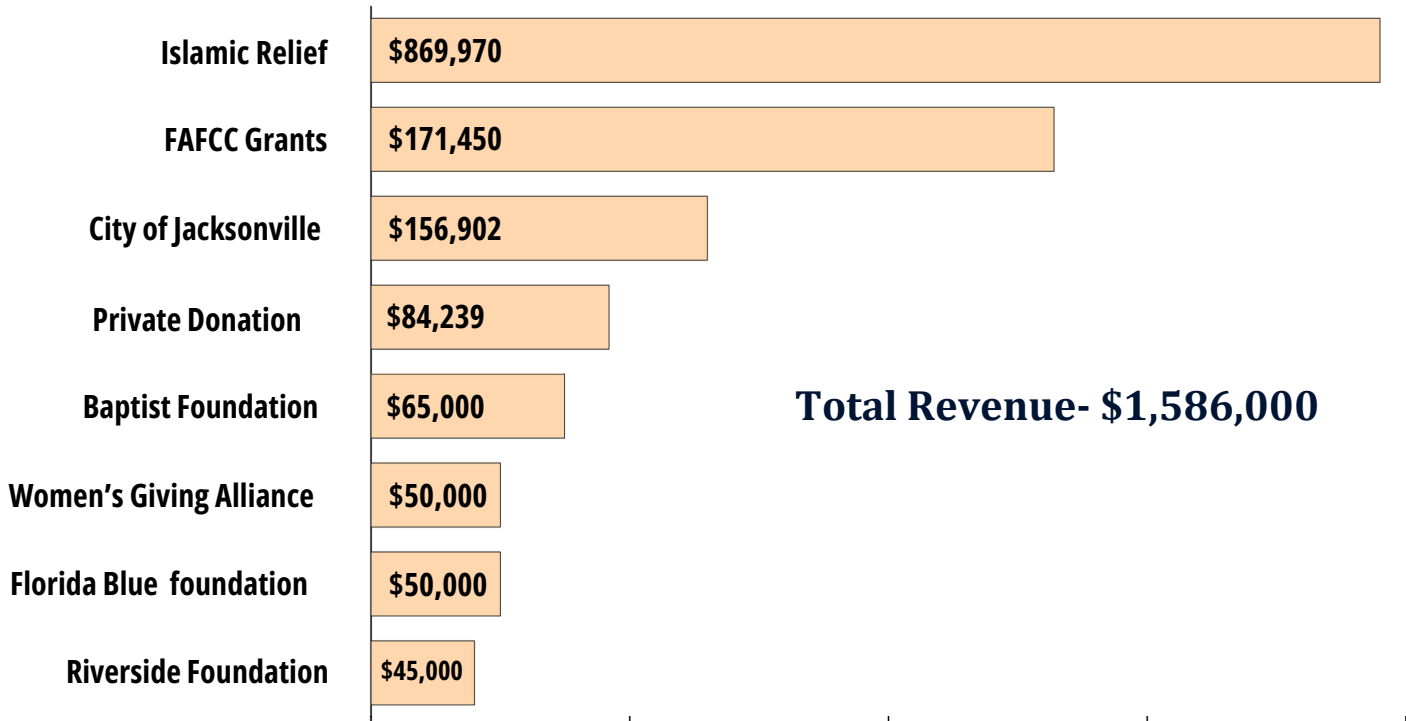
