Results: The survey shows that most respondents prefer a morning worship time, with 9:00 a.m. being the top choices.


We received 25 submissions in total—15 paper surveys and 10 online surveys—but one person submitted twice, so the final count is 24 unique responses.

In the third diagram, the majority of respondents indicated that they are open to trying a worship time change during the ski season.



Do you currently attend Sunday worship at Girdwood Chapel? 25 responses




If yes, how often do you attend? 25 responses


