Pre-planning checklist

Facing the inevitability of death is never easy. However, these 12 steps can ease the burden on your loved ones when the time comes.

□ 1. Who do you want to designate as your medical proxy?

Fill out an Advance Medical Directive to ensure your medical care will be in accordance with your values and wishes.

2. Who should be notified?

Create a list of key contacts to help your family notify the right people without delay.

\Box 3. Where do you want to be buried?

Pick a plot, pay for it, and write down its location - no confusion later.

□ 4. Have the funeral arrangements been paid for?

Funeral plans and burial are two separate matters. Make sure both are arranged, including coordination with the Chevra Kadisha.

5. What kind of funeral service do you want?

Chapel or graveside? Would you like certain people to officiate or to speak? Do you want your family to say kaddish? Clearly specify your wishes for a smoother process.

□ 6. Do you have a will?

Create a will and ensure that someone knows where to find it. It can save your loved ones from unnecessary heartache.

7. Where are your life insurance policies?
Ensure your life insurance is in place to prevent financial strain on your family. Keep the details accessible.

□ 8. Where are your bank accounts?

List all accounts, safe deposit boxes, and passwords. Ensure someone knows where to find them.

□ 9. How are your accounts titled?

Review account titles and consider setting up trusts to simplify matters and protect your family from probate.

☐ 10. What are your passwords?

List all digital account passwords and share them with a trusted person for easy access when needed.

11. Are there any outstanding debts?

Address debts now to prevent them from becoming a burden on your loved ones later.

□ 12. Where are your important papers stored?

Perhaps most importantly, gather all of the above documentation and place it in a safe, accessible location. Ensure your family knows where to find them when needed.
