### Heads of School: Online Roundtable with The Leader Network

Heads of School from 8 independent schools from across the U.S. have met monthly online for 90-minute sessions since 2023 to coach each other through challenging changes in education.

## 2. Meeting Cadence:

Launched in the fall of 2023, this cohort has met nine times per school year, September through May, on Forum's proprietary online platform for 90-minutes each month.

### 3. Principal Objectives:

These Heads of School meet to discuss strategic challenges shared across their diverse school environments while building authentic peer support and connection.

#### 4. Program Focus:

Through Millennium's partnership with TheLeaderNetwork, veteran Heads of School and certified Forum facilitators have led groups of senior school leaders in TLN "Roundtables" using the Forum methodology. TLN provides monthly themes that include:

- Leading in Turbulent Times
- Nurturing Effective Teams
- Shifting from Burnout to Breakthrough
- Managing High & Low Performer
- Balancing Daily Demands with Strategy
- School-Parent Partnership
