WHAT'S TRENDING?

VINTAGE MAXIMALISM

This trend celebrates "things that make you happy", a philosophy embodied by comedian Nicole Byer's Los Angeles home featured in Better Homes & Gardens, where tiger print couches and patterned rugs create biographical interiors that tell personal stories rather than chase resale value. Designer Matthew Williamson champions this eclectic approach, encouraging bold combinations like florals and stripes together. *(in frame)*

To incorporate vintage maximalism this season, opt for antique lanterns at flea markets, mix vintage brass lamps with modern fixtures, display inherited diyas alongside contemporary pieces, and create gallery walls with mixed-era frames to achieve this character-rich aesthetic.



SOFT CURVES & METALLIC FINISHES

The curve trend has evolved into sophisticated biomorphic forms meeting lustrous metals, with polished nickel making a comeback alongside warm brass in wave-like pendants and petal-inspired sconces. This pairing creates the refined elegance dominating luxury furniture in 2025, where organic shapes soften while metallic finishes add glamour. Tanisha Vadiya by Azure Interiors poses as a striking example *(in frame)*

Incorporate curved brass floor lamps, nickel-finished wall sconces, organic-shaped copper lanterns, and rounded metallic trays for diya displays to achieve this balance of softness and shine that defines contemporary sophistication.



ELEGANT GOTHIC

Another prominent trend of October 2025 centers on moody spaces with deep jewel tones like burgundy, charcoal, and deep plum, where shadows aren't flaws but features. Here, drama whispers rather than shouts. This elegant gothic aesthetic combines velvet textures with brass accents, creating spaces that feel both intimate and theatrical. Abigail Ahern's designs (*in frame*) are the most prominent champions of elegant gothic. Her signature look includes matte black surfaces paired with brass accents, botanical prints in dark frames, and what she calls "cocooning" spaces where darkness feels comforting rather than oppressive.

Create this cinematic mood with burgundy accent walls paired with brass sconces, charcoal velvet outdoor cushions, black window frames, deep plum curtains that frame festive lights, and strategic lighting that embraces shadows as part of the design.

HANDCRAFTED TEXTURES

Handwoven textiles, bouclé fabrics, hand-knotted rugs, artisan ceramics, hand-carved wood details, and visible maker's marks are everywhere. The trend celebrates imperfection—slight irregularities that prove human hands created the piece rather than machines. Textured fabrics with raised patterns, chunky hand-loomed throws, and furniture with tactile surfaces invite touch and create sensory-rich spaces.



STATEMENT PENDANTS

One-of-a-kind, artisan-made pendants that serve as room centerpieces are replacing mass-produced lighting, with emphasis on visible craftsmanship and natural materials. Launched in 2008 and still hugely influential in 2025, the Beat series consists of handcrafted brass pendants inspired by traditional Indian water vessels. (*in frame*) (*top right*)

This trend highlights ceramic fixtures with hand-painted details, woven rattan pendants, and hand-blown glass pieces.



Natural Light

Natural illumination regulates our circadian rhythm, affecting melatonin and serotonin production. Well-lit spaces with abundant daylight promote greater well-being, increase concentration, and reduce eye fatigue. Exposure to sunlight also improves sleep quality and strengthens the immune system, making it the foundation of healthy interior environments.

Warm Lighting

Warm light conveys comfort and intimacy through color temperatures below 3300K, often associated with dusk and candlelight. This creates ideal conditions for relaxation in bedrooms and living rooms, where a soothing atmosphere is paramount. Restaurants and cafes similarly benefit from warm lighting, which fosters closeness and encourages lingering.

Cool Lighting

With temperatures above 5000K, cool light energizes and stimulates. It improves concentration, reduces fatigue, and increases alertness, making it perfect for offices, kitchens, and workspaces where visual clarity matters most. Schools, gyms, and commercial environments also thrive under cool lighting, which encourages dynamism and productivity.

Neutral Lighting

Neutral light (3300K-5000K) balances warm and cool characteristics, offering versatile illumination for multifunctional areas. This adaptable option works well in hallways, lobbies, bathrooms, and commercial spaces, creating neutral zones that maintain both comfort and focus.

Thoughtful lighting elevates any space, transforming dull habitats into vibrant environments brimming with personality. By understanding and applying different lighting techniques, styles, and fixtures, you can dramatically improve how spaces are perceived and utilized so that they truly support the way you live and work.

1. Before the Celebration: Apply protective treatments like wood sealers or fabric protectants to your furniture and cushions. Ensure these products are free of toxins.




2. Use Waterproof Covers: When not entertaining guests, cover your furniture with waterproof covers to protect it from the elements.


A Home Designed With Empathy

In a world where color often dictates design decisions, this residence at Organo Antharam takes a different approach. This project is rooted in **empathy**, **accessibility**, and **thoughtful design**. The homeowner, who experiences color blindness, challenged the design team to create spaces that transcend conventional chromatic language, proving that meaningful design isn't about what you see, but how you experience a space.

This project prompted us to consider how a space is truly perceived. Is design limited to aesthetics and function, or can we go beyond that, shaping it to suit its residents and making it an extension of themselves? Shouldn't a home understand its inhabitants like no other? Can a home foster a deep connection with its residents? These questions challenged us to think beyond the standard design process.

The **bold white-and-yellow palette** emerged from close collaboration with a client whose color vision deficiency required careful color selection. These hues, which he perceives distinctly and clearly, create a strong visual anchoring throughout the home.

While the deliberate palette becomes the anchors of the space, the airy breeze and natural light flowing through expansive openings **frame nature as artwork**, connecting it to the outer world.





The aim was to create a space that feels expansive despite modest proportions, warm despite minimal color, and deeply personal despite restrained aesthetics.









The **minimalist approach** serves multiple purposes. By stripping away visual clutter, the design creates clarity. High ceilings with **recessed cove lighting** and **warm wood trim** allow light to travel unobstructed, while the strategic window placement brings the outside in.

Every piece of furniture in this home was **custom-made**. The clean-lined wooden sofa with its distinctive slat back detail, the precisely proportioned coffee table, the carefully scaled side chair—each designed specifically for this family's needs and this home's proportions. The **natural teak tones** provide textural contrast against the white-yellow palette, adding depth through material rather than color variation. The decor is kept minimal as well, such as the **geometric-patterned rug**, which grounds the seating area without overwhelming it, its linear design providing subtle visual interest that doesn't compete for attention.

In the dining room, a solid **sheesham wood table** sits beneath a statement chandelier that is both subtle and striking, allowing the space to breathe. The kitchen pairs functionality with finesse. **Saturno Walnut laminates** offer depth and warmth, while **KitKat mono tiling** adds a rhythmic charm to the backsplash.

Together, these choices create a home that feels both curated and personal, where materials are the storytellers.

During our initial discussion with the Metaphor design team, we talked about the tones we desired for the house. We discussed having earthy tones and wooden elements in the house.






**Where To Place
Your Diyas
During Diwali?**

Begin with your puja ghar (prayer room) and main entrance. Light the first diya in the nucleus of your home, the puja ghar, before lighting elsewhere in your home; this honors the divine and sets a spiritual intention for your celebrations. It is advisable to place at least four diyas near the main entrance, facing north or east, to welcome divine energies and guests alike. If you have a Tulsi plant at home, light a diya in its vicinity to acknowledge the sacred connection between spirituality and nature.

Additionally, place diyas in the living room and kitchen to keep the heart of your home warm, vibrant, and inviting. However, since these areas are high-traffic zones, position the diyas carefully to avoid burns. Placing diyas on windows and balconies allows light to radiate outward, symbolizing the sharing of prosperity and joy with the world. Avoid placing diyas in the southwest direction, as this is believed to accumulate stagnant energy.

In Vastu, lighting diyas symbolizes the dispelling of both physical and spiritual darkness.
