### Vocabulary: Brazil

Review the vocabulary below with your tutor:

Word	Meaning
Carnival	A big street party with music and dancing
Samba	A fast, rhythmic dance from Brazil
Rainforest	A wet, green forest with many animals
Tropical	Hot and humid, like the Amazon climate
Parade	A group of people marching or dancing
River	A long body of water, like the Amazon River
Coast	The area where land meets the sea
Colourful	Full of bright colours

**Task:** Have a go at creating 3 sentences using 3 words from the list.



### Speaking with Vocabulary

Tip: Sentence support:

"I would love to...", "Maybe I'd feel...", "I think it would be..."



### Grammar Focus: 'Going to' for Future Plans

#### **Grammar Rule:**

We use 'going to' when we talk about a plan or intention; something we have decided to do.

#### Structure:

Subject + am/is/are + going to + base verb

#### Examples:

- "I'm going to visit Rio next year."
- "She's going to try samba dancing."
- "We're going to see the rainforest."

This structure is helpful when talking about travel, future holidays, or goals

Tip: giving full answers:

"I'm going to...", "We're going to..."



## Grammar Add-On: Questions with 'Going to'

#### **Grammar Rule:**

To ask a question, we switch the order: Am / Is / Are + subject + going to + verb?"

#### Examples:

- "Are you going to watch the Carnival?"
- "Is she going to learn samba?"
- "Are they going to visit the coast?"

**Task:** Imagine your tutor is visiting your country for the first time. Use this grammar structure to ask them 3 questions about their trip.

Then, swap roles and your tutor will ask you 3 questions about visiting Brazil.

- What are you going to eat or try?
- Are you going to watch samba dancers or dance yourself?
- Are you going to buy a souvenir? What kind?

Then, swap and ask the same (or different!) questions to your tutor:

- Brazil is the fifth biggest country in the world.
- Carnival in Rio is the largest festival on Earth.
- The Amazon River is one of the longest in the world.
- People in Brazil speak **Portuguese**, not Spanish.
- Football is huge, Brazil has won the World Cup five times.
