Night market	An outdoor market open in the evening, full of food and shops
Bubble tea	A sweet tea drink with chewy tapioca balls
Lantern	A decorative light, often used in festivals
Mountain trail	A path for walking in the mountains
Street food	Quick, tasty food sold outdoors
Temple	A peaceful religious building
Island	Land surrounded by water
Volcano	A mountain that can erupt with lava

Grammar Rule: Past Continuous

Grammar Rule:

We use the **past continuous** to talk about actions happening at a specific time in the past.

Structure: was/were + verb-ing

- Examples:
- "I was walking through the night market at 8pm."
- "They were eating dumplings when it started raining."
- "He was drinking bubble tea during the tour."
- "We were visiting a temple while the sun was setting."



Grammar Add-On: While & When

- Use "while" to describe two things happening at the same time
- Use "when" to show interruption or a short action

Examples:

- "I was eating noodles when I saw a parade."
- "They were walking in the market while it was raining."

Tip:

- Use when for a short action that interrupts.
- Use while for two actions happening at the same time.

Pronunciation: Past Continuous Rhythm

We connect words when speaking: was eating, were walking, was watching."

Practice reading out the following phrases to your tutor:

- "I was eating noodles."
- "They were watching the lanterns."
- "She was walking by the temple."
- "We were talking about the food."

Tip: Focus on rhythm, not each word separately
