Last month we marked the 20th year of MAST delivery with a collective analysis of 50 case studies from across the city. We currently have an Educational Psychology team of 13 alongside over 28 psychotherapists, counsellors, family learning mentors and speech and language therapists. Each of the cases, and subsequent improvements that we reflected upon, were underpinned by professional expertise and evidence-based practice, supported by the development of trusted relationships and tireless commitment.


