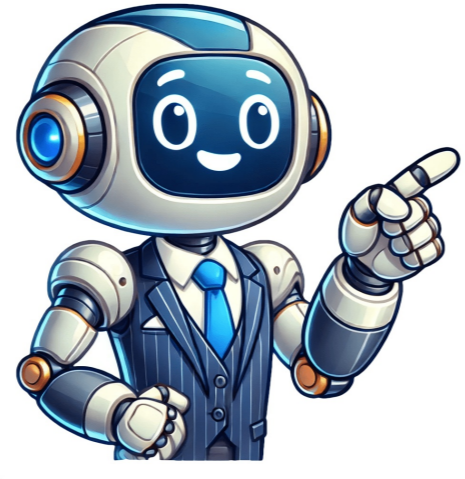

The US Department of Education has released the 2024-25 Pell Grant look-up tables, helping students determine their eligibility for maximum or minimum grant amounts. Additionally, updates have been made to the Draft Student Aid Index (SAI) and Pell Grant Eligibility guide, which now includes extra resources like EFC to SAI Crosswalk and more. The final versions of these guides will be published before the 2024-25 FAFSA processing cycle starts in December 2023. A Federal Pell Grant is a need-based financial aid program for undergraduate college students, with grant amounts varying based on factors such as Expected Family Contribution (EFC), SAI, cost of attendance, and enrollment status. Enrollment statuses are: full-time (at least 12 units), three-quarter time (9-11 units), half-time (6-8 units), or less than half-time (1-5 units). Use the linked chart to better understand your potential Federal Pell Grant award amount. The amounts are determined by the US Department of Education and can be found by matching your EFC with your current enrollment status, such as a full-time student with 0 EFC receiving \$3,693 in semester one. Dear Colleague: This letter includes Federal Pell Grant maximum and minimum award amounts for the 2024-2025 award year (July 1, 2024 - June 30, 2025). The Department is releasing this information with the 2024-2025 FAFSA form in December 2023 so institutions can inform students and families about their eligibility for a Federal Pell Grant. All 2024-2025 Federal Pell Grant awards must be based on these amounts. Recently, Public Law 118-35 was signed by the President, which includes continuing appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2023. For the 2024-2025 award year, the maximum Pell Grant award remains at \$7,395, but this could change pending further action by Congress. We will publish the 2024-2025 Federal Pell Grant maximum and minimum award amounts by February 1 as per section 482 of the Higher Education Act of 1965. However, you should be aware that the funding currently made available under P.L. 118-35 expires on March 8, 2024, unless Congress acts to extend it. That law's Pell Grant appropriation must be extended through September 30, 2024, to fund award levels described herein for all eligible students in 2024-2025. If Congress modifies the current maximum award for 2024-2025, we will publish revised maximum and minimum award amounts. The Federal Pell Grant minimum award amount for 2024-2025 is \$740. As a reminder, the FAFSA Simplification Act changed the process for determining a student's Scheduled Pell Grant award. The Department will no longer publish a Pell Grant Payment and Disbursement Schedule. Instead, each student's Scheduled Award can be one of two types: A Maximum Pell Grant Award (Max Pell) Student Aid Index (SAI)-calculated Pell Grant, or A Minimum Pell Grant Award (Min Pell). Maximum and minimum Pell Grant eligibility are determined based on tax filing requirements, family size and composition, Federal poverty guidelines, and state of residence. If a student qualifies for a Maximum Pell Grant, the SAI is not used to determine the amount of that grant. If the SAI-calculated Pell Grant is less than the published minimum amount, a student doesn't qualify for it but might still be eligible for Min Pell if they meet other requirements. Even though \$7,395 is the maximum Scheduled Award, a student can get up to 150% of that amount if they're otherwise eligible. The FAFSA Simplification Act removed the need for students to be enrolled at least half-time to receive more than 100% of their Scheduled Award. When determining a student's Scheduled Award, the Title IV cost of attendance is based on full-time enrollment costs for a full academic year, regardless of actual enrollment intensity or time. A student's annual Pell Grant award is based on their enrollment intensity and can be limited by the lifetime eligibility limit of 12 semesters (or its equivalent). The Department of Education has released the 2024-25 Pell Grant look-up tables to help determine student eligibility for maximum or minimum grant amounts. The updated tables will aid in calculating dependent and independent students' eligibility limits. Additionally, ED has revised the 2024-25 Draft Student Aid Index (SAI) and the Pell Grant Eligibility guide, which now includes supplemental resources such as EFC to SAI Crosswalk and scenarios. Final versions of the guide are expected to be published before the start of the 2024-25 processing cycle for the new FAFSA, anticipated to launch in December 2023.
