Mayor Russell and Council Members,

The Bend Chamber of Commerce is pleased to submit this letter in support of the Commercial Parklet License Program. The Chamber represents over 1,650 small and medium sized businesses through the region, many of which are located in, or near the Downtown District.

In response to COVID, we supported the Downtown Bend Business Association (DBBA) and downtown businesses for a temporary program for use of sidewalks and curbside parking spaces to allow businesses to remain open. We have been so pleased to see the opportunity this temporary program has created for downtown businesses, and fully support transitioning it to a permanent licensure program.

Not only will the Commercial Parklet Program continue to allow businesses additional capacity, but moreover it will give the City, downtown business owners and community members the ability to revision the area. The program will allow stakeholders the opportunity to redesign the look and feel of the Downtown District and develop cohesive esthetics.
