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COURSE OBJECTIVES:

By the end of this course, students will be able to:

- Introduce themselves and others.
- Ask and answer simple questions.
- Talk about countries, nationalities, jobs, families, and daily routines.
- Understand simple spoken English.
- Read short texts.
- Write short paragraphs.
- Communicate confidently in everyday situations.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY:

Each lesson follows this structure:

- Warm-up & Review - 5 min
- Vocabulary - 10 min
- Grammar - 15 min
- Listening - 10 min
- Speaking - 15 min
- Homework & Wrap-up - 5 min

CLASSROOM RULES:

- English as much as possible.
- Mistakes are welcome.
- Everyone participates.
- Respect classmates.
- Bring Student Book, Workbook, notebook, and pen.

Schedule Overview:

The book is organized into 12 units, with each unit containing three parts labeled A, B, and C (e.g., Unit 1A, 1B, 1C through Unit 12A, 12B, 12C). Each session will cover one part of each unit per lesson. Depending on the pace of the class and the amount of material covered, unfinished sections may be continued in the next session.

Each session will have the following structure:

1. Warm-up:

- Greet students.
- Review previous knowledge.
- Introducing today's topic.

2. Vocabulary:

- Teach vocabulary.
- Explain meanings.
- Model pronunciation.
- Students repeat.
- Ask checking questions.

3. Listening:

- Pre-listening questions.
- Play the audio.
- Students answer the questions.
- Check answers together.

4. Pronunciation:

- Practice the pronunciation activity from the book.
- Individual practice.
- Whole-class repetition.

5. Grammar:

- Explain grammar.
- Give extra examples.
- Students complete the grammar exercise.
- Check answers.

6. Speaking:

- Students practice the dialogue.
- Pair work
- Correct errors after students finish speaking.

7. Reading:

- Read the text together.
- Teach difficult words.
- Ask comprehension questions.

8. Writing:

- Students complete the writing task.
- Give feedback.

9. Review:

- Review vocabulary.

- Review grammar.
- Ask a few oral questions.

10. Homework:

- Student Book exercises.
- Workbook exercises.
- Reviewing today's lessons.
