### Sunrise Donates \$100,000 to Spirit Sands Medical Clinic

Sunrise Credit Union announced a \$100,000 donation to the Spirit Sands Medical Clinic in Glenboro in December 2024. This generous contribution, which represents a substantial portion of the fundraising goal, will play a crucial role in ensuring the initiative's success.



The Spirit Sands Medical Clinic's vision is 'To meet health needs and provide comprehensive care for individuals, families and communities.' When completed, the clinic will be a 3,250-square-foot facility accommodating 3-4 health practitioners. It will offer a range of services and will serve the municipalities of Glenboro-South Cypress, Prairie Lakes, Argyle, Victoria, and Oakland-Wawanesa.

The project's estimated cost is \$2.5 million, and the fundraising effort is currently about halfway to the goal.

The project is expected to commence in the spring of 2025 and will take approximately one year to complete.

# **Building Communities Grant Program Gives \$37,000 in Support**

Sunrise Credit Union provided nearly \$37,000 to four organizations through this fall's Building Communities Grant Program.

For this fall's program, we meticulously reviewed close to 50 applications, ensuring that four deserving projects, each representing a diverse aspect of our community, were selected for funding based on the criteria outlined in the guidelines.

The Westman Mental Wellness & Suicide Prevention Association received a \$16,000 grant, a significant boost that will help develop school mental health resource libraries in seven Sunrise Credit Union communities. The Deloraine Agricultural Society 'Share the Shed' project will receive a \$12,500 grant, a substantial contribution that will aid in the construction of an opensided shed at the fairground, enhancing the community's event hosting capabilities. A grant of \$5,318 to the Pipestone Memorial Park Committee will enable them to

complete their project, transforming a vacant lot into an attractive, inclusive green space. The Cypress River Senior Centre's \$3,000 grant will cover the cost of replacing the Centre's baseboard heaters and the related electrical work, ensuring a comfortable environment for the seniors.



Since its launch in the fall of 2023, the Building Communities Grant Program has contributed \$131,318 to 11 projects and initiatives, significantly impacting and enriching our communities. This collective effort is something we can all be proud of, and it demonstrates the power of community involvement. The next intake period for the program will be in the spring of 2025, offering more opportunities to inspire and shape our community's future.

### **Credit Union Day**

Branches held a variety of events to celebrate Credit Union Day on October 17. These included providing treats, popcorn, refreshments, and Halloween candy for Members while most branches had a free door prize draw. In addition, the Virden branch celebrated with a colouring contest while Cypress River hosted a pork-on-a-bun lunch.



In addition, Sunrise Credit Union partnered with Boundary Co-op to provide a free beef-on-a-bun lunch in four communities to celebrate National Co-operative Week! The four events happened in Hartney (October 15), Waskada (October 16), Deloraine (October 17) and Boissevain (October 18).

#### **Merry Christmas**

The Ste. Rose Share & Care initiative was a resounding success in 2024, thanks to the support of Sunrise Credit Union. Sunrise members donated more than \$6,000 to the cause, with the Ste. Rose and Laurier branches and corporate committing to a matching donation of up to \$3,000 each. The Share and Care initiative supports families in the communities of Ste. Rose, Laurier, and the surrounding area.

familial bond, and a delightful Christmas meal setting.

Staff from Sunrise Credit Union in Brandon attended the Christmas Tree Auction in support of the United Way on November 30. Sunrise sponsored a family, bought gifts, wrapped them, and then decorated a tree for the live auction.



In addition, staff from the Brandon branch and Corporate office volunteered to help with gift wrapping this holiday season at the Brandon Shoppers Mall to support the CNIB.

Not Knowing How to Save


#### **Sunrise Out and About**
